

* When cooking meat, you have to take care. Here are two tips straight from my local butcher: First, let meats come to room temperature before cooking. It allows the meat to cook more evenly and you won't end up with a cold center and a burnt outside. Secondly, when your meat comes off the grill or out of the oven, give it time to rest before serving. This allows the juices to redistribute throughout the cut of meat, and you'll end up with juicy goodness in every bite.

* "Depending on how you scoop it, you can end up with too much or too little flour. Here is a tip about getting the best amount every time. Give the flour a stir with a spoon and then lightly spoon it into a measuring cup. When it is heaped over, use a knife to level out the measure without tamping down." - Y.E. in Arkansas

* "Baking is a science as well as an art. It's about interaction of ingredients and what happens when they mix in certain ways. So this is not so much a tip as a caution. Make sure of your substitutions, and use the right amounts of things. Then your cakes will be light and fluffy and your pastry will be flaky and moist." - B. G. in Pennsylvania

* Berries are in season and there's no greater time to stock up. But don't feel like you have to make jam out of all the berries. Freeze in a single layer and transfer to a freezer-safe bag or container. They can be popped into muffins and quick breads, as well as eaten straight out of the bag for a delicious treat.

* When searing meat on a stovetop, be sure your pan is oiled (if called for) and at temperature. Otherwise, it'll stick.

Once a year we visit the deaf school for a session of super fun Bingo. Many of the kids remembered us as the "Bingo Nuts" from last year, and to make the impression last, we brought along fancy mixed nuts to distribute as snacks during the games.

other very rapidly, most of them lip read with accuracy, and they tease each other like all adolescents (they turn their backs to teachers instead of whispering).

This year the theme of the afternoon seemed to be giant pumpkins. There were several of the large orange creations sitting about and the kids were steering clear of them, having been warned that to "peek inside the pumpkin" was to risk being denied the right to play Bingo. One of the teachers explained that prizes for the games were inside the pumpkins and that the kids respected the rule of no peeking.

We eased into play with "a regular or four corners," but then went on to "teeter-totter," "fly-swatter," "empty square," and a host of others that were unfamiliar. The games were all clearly, if sometimes lopsidedly, illustrated on cards posted around the room and I was impressed anew at the ability of the teachers to turn every activity into a learning experience. We were off and running at a furious pace, with the kids waving their Bingo signs

The first Bingo was followed by the winner's dip into a pumpkin for a prize, which proved to be a DVD, close captioned and new enough to cause delight. All the other prizes were equally valued and obviously carefully chosen by the teachers.

The big surprise of the afternoon was the "Bingo Sisters Blackout." It was a quinella which means calling the numbers forward and backward and covering both numbers with each call. The kids loved saying "99" I just love these kids. They sign to each as soon as "66" was called. The game threatened to become riotous as enthusiasm grew. I hoped that one shy boy named Paul would win. He was familiarly called "Polly" by his classmates and seemed to need his ego boosted. I kept a watch on his cards to make sure he didn't miss any numbers and was delighted when he got Bingo. The teacher brought the prize to me to give to him and it turned out to be a Polaroid camera, which thrilled him. The first picture he took was of

Paying Off Credit Card Debt

Dear Savvy Senior,

-Living Underwater

My husband and I, who are retired, have accumulated about \$7,000 in credit card debt over the past few years and need some help paying it off. What can you tell us?

Dear Living,

I'm sorry to hear about your financial woes but know that you're not alone. Credit card debt has become a big problem in this country for millions of older Americans. According to a recent AARP report, 52 percent of adults ages 50 to 64 have credit card debt, along with 42 percent of those ages 65 to 74.

Rising costs of basic expenses like food, housing, utilities and health care are the main culprits. But now, new tariffs on products made in China and other foreign countries will make many goods more expensive, which could make this problem worse. Of older adults carrying a balance, nearly half owe \$5,000 or more, and nearly a third owe upwards of \$10,000.

