Saving lives with Buddy Check

One of the most valuable things you can do in the new year will be to check on your buddies, those you've served with and those in your area, and make a regular routine of it. It's called Buddy Check, and you could be saving a life.

A few stats:
- Depending on the source you read, there are 17 to 22 veteran suicides per day. Yes, the numbers have decreased slightly over the years, but even one is too many.
- The rate of male veteran suicides is 60% higher than for nonveterans. For women veterans, the numbers are even higher.
- The reasons vary. Between needing to adjust to civilian life, homelessness, not wanting to ask for help and PTSD, many of our buddies are in trouble, especially if brain injury is part of the equation.

This is where Buddy Check comes in. Go online to va.gov and search for "Veteran Buddy Checks." Click on the fact-packed 20-minute training video and learn how you can help. Become familiar with the S.A.V.E. acronym—know the Signs, Ask the right questions, Value their life and Enlist help.

Your best source to locate other veterans is the Together We Served website (www.TogetherWeServed.com). Once on the site, you'll find a unit directory and over 2 million veterans who've signed up. You can start with their Facebook page: www.facebook.com/TogetherWeServed.

Look at the American Legion Buddy Check. Go to www.legion.org and search for "Buddy Check." Learn about their program and download the tool kit.

If you are the one who needs help, don't wait, don't hesitate. Help is only a phone call away, day or night, at the Veterans Crisis Line. Dial 988 and press 1. Or text to 838255. For confidential support for a family member or friend, see VeteransCrisisLine.net.

- 1 24-ounce jar roasted red and/or yellow peppers, drained
- 2 32-ounce cartons prepared chicken broth (low sodium)
- ½ tsp. Morton Natures Seasons
- 1 tsp. nutmeg
- 1 cup small croutons, optional

In a medium-sized soup pot (at least 4 quarts), melt the butter. Add the olive oil, diced onion, minced garlic and the chopped pumpkin and squash pieces. Sauté over a low flame for at least fifteen minutes, stirring constantly. Add one quart of the chicken broth and continue to cook until the pumpkin and squash starts to soften. Add the peppers. When the squash and peppers are soft, transfer to another bowl or container. In batches, half the size of your blender, mix well. Pour the blended soup back in the soup pot. Continue to mix the remaining pumpkin mix in the blender, transferring after each batch. Add the remaining quart of chicken broth, Natures Seasons and nutmeg. Cook over a low flame for at least 15 more minutes, stirring occasionally. Adjust your seasoning to taste. Serve hot. Garnish with croutons, if desired. Serves 8 to 10.

Bingo Returns to Vegas Strip

Circus Circus is bringing back the beloved game by "opening a bingo hall that embraces the true vintage Vegas bingo experience, built around paper cards, ink daubers, cheap eats and live gameplay," according to an official press release. The new bingo hall at Circus Circus is slated to open this February.

Bingo hasn't been offered on the Las Vegas Strip for one simple economic reason: It doesn't make enough money to justify the space. Bingo rooms are considered an amenity, much like buffets and spas, and they tend to have big footprints, with hundreds of seats, dedicated staff, equipment and fixed session times. They produce only a fraction of the revenue a casino can earn by filling that same square footage with slot machines. Plus, Bingo players tend to be locals, value-seekers and lower theoretical gamblers who aren't likely to spend big on slots, tables, bottle service or upscale dining before or after their bingo session.

Why, then, is Circus Circus bringing back bingo? Says Shana Gerety, General Manager at Circus Circus Las Vegas, "We've seen a lot of success leaning into nostalgia as we continue to refresh and update Circus Circus Las Vegas. It started with Slots-A-Fun, the only coin-operated casino on the Las Vegas Strip and enhancing the food and beverage options, by offering cheap beer and bites. Our customers loved the experience, and we're excited to offer the Strip's only bingo hall, with affordable pricing, great food and beverage options, and a true bingo experience without a tablet doing the work for you."

The hall will accommodate 255 players per session, and feature six sessions daily at the start. Each session will feature 10 total games, including traditional bingo games, a bonus game and a coverall, all played on paper with daubers. Guests will be able to purchase a full session package for \$30, with the opportunity to purchase additional cards. Prizes will be paid in cash, with payouts starting at \$50 and reaching up to \$1,500. The hall is located on the Promenade level and steps away from a new concession stand serving classic favorites, including hot dogs, pretzels, nachos, beer and a selection

of cocktails. Circus Circus will also debut a new gaming space outside of the bingo hall with popular coin-operated slot machines, enhancing the throwback experience.

