Bingo Strategies?
Recently, we ran across several articles on strategies for winning Bingo and they all mentioned “The Tippet Method” and The Granville Method” specifically. Bingo results depend on the drawn numbers, so there’s no way for players to manipulate or guess the outcome—so neither of these strategies will make you a Bingo winner—but we thought they were interesting reading, nonetheless. A few tips that actually will improve your odds below.
The Tippet Method
British statistician L.H.C. Tippet came up with a complex theory about randomness that may or may not be true (there is no statistical evidence supporting the theory). Tippet’s theory suggests the more numbers called in a bingo game, the more likely those numbers will gravitate towards the median number. For example, if there are 75 bingo balls in play, and it’s a short game, choose cards with numbers closer to 1 and 75. If it’s a long game, choose numbers that are closer to the median number 45. Skilled bingo players will know which games will go for longer and which games are usually decided in fewer calls.
The Granville Method
This method came from Joseph E. Granville, a financial analyst and writer. Granville’s strategy requires players to select their cards based on the balance of the numbers and their long-run probability of being drawn.

Based on Granville’s strategy, players must assume that operators will call an equal amount of low, high, even, and odd numbers. When applying Granville’s method to a 75-ball Bingo game, players should expect to see equal appearances of numbers between 1 to 37 and 38 to 75. Therefore, when selecting their Bingo cards, players should choose cards that have an even balance of low and high numbers. According to this method, players should also assume that even and odd numbers will appear an equal number of times. Therefore, they should select cards with a balance of odd and even numbers. It should be noted that Granville’s reputation as a stock market investor is deplorable, with his stock choices depreciating by 20% year on year based on his ability as a mathematical analyst.
What Does Increase Odds of Winning?
--Playing with more cards is one of the best-known strategies used by players to increase their chances of winning. When playing multiple cards, it’s important to remember, however, that Bingo should be fun and not stressful and that this strategy requires players to be adept at managing their money, so financial prudence is essential.
--Play when the hall (or online bingo room) is less crowded. Fewer players improves odds of winning.
--Don’t play when tired or unfocused for any reason—missing numbers leads to missing wins.



PICKS OF THE MONTH

The Long Walk (R) — Based on the 1979 novel written by Stephen King (*It*), this dystopian thriller is led by Cooper Hoffman (*Saturday Night*) and David Jonsson (*Industry*). Set during an alternate reality of the 1970s where a totalitarian regime reigns over the United States, the film follows an annual voluntary competition consisting of 50 boys who must walk nonstop at a pace of 3 miles per hour or face the consequences of death. “The Walk” only ends when there’s one boy left, who then receives a cash prize and a wish of his choice. Although they’re driven by an insatiable hunger to improve their families’ lives, the boys severely underestimate the trauma they’re about to put themselves through and whether their choice was ultimately worth the long walk. Judy Greer and Mark Hamill co-star in the film, which is available now to rent at home. (Apple TV+)
Lazarus (TV-MA) — Sam Claflin stars in this new horror series alongside Bill Nighy. Only six episodes long, this series picks up

as forensic psychologist Laz receives news of his father’s (Nighy) death. Although his father’s death was ruled to be a suicide, Laz finds certain similarities between this case and the death of his sister 25 years ago. Simultaneously, Laz also begins to experience weird and paranormal instances where his father visits him and speaks to him. Left with no choice but to either succumb to insanity or solve the case, Laz is determined to find out whether his father was murdered. (Amazon Prime Video)
Chad Powers (TV-MA) — Glen Powell’s latest sports-comedy series not only stars the 36-year-old actor, but it was also created by Powell based on the *Eli’s Places* segment hosted by former quarterback Eli Manning. In the series, Powell plays Russ Holiday, a washed-up former football star whose career tanked after a championship game gone wrong. Russ has the bright idea to change up his identity so that he can continue to play football, so with the help of prosthetics, a wig, and some (bad?) acting, Russ transforms into Chad Powers. “Chad” then gets signed on to play for a small college that desperately needs some star power. With the whole football program relying on his success, the stakes are greater than ever for Russ/Chad to pull through — and not get caught while doing so. Four episodes of the six-episode season are out now to stream. (Hulu)

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Shrimp Recipe to Impress

Dear Annie,
I need a special recipe for the holidays. My in-laws are coming for our Christmas Eve dinner and I need to impress them. They love shrimp so can you please give me a recipe with shrimp in it. Thank you for your help.