While paying off credit card debt can feel overwhelming, it's doable with a solid plan and a bit of belt-tightening and persistence. Here are some strategies to help you tackle

Create a Budget

Start by taking a close look at your income and expenses to see where you can free up money to put toward your credit card debt. Also look for areas to reduce spending, such as dining out, entertainment or subscriptions. And see if you're eligible for any financial assistance programs (see BenefitsCheckUp. org) that can help boost your budget by paying for things like food, utilities, medicine and health care.

Call the Card Company

While the average credit-card interest rate is more than 20 percent, some credit card companies may be willing to lower your

interest rate or work out a payment plan, especially if you're struggling. It doesn't hurt to ask

Pay More Than the Minimum

Credit card companies only require the minimum payment, but it's usually mostly interest. Try to pay more than the minimum every month to make a dent in the principal

Choose a Repayment Strategy

If you have more than one credit card, pick one and get serious about paying it off. Start with the card that carries the highest interest rate, or the one with the smallest balance.

the highest interest rate first, you'll pay less interest over time, saving yourself a lot of money. Once the highest-interest card is paid off, move to the next highest, and so on.

Or you may want to start with the card with the smallest balance. Paying off smaller debts quickly can give you a sense of accomplishment and motivate you to keep

If you have multiple high-interest cards, look into consolidating your debt with a low-interest personal loan from your bank or credit union. Or consider moving your debts to a balance transfer credit card with 0 percent interest for an introductory period, which is usually 15, 18 or 21 months. This will eliminate the amount of interest you're paying temporarily. But be careful! Once the introductory promotion ends, the card company will charge interest on any remaining balance.

Consider a Debt Management Plan

credit counseling agency (see NFCC.org) to create a debt management plan for you. At no cost, a counselor will go over your income and debts and determine what's workable. The counselor will then negotiate with your lenders, to get a payment plan that will lower your interest and monthly payments and maybe forgive some debt.

If you accept their negotiated offer, you'll start making one monthly payment to the counseling service, which will in turn pay the issuers. You'll likely pay the agency a small fee and give up the cards included in the plan, but over time you'll be able to pay

Can This Poker Player Make a **Gutsy Call in This** \$1.95 Million Pot?

One of the most popular poker live streams on YouTube is Hustler Casino Live, which broadcasts out of California's Hustler Casino. Arguably their most popular stream is their annual Million Dollar Game, which requires each player to buy in for at least \$1,000,000!

The 3rd annual Million Dollar Game ran from April 28 thru May 2, 2025, and as usual the chips, and subsequent fortunes they represented, were flying in the \$500/\$1,000 with a \$2,000 big blind ante cash game.

On Day 1 of the game, poker pro Alan Keating, known for his James Bond-esque persona, clashed with Peter, a mysterious Chinese businessman who made a name for himself on PokerGO's hit show High Stakes

It began when Peter looked down at the J♥J♠ and raised to \$6,000. Keating called from the cutoff (the spot directly to the right of the dealer button) with the Q4104. A player known as Jack then three-bet to \$26,000 after picking up the Q♥Q♦ in the

Both Peter and Keating called and it was three-way action to a flop of 4\$7\$6\$. Jack

continued for \$35,000 and Peter called with his own overpair. Keating had the worst hand and only a 2.1% chance of winning the hand according to the PokerNews Odds Calculator.

It'd be easy for him to give up on the hand by folding and sacrificing the \$26,000 he'd already invested, but that's not what James Bond would do, now is it? Instead, Keating raised big to \$180,000.

It was a valiant bluff, but one that failed as both Jack and Peter called with their big pocket pairs. The 2 turn changed nothing, and it checked to Keating, who seemed to slow down by checking.

That brought about the A♦ on the river, one of the most interesting cards that could appear. Why? Not only did it complete a diamond flush draw, it also put on the board and overcard to Jack and Peter's pocket pairs. With \$621,000 in the middle, both those players checked and the door was opened for Keating to take another stab at it.

He did just that by moving all in for \$663,000! The bluff had to get through two players, but could they really call now that the board had both a completed flush draw and

It was too much for Jack, who didn't know he held the best hand, and he folded.