Bingo Boosts Soldier Morale

On a recent Wednesday, scores of off-duty Soldiers and civilians talked, danced in place, and sang along to *Shake it Off* by Taylor Swift as they waited in line at the Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) Stage and Entertainment area on Camp Buehring, Kuwait. A strategic staging and training post for Active Duty and National Guard troops alike, Camp Buehring was winding down for the night as the audience arrived to receive their game cards for the bi-weekly Bingo Night. This important morale event has become a staple of the base's community, offering a fun and engaging outlet, as well as high-end prizes.

During deployments, the stress of performing rigorous tasks daily in the heat of the desert, miles away from home, is quick to weigh on any person. While the post provides numerous resources such as sports tournaments, movie theatres, and recreation area to help, the MWR team has found few things have been more beneficial than a night out for Bingo with friends. MWR Volunteer DJ, Jake Bustos, says it's a reminder of home.

The Bingo Nights on Camp Buehring begin at 7pm every Wednesday and Saturday night, with players checking in to receive their game cards. Music blasts throughout the post as Busto deejays to start the night and in between rounds. A Volunteer MC explains which board arrangement will win the game and lights up an LED lightboard to help players track their play. Players are encouraged to participate throughout by joining the MC in call-and-response chants to certain combinations and shouting "Bingo!" loudly to indicate they have come up with the correct arrangement on their cards. Substantial prizes such as wireless speakers, ear buds, blankets, and even televisions are on offer. Bingo Night continues to be a vital occurrence for fostering esprit de corps on Camp Buehring, and MWR plans to keep hosting it for residents.

PICKS OF THE MONTH

Jay Kelly (R) — This comedy-drama film directed by Noah Baumbach presents a very emotional and layered depiction of the life of a famous actor named Jay Kelly. George Clooney stars as the world-renowned Jay — a charismatic, suave man, the type of actor you see on screen and can't take your eyes off of. Of course, behind every heartthrob who can deliver lines well, there usually lies some convoluted personal life that's meant to be kept hidden from the world. And with Jay, it's no different. Even though he lives a spectacular life and has a team (comprised of Adam Sandler and Laura Dern) that scrambles to leap over every obstacle Jay creates for himself, a deep loneliness and sadness emanate from him. The Running Man (R) — f you've seen Edgar Wright's *Baby Driver*, you know that Wright excels in creating action-packed blockbusters with a splash of comedy and incredulity. His latest release, starring Glen

Powell, is an adaptation of Stephen King's 1982 novel *The Running Man*, and Wright does not hold back on the action! The film takes place in a near-future United States that is ruled by an authoritarian media network. The network's most popular TV program is called *The Running Man*, where runners sign up to win \$1 billion if they can survive 30 days without getting killed by the network's hunters. Powell plays a blue-collar man named Ben, who signs up with the purpose of buying medicine for his daughter. But once he's thrown into the game, he realizes his actual purpose in the game is much larger than just escaping a few cold-blooded murderers. (Apple TV+)

Little Disasters (TV-MA) — Diane Kruger takes on a leading role in this new limited drama/thriller series out now to stream. This is the second novel of Sarah Vaughan's to get a miniseries adaptation, the first one being *Anatomy of a Scandal* in 2022. The little disasters commence at once in this six-episode series when mother Jess' (Kruger) life is thrown for a loop after her child suffers a concerning head injury. Her best friend, who is also the accident and emergency doctor treating the child, subsequently files a report to child social services following the incident. This results in major cracks within their friendship and even an unveiling of hidden secrets that Jess desperately tried to keep buried. Ben Bailey Smith and Jo Joyner co-star. (Paramount+)

Legal Cheating Explained

An excellent 19-minute video, *How They Legally Cheated Every Casino For \$21 Million, Then Vanished*, animates the story of Phil Ivey and Kelly Sun as they milked casinos for tens of millions, "using a technique so clever, so subtle, that even the surveillance cameras didn't catch it." The video shows Kelly turning Ivey onto edge sorting, illustrating the concept complete with a magnifying glass. "How do you get the casinos to rotate the cards?" he asks her. Her answer is surprisingly simple—and it launched an epic takedown of casinos in London and Atlantic City. The whole story is told in the book *Advantage Players*, but this is as clear and easy-to-assimilate an explanation as you'll find on YouTube.

Three NYC Casinos Approved

Three casinos are coming to the five boroughs—two in Queens and one in the Bronx. The New York state Gaming Commission made the official announcement late December, capping off a process that had been a dozen years in the making. The decision to award licenses to Bally's Broux at Ferry Point, Hard Rock Metropolitan Park near Citi Field, and Resorts World New York City near JFK Airport could transform the city's economic and entertainment landscape in the coming years. The state is banking on a hefty financial return, beyond the \$500 million licensing fee to be paid by each of the casinos. An evaluation released by the Gaming Facility Location Board stated that with around 20 million people living in the metro area as well as a stream of domestic and international tourists, the total downstate

casino market "could reach approximately \$5.5 billion in gross gaming revenue in 2033," more than enough to sustain a thriving downstate gaming industry. Within the first decade of operation, the board predicted the three facilities would collectively generate almost \$13 billion in taxes, including \$7 billion in gaming taxes and \$5.9 billion in hotel, sales and property taxes. While advocates pointed to the thousands of jobs the projects are expected to generate, proponents worried about the potential toll on small businesses and families harmed by gambling addiction.