Dear Heather,
Here is an all-time favorite Christmas recipe that I found many years ago in a North Carolina cookbook. It is one of my recipes that always make a good impression. If you are serving more than six people, adjust your amount of ingredients accordingly. Good luck and Merry Christmas to you and your family. —**Annie**

ALL-TIME FAVORITE SHRIMP WITH ARTICHOKEs

1 20 oz. can artichoke hearts
¾ lb. raw shrimp, boiled and cleaned
¼ lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced
5 tbsp. butter
¼ c. onions, chopped
4 tbsp. flour
1 ½ c. half-and-half
1 tbsp. Worcestershire
3 tbsp. dry sherry
¼ c. freshly grated Parmesan cheese
Paprika
Dash of salt
Dash of pepper

Drain the artichokes, slice in half and arrange in a buttered 9 x 15 Pyrex-type baking dish. Cut the shrimp into pieces approximately 1 inch. Spread the cooked shrimp over the artichokes. Using a frying pan, sauté the mushrooms in butter for about 5 minutes. Lift them out of the frying pan. Sprinkle them over the shrimp and artichokes. Cook the onions in the same butter until transparent. Add the flour and cook for an additional minute or two. Add the half-and-half and stir until thickened. Add the Worcestershire, salt, pepper and sherry to the cream sauce and pour over the contents of the baking dish. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese and paprika. Bake in a preheated oven at 375 degrees for 20 minutes. Serves 6.

The best part? They keep well, so you can make a batch ahead of time and have a steady supply of snacks ready for the week.

QUICK & COZY BANANA MUFFINS

Yield: 12 muffins
Total Time: 35 minutes

- 1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour or all-purpose flour, or a mix
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 1/2 cups mashed bananas (3 or 4 ripe bananas)
- 6 tablespoons butter or coconut oil, melted
- 1 large egg, at room temperature
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 tablespoons milk of choice, dairy or plant based
- Optional: 2 tablespoons demerara sugar to top muffins
- Optional add-ins: 1 1/2 cup maximum, like nuts, chocolate or dried fruit

Preheat your oven to 350 F and get a 12 count muffin pan ready — spray it with nonstick spray or line it with cupcake liners.

In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. Set it aside.

In a large bowl — or the bowl of your stand mixer — stir the bananas until smooth. Beat in the melted butter, egg, brown sugar, vanilla and milk until everything is well combined.

Gradually pour the dry ingredients into the wet, stirring gently until just mixed. If you're adding nuts or chocolate chips, fold them in now.

Spoon the batter into the muffin liners, filling each one nearly to the top. Pop them in the oven for 21-23 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean.

Let the muffins rest in the pan for 5 minutes before transferring them to a wire rack to cool.

To make banana bread: Preheat oven to 375 F. Grease a 9"x5" loaf pan with cooking spray. Prepare batter same as for muffins above. Fill pan with batter. Bake for 45-55 minutes. Let cool in the pan for 15 minutes before turning on a wire rack to cool.

To make mini muffins: Bake for 12-14 minutes at 350 F.

These treats stay fresh covered at room temperature for a few days — or pop them in the fridge for up to a week, or wrap and freeze for four months.

Next time your bananas get too ripe, don't panic — bake! Rally the kids or enjoy a quiet moment for yourself, and turn them into treats that are healthy, budget-friendly and wonderfully versatile. That's frugal living in action: simple, nourishing and smart in the kitchen.

Casino Q&A

Q: I put a slot ticket for \$200 in my shirt pocket, and somehow it fell out and got lost. Is there anything you can do when you lose a ticket like this?

A: Yes. Report the loss of the ticket to the cashier's cage as soon as possible. A ticket is not just an ordinary piece of paper. It's a piece of paper with a unique serial number that is stored in a casino's central computer. The casino can tell the amount of a ticket, when it was issued, on what machine, and when it was redeemed. The casino may be able to find your ticket's serial number by using your Players Club card. If you don't have a card, you'll have to tell the cage which machine issued the ticket, the dollar amount, and the approximate time. The "eye in the sky" will verify what machine you were playing.

Q: What should I do if I find a lost ticket?

A: Take it at once to the cashier's cage. Don't play it off or try to redeem it. Turning in a lost ticket is what you would want someone to do if you had lost it. It's not only a moral obligation but a wise one. For example, if the rightful owner of a lost ticket reports its loss and you try to redeem it, the cage might alert casino security to possible ticket theft—a serious casino crime. And being considered a suspected thief could prove embarrassing.

HEALTH TIP: It's "casino flu" time again. Slot machines, casino chips, playing cards, handrails, restaurant menus, and other casino objects are touched by hundreds of people every day, as such these objects become breeding grounds for a wide variety of germs and viruses. Before eating and after using the restroom, wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds—about as long as it takes to say the English alphabet (a to z) slowly. Dry your hands with an air dryer or paper towel. Turn off a faucet with a paper towel or with your elbow. Hand sanitizers can be used in a pinch but washing your hands with soap and warm water is best. This simple precaution will drastically reduce your chances of coming home with the "casino flu."

The Garden Bug

Homeless Man Wins Big

A California man said he "can't wait to get off the streets" after winning a \$1 million lottery prize. Earlier this year, the manager of Sandy's Deli-Liquor in San Luis Obispo sold the winning scratch-off ticket to the lucky winner, NBC affiliate KSBY-TV reported.