Peter then hit the tank - meaning he thought for several minutes before making a decision (i.e. the "think tank"). Could his pocket jacks be good? If Keating had flopped a flush draw, why wouldn't he bet the turn? Was he just trying to use the scare card on the river to his benefit? Or did he really have the

It was a polarized decision, referring to a situation where a player's range is split into very strong hands and bluffs, with no mediumstrength hands. In other words, Keating either had a strong hand, like the flush or pair of aces, or he had absolutely nothing. He wasn't betting with say a pair of sevens.

It looked as if Keating was going to get away with it, but Peter dug deep and made an insane call to win a \$1.95 million pot! It was one of the gutsiest calls ever in one of poker's biggest games. Give credit to both players, and they played an iconic hand at the highest



"You're an idiot!"

I sometimes receive compliments from readers on something that I write about blackjack. But I also sometimes receive scathing emails or letters that basically say what an idiot I am. Trust me when I say you have to have thick skin to be in this business of writing about blackjack and casino gambling in general. But I've taken my career as a blackjack writer very seriously and I would never say or write anything if I didn't believe it wasn't true or factual. But apparently some folks disagree and what follows are some of the criticism

The first negative letter (actually I received many of them) came about when I first wrote about card counting in a newspaper column a long time ago.

I've received (I've kept a file).

"Tamburin, you're an idiot for writing about card counting. Haven't you read what Scarne said about it: it doesn't work and it's a ruse used by a few system sellers to make a buck. You should be ashamed of yourself for writing about it in your column.'

This letter caused one of the biggest commotions for this newspaper (the writer actually sent his comment to the editor who forwarded it to me). For those that don't know, John Scarne was a famous gambling authority back in the 60s and early 70s. He

wrote several best-selling books on casino gambling and was considered the expert during this time. However, Scarne got it all wrong when it came to his comments on card counting. There was, in fact, a flack in print over Scarne's comments and the new breed of blackjack experts who came on the scene. Of course, it turned out that as more mathematicians began studying the game of blackjack, it became widely known and accepted that card counting will give the player the edge at blackjack. I actually answered this irate reader's comments on card counting in my column with facts and figures. Scarne never retracted what he said about card counting and I never heard any more negative comments from this reader about anything else I wrote about in my columns.

"You're dead wrong and stupid when you say that betting progressions don't work. I've been using one for 40 years and so have all my buddies and we all are

I've received hundreds, no probably thousands, of negative comments about my position on betting progressions in blackjack. I, and dozens of other mathematicians, have studied betting progressions in blackjack in great detail. The bottom line is this: betting progressions on a session by session basis will increase the fluctuation in your bankroll compared to always betting the same amount, and long term, they will not change your odds of winning one iota and they won't decrease the house edge one iota. All this means is that in any particular playing session you could win using a betting progression. I challenged this critic whether he really kept accurate win and loss records but never got

"Telling your readers not to take even money is the dumbest advice I've heard. You need to get a life."

I've obviously touched a nerve with this critic. I realize it's tough to pass up getting paid even money on your bet when you are sitting with a blackjack and the dealer is showing an ace. The fear, of course, is that if you don't take the sure even money, the dealer could have a blackjack and you wind

up winning nothing. The long and the short of it is this. Say you bet \$10 a hand and you always take the sure even money. Do it 100 times and you'll wind up \$100 ahead with no risk. If instead you decline even money, there is a risk that sometimes you'll win Natta and sometimes you'll win \$15 (the former when the dealer has blackjack, the latter when they don't). If you decline even money 100 times guess what? On a hand by hand basis you've accepted some risk but after 100 even money situations, you'll have more than \$100 in winnings. That's the math behind even money: you win when you always take it, but you'll win more in the long run if you always decline it. So, if you are only going to play one session of blackjack your whole life, go ahead and take even money. But if you are going to play a lot of sessions of blackjack during your lifetime, you'll end up with about 4% more profits in your pocket when you always decline the even money.