Two Dollar Bet Nets Big Win

A lucky gambler sat down at a slot machine near Tacoma, Washington and walked away with a "massive" jackpot win, casino officials said. The gambler won \$61,112 "on a single spin" on a Monkey in the Bank slot machine at Muckleshoot Casino Resort in Auburn, casino officials wrote in a Facebook post. The bet was \$2, a casino official confirmed in an email to *The News Tribune*.

Jai Alai Returns

Jai alai is returning to its historic home at Casino Miami. The World Jai-Alai League, which says it is the only professional jai alai league in the U.S., had been considering leaving South Florida after its lease at Magic City Casino ended in late 2024. The league—which plays a modified version of the traditional Basque game—recently announced its new home will be Jai-Alai Miami (JAM) Arena, a newly renovated entertainment space within the old Miami Jai-Alai complex. The 1,500-seat venue, which opens in 2026, will feature new seating, a refurbished terrace and bar area, and a redesigned entryway connecting to the casino. The World Jai-Alai League will operate the new venue, which will also host concerts, comedy shows and other programming, according to a spokesperson.

Nevada Happenings

Fireworks Championship

The International Fireworks Championship Las Vegas will be held at the Las Vegas Motor Speedway on Saturday Feb. 21. This fireworks competition debut features multiple elaborate displays throughout the evening, as four teams from around the world perform 12- to 15- minute shows, with 15-minute entertainment-filled breaks between them. Described as a "full-on sensory experience," these are "incredibly intense and creative displays, exploding lower to the ground, and they're all highly choreographed and synchronized to music." Tickets are on sale now, starting at \$95 per person for general admission and \$144 for reserved seats. Gates open at 2:30 p.m., with the first fireworks show starting around 6 p.m. The program concludes around 8:30 p.m., when a world championship team will be crowned.

Red Rock Regal Theater Renovation

Station's Red Rock Casino has completed a major renovation of its 16-screen Regal movie theater. The lobby has been upgraded, the bar expanded (with craft beers and specialty drinks), a spacious lounge has been added for group gatherings before or after movies, and an RPX screen (Regal Cinemas' proprietary premium large format) is now part of the mix, along with IMAX and 4DX. Tickets remain \$10-\$15, with discounts for Regal loyalty members.

David Byrne at the Colosseum

David Byrne, lead singer and prime mover of the influential '80s rock, punk, and funk band Talking Heads, will play one show at the Colosseum at Caesars Palace on April 20. Talking Heads formed up in New York

in 1977 and issued eight studio albums before disbanding in 1991. They're biggest hits were *Once in a Lifetime*, *Burning Down the House* and *Road to Nowhere*. In his post-Talking Heads solo career, Byrne has received an Academy Award, a Grammy, a Special Tony, and a Golden Globe and is an inductee to the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Eggslut Opens at the Rio

Eggslut, the popular long-time breakfast fast-food counter at the Cosmopolitan, opened at the Rio this past holiday season. Eggslut began life as a food truck in L.A. in 2011 and has since gone global, with locations as far flung as the UK, South Korea, Japan, Singapore, Kuwait, and of course Las Vegas. The venue at Cosmo serves four breakfast sandwiches (\$9-\$10.50), cheeseburger (\$12.50), tri-tip sandwich (\$16.50), the Slut (coddled egg on potato puree, \$11.50), truffle hash browns (\$6), and coffee (\$6). The Rio location will open at 7 a.m. and close at 2 p.m. The Rio also has a Hash House A Go Go, open 7 a.m. to 1 p.m., so there're plenty of breakfasts to go around. And parking is free.

Chubby Chinatown

Chubby Group, the hospitality company behind the Chubby Cattle restaurant, is partnering with Hashi Market to create Chubby World in Chinatown at the corner of Spring Mountain and Valley View. Plans call for a four-story complex that features a theater for cosplay shows, anime, and cultural events, a Tokyo-style food court, a Hashi Market, and a music venue for concerts and a late-night club. A timetable for the project wasn't disclosed at press time.

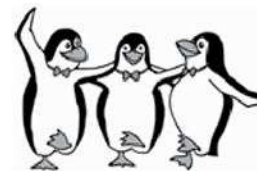

THE MOTHER OF ALL CREAM CHEESE DIPS

1 1/2 cups

1 hour 5 mins.