According to store manager Wilson Samaan, the winner is a long-time customer who is also homeless. "He came to the store, he scratched it and is like, 'Oh, my god. Is that real?'" Even after double checking the win, Wilson said that the man was in shock to see just how much money he'd won. "He's like, '\$100,000' and I'm like, 'No, bro. That's \$1 million. Congrats brother,'" the manager recalled.

The man bought two \$5 Triple Red 777 scratchers, plus a few smaller tickets, for \$25, Samaan told the *San Francisco Chronicle*. The store manager then helped the lucky lotto winner—who doesn't have a car—by driving him to Fresno to verify his ticket with the California Lottery. "He tried to mail it," Samaan told the newspaper. "I told him I'll help you out. I offered him a bus ticket or for me to drive him. I didn't want a million dollars to get lost in the mail."

In a video posted to Instagram by local store Thrifty Beaches, the overjoyed lotto winner said he "just can't wait to get off the streets." Speaking with KSBY-TV, a California lottery spokesperson said that the process of verifying the win could take anywhere from weeks to months. "With a million-dollar ticket like this, the person who comes forward can expect a very thorough vetting process," said Carolyn Becker, later adding, "We process over 10,000 winning claims a month, so that's part of why it takes a little bit of time."

Big Wins Across the U.S.

A husband and wife in North Carolina are nearly \$100,000 richer after getting lucky while playing the lottery. Jeffrey Douglas, a resident of Cherryville, N.C., picked up the fated scratch-off lottery ticket from Times Turn Around on East Main Street in Lincolnton, N.C. on August 17th, according to a press release from the North Carolina Education Lottery. He told lottery officials that it was a special day for such a big win playing the \$10 Million Spectacular; Aug. 17th was also he and his wife's 31st wedding anniversary. How did his wife reply to the big news? "I texted her a picture of the ticket and she said, 'Call me,'" Douglas recalled with laugh. After taxes, Douglas and his wife were given \$71,764. "It was pretty awesome," he gushed, adding, "It's a blessing." First released in December 2023, the \$10 Million Spectacular is a scratch-off lottery ticket that had a limited number of \$10 million grand prizes. Players could also find cards with either a \$1 million or \$100,000 prize.

The Douglas family isn't alone in recently having big wins in the lottery. A grandmother of 10 who overcame breast cancer won a historic \$2 million prize in the Pennsylvania lottery earlier that same August after winning the largest prize ever awarded from the state's MONOPOLY Progressive Jackpots.

There was another historic lottery win in Virginia, where a player won a \$348 million prize in the Mega Millions drawing. They ended up taking home \$155.6 million in a one-time payout and planned to buy a zero-radius lawn mower as their first big splurge.

In Michigan, a man who won \$300 on one ticket reinvested some of his winnings by purchasing another ticket, which led to a \$714,891 win.

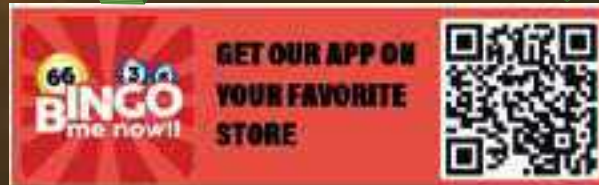

Christmas gifts maybe? One thing is certain: These little robots are very cute.

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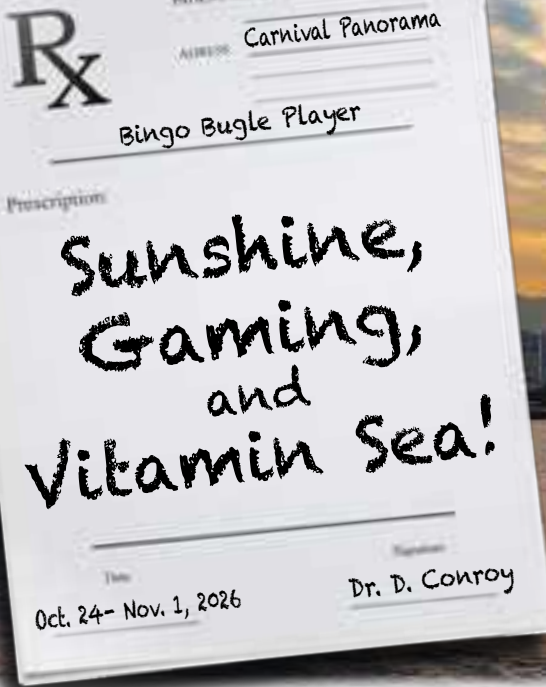
The Heart of Bennet Hollow

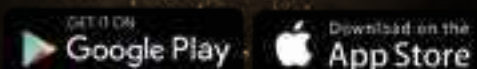