1 (8-ounce) block cream cheese, at room temperature
1/2 cup sour cream or mayonnaise, at room temperature
3/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
Freshly ground black pepper, to taste
Optional Mix-Ins (use one, some, or all — whatever's handy):
1 green onion, thinly sliced
1/2 cup shredded aged cheddar or other cheese
1/4 cup bacon crumbles
1/4 cup toasted almonds

Place the cream cheese in a bowl and beat with an electric mixer on high for about 2 minutes, until it's light and fluffy. Scrape the bowl, then add the sour cream or mayo, salt, garlic powder and pepper. Beat on high for another minute. Taste and adjust the seasoning — this is your dip, after all.

Refrigerate for at least 1 hour so the flavors can get acquainted and settle in. Serve with breadsticks, pretzels, mini bagels, crackers or chips.

Note: The longer it chills, the better it gets, which makes this a perfect make-ahead recipe for busy hosts. Leftovers keep in the fridge for up to a week, although "leftover dip" is mostly a theoretical concept.

What else can you add? Truly anything else you love, like chopped herbs, leftover roasted veggies, a spoonful of pesto, diced olives, sundried tomatoes, everything bagel seasoning. This recipe is here for your creativity and your fridge clean-outs.

At the end of the day, people aren't coming over to evaluate your culinary skills or inspect your baseboards. They show up for laughter, warmth and the simple comfort of being welcomed. A cozy room, a low-stress menu and the delicious variety of potluck goodness is more than enough to make your home the spot everyone remembers.

Nothing says comfort, security and home like an old-fashioned meal of meatloaf and mashed potatoes. Try this tasty supper with your family, or better yet, invite another family over to enjoy this generous-sized recipe of Outside-Inside Meatloaf.

We call it the all-in-one vegetable/potato/meatloaf because when you slice the main dish, the kids discover that everything is hidden inside — everything, that is, except the salad and bread, which your guests could bring to complete this fabulous "let's get together" meal.

It's also the perfect solution for using leftovers. Extra portions of mashed potatoes, peas and corn are the perfect ingredients to complete this recipe. Even day-old dinner rolls are useful. They're all part of the mix.



OUTSIDE-INSIDE MEATLOAF MASH-UP

Serves 8

2 pounds lean ground beef
2 eggs, slightly beaten
2 cups fresh or packaged breadcrumbs
2 tablespoon tomato paste
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
3 cups prepared mashed potatoes
1 cup cooked peas or corn
1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese
Ketchup or mustard for drizzling on top

Preheat oven to 350 F. In a large bowl, with very clean hands, let your child thoroughly mix together the meat, eggs, breadcrumbs, tomato paste, Worcestershire sauce and seasonings.

Place on a large sheet of parchment or wax paper and form a 9-by-12-inch rectangle. Use a rolling pin to make it even and smooth. Spread the potatoes over the meat with a spatula, leaving a 1-inch border all around. Top with vegetable and cheese.

With adult assistance, your child can roll up the large meatloaf lengthwise, lifting up the paper to get it started. Remove paper and place the meatloaf seam-side down on a foil-lined baking pan. Pat it together firmly, pinch ends closed, and drizzle ketchup or mustard on top.

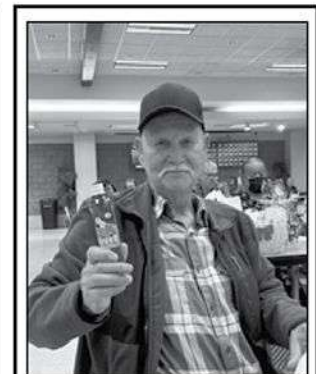
Bake uncovered for 1 to 1 1/4 hours, or until completely done. Remove from oven and let rest for 10 minutes before transferring to a large serving platter for slicing.

Time to Test Your Slot IQ

- 1. Winning at slot machines is just a matter of luck. (T or F)

Answers:

- 1. True. Like in keno, Bingo, and your state lottery, winning is just a matter of luck. And if luck isn't with you, it doesn't matter what strategy you use or what you do.
- 2. False. When you're playing one of today's slot machines, you're really playing a computer. And the slot's computer doesn't know or care what day or time of the day it is. So, there's no better day of the week or time of the day to play slot machines.

- 3. False. A slot machine does not turn cold after a big payout. It will continue to payout at the rate it is programmed to. Your chances of hitting a jackpot on the very next spin are the same. Back-to-back jackpots are rare, but they do happen.
- 4. False. A slot with an advertised payback of 98% will pay back 98% of all the money put into it, but over millions of spins. In the short time you're at a slot machine, you won't get back 98% of your money. You might, for example, get back 30%, 90%, or 0%. It all depends on computer timing and luck.
- 5. True. Casinos really do want you to win now and then because who would want to play in a casino where you lose all the time? But if they had you winning all the time there would be no casinos.
- 6. False. A slot is never due or bound to hit no matter how much time or money you or another player put into it. All payouts are spread out over time and completely at random.
- 7. True. Most players spin the reels once every five seconds (12 spins per minute). Slow down to 6 to 8 spins per minute by not hitting the spin button the instant the reels stop spinning. Hesitate a moment. Then hit the button again. You'll barely notice the reduction in playing time. While slowing down won't improve your chances of winning, your bankroll and playing time will last longer.



Solomon's Seal

"Solomon's Seal" is the common name for a number of species in the genus *Polygonatum*. These plants display broad, alternating leaves and many clusters of bell-shaped flowers that dangle along each stalk. They prefer rich, moist, well-drained soil, partly or fully shaded. They are drought-tolerant once established, have few insect or disease problems, and are not favored by deer. Beside their use as garden plants, they are used medicinally, and also prepared as food. - Brenda Weaver

Left Behind Ticket Nets Big Win

A Michigan man won big in the lottery after discovering a scratch-off ticket left on a gas station counter. According to a news release from the Michigan Lottery, an anonymous 33-year-old Wayne County man took home the top \$1 million prize after picking up a ticket for the state's Blazing Suits game while visiting a Detroit gas station. "There was a Blazing Suits ticket set aside on the counter that someone else had decided not to purchase, so I purchased it," the player said in a statement, sharing that he made the decision to buy the \$10 scratch-off ticket from the counter, rather than grab a new one. "I scratched the ticket off and couldn't believe it when I saw it was a \$1 million winner!" he recalled. "I never would have thought I'd win such a large lottery prize, so it's truly a blessing." The winner visited the Lottery's headquarters to claim his prize and opted to receive his winnings as a one-time lump sum payment of about \$693,000, rather than annuity payments for the full amount. According to the player, he hopes to save the money for a rainy day. "Winning is a great feeling, but it's also a lot of pressure because your mind starts thinking of all the different things you can do with this amount of money," he said.

Another Unusual Michigan Win

This isn't the only time in the past year that a lottery player in Michigan became a prize winner after choosing their ticket in an unusual way. A woman won \$100,000 playing Powerball after she used ChatGPT to pick her numbers. Tammy Carvey, 45, of Wyandotte, bought a lottery ticket online at MichiganLottery.com for the Sept. 6 drawing. "I asked ChatGPT for a set of Powerball numbers, and those are the numbers I played on my ticket," she explained. "It wasn't until I logged into my Michigan Lottery account that I realized I added the Power Play to my ticket and actually won \$100,000. My husband and I were in total disbelief," she said.

Goodluck Grandma

A man is crediting a surprise run-in with his grandma at an Illinois convenience store as the reason why he ended up winning a \$1 million Powerball prize. The lucky winner, who gave himself the fitting nickname "Grandma is My Lucky Charm," told lottery officials that his luck began after he decided to purchase the ticket at a Road Ranger in Rochelle. "The \$240 million jackpot drawing was that night, but I work late, so I took a quick lunch break to grab a ticket and try my luck," he said. Before he even walked into the store, he noticed a car that looked just like the one his grandma drove. "And guess what? It was her car and she was right by the cash register, checking out," he said. Then she ran over and gave him a hug. Later that night he got the big news when he scanned his ticket and saw the words: "You won \$1,000,004." In addition to matching all five numbers — 13-16-18-20-27 — in the Oct. 11 Powerball drawing, the ticket netted him another \$4 from a different line of his ticket. Still, he didn't totally believe his win was real until he scanned the ticket a second time. "That's when I started screaming and hyperventilating," he recalled. "I instantly called my grandma, and her first response was, 'Are you sure you won?'" he said. "I checked the numbers manually online, and everything matched—except the Powerball." As for what he plans to do with his winnings, the man said he "definitely" plans to share some of his earnings with his grandma and buy her a new car. He added, "She's my good luck charm!"


I was the hit of the show. My antique skirt sold for more than it was worth, treacherous thing that it was, and several bidders asked if the model would wear it again.

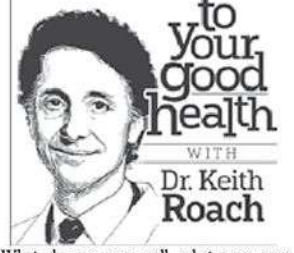

What do we now call what was once referred to as a "nervous breakdown" in the 20th century? — A.M.

ANSWER: I asked this question to my psychiatry professor way back in the late 20th century when I was a first-year medical student. My professor replied that the term didn't have a meaning anymore. There is no formal medical or psychiatric diagnosis of a "nervous breakdown." The term is used by laypeople to describe when a person has severe impairment of their day-to-day function as a result of a psychiatric diagnosis, especially mood disorders like generalized anxiety disorder or major depressive disorder.

An adjustment disorder may resemble a major depressive disorder, but it occurs within a few months of a traumatic life event. A severe case might also be termed a "nervous breakdown." It is not usually used to describe a person with acute psychosis (a term meaning a grossly distorted sense of reality), such as a person with schizophrenia or bipolar affective disorder in their acute and uncontrolled state.

All these conditions have effective treatments. Treatment starts by talking to someone, who might be your own regular doctor or a mental health professional. For people who are in acute distress with thoughts of hurting themselves, the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline is an option in the United States and Canada.

Q: I want to check the value of my vase. It is shaped like an urn with two handles on the sides and raised pictures of people and trees. There is a cupid flying above them. It is marked "F. & A. G." on the base.

A: It sounds like your vase is based on the Portland vase, a famous ancient Roman vase. Many potteries made copies of it in the 18th and 19th centuries. The most famous and most valuable copies are made by Wedgwood. The mark on your vase was used by the Austrian pottery company of Gerbing & Stephan (located in the present-day Czech Republic) from about 1900 to 1903. The initials stand for brothers Friedrich and Alexander Gerbing, who were running their family's company at the time. The company made majolica, a tin-glazed earthenware pottery, in styles inspired by ancient history, often with historical or mythological scenes. Today, their vases sell for about \$150 to \$200.

TIP: The general rule about dovetailing: The fewer the number of joints, the older the piece. A drawer made in the early 17th century was either joined with one huge dovetail or was pegged together.

Tips for Bankroll Management Part II

Last month we covered the rules of the session bankroll and proportional betting for the recreational blackjack player. This month we explore the details of varying your bets and more tips and strategies.

Varying Your Bets

The "safest" way to bet at blackjack when you don't have the edge is to make the minimum size bet on every hand. This will decrease your theoretical loss and reduce your risk of busting out quickly.

However, most recreational players find betting the same amount on every hand not very exciting. Therefore, they use some type of progressive betting system to vary their bets, where you increase or decrease bet based on whether your previous hand won or lost. The bottom line on progressive betting systems is this: mathematically speaking, you can't, and you won't, gain the advantage over the casino using a progressive betting system. Nevertheless, for those players who insist on varying their bets, I suggest using a conservative system known as Oscar's Grind. It works like this.

You begin your progression with a one-unit bet and after every win, you bet one unit

more than the previous bet; after any loss, you bet the same as the previous bet. The goal is to win one unit for each series of bets, with this stipulation: you never place a bet that would result in a win of more than one unit for the series.

More Tips to Preserve Your Playing Bankroll

You can preserve your session (and total) bankroll longer by decreasing your hourly theoretical losses (due to the house edge). Here are some ways to do this.

- Always use the basic playing strategy when you play in either a land-based or an online casino. You can reduce the house edge to roughly a half percent (playing-rules dependent), which will decrease your theoretical hourly losses. (Dominate the idea about how much money you will save by using the basic blackjack strategy is very important here)

- Check the playing rules. You want player-favorable rules (e.g., doubling down after pair splitting; dealer standing on soft 17, etc. And you definitely want to avoid rules that increase the house edge, such as a blackjack paying 6-5 instead of 3-2, dealer hits soft 17, or no soft doubling allowed. (The greater the mix of player-favorable rules, the lower will be the house edge. For more on this, read Chapter 2 in the Ultimate Blackjack Strategy Guide.)

- If you are playing in a land-based casino, get rated for your play. The comps the casino will give you have value, which can reduce the cost of playing. Depending on the value of the comps, you can end up playing even or enjoy a net positive expectation.

- Take advantage of gambling coupons (e.g., match play, blackjack bonus payoff, free ace, etc.). These coupons give you an edge on a hand when you use them, which will save you money.

- Play on crowded tables. This reduces the number of hands you play per hour (which decreases the exposure of your bankroll against the house edge), and correspondingly, reduces your hourly theoretical losses.

Online blackjack games are significantly faster than playing in a land-based casino with a live dealer. The more hands you play per hour, the greater your theoretical losses. If the software allows you to adjust the speed of play, I recommend that you dial down

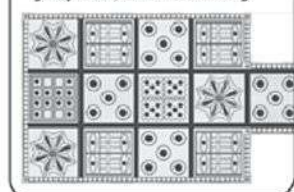

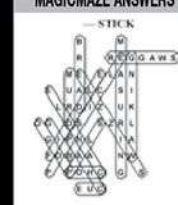

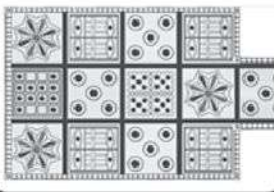

DEAR PAWS: I find it weird that my two dogs, "Shep" and "Bull," can eat just about anything (I have to hide all the pet food), while my cat "Trudy" will turn up her nose at most food. And although she's perfectly healthy, sometimes she gets sick after eating wet or fresh food. Why? — Sarah in Madison, Wisconsin

DEAR SARAH: Cats' eating behaviors have long been a source of curiosity for both pet owners and the scientific community. Why do they turn their nose up at certain foods and chow down on others? Why do they sometimes throw up after eating? Why do they gnaw on grass?

The answer is: It's complicated, and no one is entirely sure. A 2015 study, for example, found that cats have some genes that are more commonly possessed by herbivores (animals that eat only plants, like cows). These particular genes help them detect bitter flavors, alerting them to potentially poisonous plants.

This research opens a new avenue into understanding why cats are more picky about their food than dogs tend to be. If cats are detecting a bitter taste in their food then they may be less inclined to eat it. And, a bitter taste also may trigger a vomiting response to safeguard against ingesting what is perceived to be poison.

The study's results could lead to changes in how commercial producers formulate their cat food.

In the meantime, feeding a finicky cat remains a trial-and-error process. Try small amounts of different foods — dry, wet and fresh — and note Trudy's likes and dislikes.

Pet Products for the Physically Challenged

Dear Savvy Senior,

My pet-loving mother has two cats and a dog, but her knee and back problems make caring for them increasingly difficult. Are there pet care products you can recommend that help elderly pet owners with mobility problems? —Searching Susan

Dear Susan,

Great question! For older pet owners with limited mobility, daily tasks like feeding, walking or cleaning up after their pets can become physically challenging. Fortunately, there are a variety of products that are specifically designed to make pet care more manageable.

With the help of Next Avenue, a nonprofit, digital publication for older adults, here is a rundown on some top products that can help your mom care for her pets no matter her mobility.

Automatic Pet Feeder

Just like you, your pet needs to eat a few times a day. But lifting heavy food bags or bending to fill bowls can strain the back. An automatic pet feeder can help keep your mom's pets well-fed without having to stoop or bend much.

The Petlibro Air Automatic Feeder (\$50) has a locking food tank to prevent between-meal snacking and can hold up to 16 portions. It runs on batteries that last 180 days, so you can put it anywhere you want. You'll have to refill it now and then, but this product means a lot less bending and lifting.

Age-Friendly Litter Boxes

Bending or stooping over to fill or clean out the kitty litter box can be challenging for many mobility-challenged cat owners. To alleviate this, LoflyLoo sells an elevated litter box for \$289. Compatible with stairs and ramps for older cats, LoflyLoo's raised litter box furniture has options for anyone living with chronic pain or recovering from surgery. It's also fully wheelchair accessible.

Another option that can make kitty litter clean up easier is the Litter-Robot 4 by Whisker (\$699). This automatic, self-cleaning litter box eliminates scooping and reduces the odor and waste removal, which is helpful for older cat owners.

Long-Handled Pooper Scooper

Stooping over to clean up after your dog can be challenging if you have back, hip or knee problems. Long-handled waste scoopers can make this cleanup task much more manageable.

The ShinyDew Pooper Scooper (\$24) is a foldable, 32-inch-long dog poop picker upper, so you don't have to bend to pick up your pet's waste. You can use it with one hand, and also attach waste bags to the scooper for even easier disposal.

Hands-Free Leash

Most dogs love their daily walk and need the exercise for their own optimal health. But for seniors that use a cane, walker, wheelchair or have pain in their upper body, using a traditional leash can be challenging. If walking a pet is difficult, hands-free leashes or harnesses can make the experience more manageable.

One option is the Hands-Free Dog Leash with Zipper Pouch by iYoShop (\$22), which clips around your waist, has a reflective safety strip for visibility and includes two shock absorbers to prevent tugging. But note that this product should only be used if your pet cannot physically pull you down.

Pet Treadmill

If your mom can't walk her dog any longer, she can still give them plenty of exercise by getting a pet treadmill. The PETSITE Dog Treadmill (\$286) has 12 preset programs and three incline options. The large running belt measures 39 inches long by 14.5 inches wide with a slip resistant running surface and safety fences along the sides. It also comes with a remote to adjust speed and automatically turns off after 30 minutes.

Automatic Ball Launcher

Another way your mom can exercise her dog, if walking isn't an option, is with an automated ball launcher.

The Joyhound Electronic Ball Launcher (\$120) comes with three tennis balls and can lob them 10 to 40 feet. Your mom can rest on her patio while her dog gets a challenging and entertaining workout.

Stay Calm to Foil Scammers

This is a new scam, but then it's what we expect from thieves — yet another way to steal from us. This one involves our innocent-seeming bank debit card, a scammer and a pair of scissors. Here's how it works:

You'll get a call from someone claiming to be from your bank who says there is fraudulent activity happening on your account, and they need your help. You'll be told that you need to act fast before you lose all your money.

The scammers will tell you to cut up your debit card, but not to cut up the little microchip on the card. Put all the pieces, they'll say, in an envelope and leave it at your door, because a bank "official" is going to rush over to take possession of the evidence. Oh, and there will be one last little detail they'll need — your bank PIN. By that time, if you're sufficiently rattled, you'll willingly tell them the number.

A scammer will quickly show up at your door to grab the envelope. Armed with that little card chip and your PIN, they can quickly empty your account.

The key is for you to not get rattled, to not let scammers direct your actions.

If you're suspicious about any call, hang up! It's OK (even preferable in this case) to be rude! Call the bank or company on their official number and ask if they were trying to contact you about fraudulent activity on your account.

If your debit card (or any card) expires and the bank or company sends you a replacement, cut up the old one. Be sure to cut through the chip, the magnetic strip on the back and the numbers as well as your name. Divide them up in multiple trash bags to keep the pieces apart.

Remember: Stay calm to defeat the scammers.

A Cozy Mexican Potato Noodle Soup

This is one of my favorite cold-weather recipes. It's budget-friendly, quick, and easy to make. It's quite versatile as well—you can add just about anything you want—more vegetables (corn and beans are good choices) or meat (shredded chicken is my preference, but I usually make it meatless).

SOPA DE FIDEO CON PAPAS

INGREDIENTS
 2 large potatoes
 2 tbsp olive oil (approximate)
 1/2 large white onion (or 1 small), diced

2 garlic cloves, minced
 1 tsp ground cumin
 1 cup tomato sauce
 8 cups vegetable broth
 8 ounces fideo noodles (or broken spaghetti)
 Fresh cilantro, for garnish

INSTRUCTIONS

—Peeling and cube the potatoes. Cut into roughly 1-inch pieces. Set aside.
 —Heat some olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the diced onion and sauté for 5 minutes.
 —Once the onions are translucent, add the garlic and cumin, and stir for an additional minute.

—Add the tomato sauce and 2 cups of broth, stir to combine. Cook for a minute or two. Set this mixture aside.

—Heat a little olive oil in a new clean pot. Add the fideo noodles and toast them for about 5 minutes. They should become golden brown then they are ready.

—Combine the soup base and toasted noodles, followed by the remaining 6 cups of vegetable broth.

—Drain the cubed potatoes and add them to the soup base.

—Bring the soup to a boil over medium-high heat, then reduce heat to simmer, and continue cooking for 10 minutes or until potatoes are fork-tender.
 —Serve with fresh cilantro.

I hope you enjoy this cozy soup as much as I do! —Elle

The Largest Pot in High Stakes Poker History – a \$1,412,500 Monster Hand

High Stakes Poker (HSP) is one of the most famous poker shows of all time and has been a hit with fans ever since it debuted on the Game Show Network (GSN) back in 2006. In 2020, the show switched to PokerGO for Season 8 and has found a home there ever since.

Now in its 14th season, the show has been setting several records for large pots. Earlier in the season, Andrew Robl and Santhosh Suvama played a record-setting pot of \$992,000, which was the largest in High Stakes Poker history. Well, that didn't last long as in Episode 10 a monster seven-figure pot took place.

The stakes were \$500/\$1,000 and the game was no-limit Texas hold'em. There was nearly \$4 million on the table with some action players including Rick Salomon, Nik Airball, Vinny Lingham, Justin Gavri, and the two players involved in the hand – Alan Keating and Peter Wang.

The hand began with a double straddle and action folded to Keating, who just called with the KdKc on the button. Peter looked down at the As3s in the big blind and raised to \$14,000, which prompted the straddlers to get out of the way. Keating then sprung to life with a three-bet to \$69,000 and Peter called.

The 2sJsKh flop had action written all over it as Keating flopped top set and Peter the nut-flush draw. The latter checked and the former continued for \$70,000. Peter then check-raised to \$200,000 and Keating only called.

When the Ad turn paired Peter, he moved all in for \$434,000 and Keating snap-called to create a \$1,412,500 pot, making it the largest pot in High Stakes Poker history assuming there would be no chop as the duo agreed to run the river twice.

As it was in a vacuum, Keating was an 81.82% favorite to win while Peter had an 18.18% chance of hitting his flush. If Peter hit one of the two run outs, he'd at least recoup half the pot.

The Ac on the first runoff ensured Keating would break even, but if he could avoid a spade on the second he'd scoop the entire pot. That's just what happened as the Jc completed the board on the second runoff.

Not only did Keating win the largest pot in High Stakes Poker history, it came just four episodes after he won a \$911,000 pot off Peter after making what is considered one of the greatest hero calls of all time.

"It's my favorite hand because neither of us have much, but we made a game of chicken out of it by putting pressure on each other and no one backed down," Keating told media outlet PokerNews.

Clearly the two players have a long and expensive history, at least for Peter!
