4. Don Williams, in 1979.
5. "Sad Eyes," by Robert John, in 1979. While most songs to reach the top of pop charts at that time were disco, "Sad Eyes" was the non-disco song that helped fuel a turn against disco. It deserves a listen if only for that reason.

Online Bingo Q&A

Q. Is online Bingo on Facebook legal?
A. According to the National Association of Fundraising Ticket Manufacturers virtual Bingo and pull tabs games conducted on Facebook and Facebook Live are illegal.

Q. Is any online Bingo legal?
A. Laws of the United States can be federal or state statutes. In the case of gambling, which applies to Bingo, the laws are state dependent, or in other words, the laws of the individual state can take precedence over the federal statutes. Online gambling was federally banned in 2006, which initiated the canceling of financial transactions between gambling sites and banks. Due to elements of chance dominating the game of Bingo, it is not legal to play straight cash games. Online cash operations that are managed by the United States are illegal and are undergrounds sites. U.S. residents should stick with free Bingo game sites that offer prizes. Although it may be seen as a legal gray area, playing on offshore sites as a U.S. resident is illegal. Offshore sites can be dangerous due to operating out of U.S. jurisdiction. If you lose your winnings or are not offered a fair game, there is a zero percent chance to prosecute or reclaim your winnings. In 2006, United States Congress passed the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act to ban all illegal forms of online gambling. Also, Congress also made an amendment to the Safe Port Act, which deemed all illicit gambling transactions between online sites and player's banks illegal. Banks immediately put a halt to all pending transactions, and some were penalized for continuing illegal business.



Q: I'm really surprised Carol Burnett didn't get nominated for an Emmy for *Better Call Saul*. Isn't there a special category for guest-star parts? I thought she'd be a shoo-in. — *G.M.*

A: Comedy legend Carol Burnett did a spectacular job in her impactful role on the final season of *Better Call Saul*. However, according to Rolling Stone, she wasn't eligible for the Outstanding Guest Actress category because she appeared in "one episode too many" and was thus submitted for consideration in the Supporting Actress category instead. Alas, that category was highly competitive and saturated with actresses from *The White Lotus*, leaving Burnett off the nominations list.

Better Call Saul aired its series finale right after voting ended for last year's Emmys, putting it at a disadvantage for this year's nominations. Bob Odenkirk and Rhea Seehorn are contenders in their respective acting categories, and the ceremony is expected to air on Fox this September.



Gaming News

NJ Ends Vintage Chip Cashing

Here's a strange blast from the past. The New Jersey Division of Gaming Enforcement issued an "emergency" order recently, ending an old policy of cashing chips from the Playboy Casino in Atlantic City. Playboy opened its property in 1981 but was never approved to run the casino; Elsinore Corp., which owned the Four Queens in Las Vegas at the time, held the license. The Playboy name changed in 1984 to Atlantis after Playboy sold its interest to Elsinore and an \$875,000 fund was set up for redeeming Playboy chips. The terms were that players could cash their chips until all the money ran out, with no expiration date; the fund was managed for nearly forty years by the state Department of the Treasury. The state finally determined that the original players had long since redeemed their chips and those that were still being cashed were inherited or purchased on the secondary market. The fund "was never intended to be an open-ended invitation for subsequent acquirers of such chips to cash them in," Gaming said in the statement announcing the "abrupt" end of the redemption program.

Oneida Expansion

The Oneida Indian Nation recently unveiled a \$370 million investment plan to transform Turning Stone Resort Casino in Central New York, marking the resort's most extensive expansion to date. Over the course of two years, the project will encompass the creation of a conference center, outdoor event spaces,

a new hotel, and more. The endeavor is projected to yield a one-time economic impact of \$616 million, generate 3,600 one-time jobs, and contribute \$22.1 million in state and local tax revenues. The Nation has partnered with architecture and design firm Gensler for the project and will break ground on the project "early next year."

Vegas Airport on the Busy List

Airports Council International (ACI) recently posted its annual World Airport Traffic Dataset that ranks the world's top-20 busiest airports for passengers, freight, and "airport movements" (runways and taxiways). In 2022, Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson was once again the world's busiest for passengers (94 million), followed by Dallas Fort Worth (73.3 million), Denver (69.3 million) and Chicago O'Hare (68.3 million). Dubai was the only airport outside the U.S. in the top 5 (66.06 million). Las Vegas placed 12th with 52.7 million passengers, but in the movements category, it ranked fifth, displacing Dubai from the top five. Atlanta oversaw just under 725,000 takeoffs and landings, Vegas just over 581,000. U.S. airports occupied nine of the top-ten movements rankings, with Istanbul number 10 (426,000).

Lucky, Again

A slot player at the Chumash Casino, roughly 125 miles north of Los Angeles in Santa Ynez, hit a \$520,000 jackpot in May. Tempted again by the largest progressive in the Chumash's history, he returned to see if he might get struck by lightning twice. Sure enough, he nailed the \$1.3 million record breaker. He said that he was "surprised" (yeah, I'd think so) and he'll use the money to pay college tuition for his grandchildren and buy one granddaughter, who turns 16 in September, a new car.





Casino Q&A

Q: Why do some players pull their players club card out of the machine in the middle of play then put it back in after a number of spins?
A: This is called card pulling. Many players clubs use a player's win-loss record in determining whether or not to offer comps. And some players believe it's better to have more losses than wins on their records. So, here's what they do. When the slot's in a hot streak or displays a poker hand with a potential for a big payoff, they pull their card out of the machine to reduce the record of their winnings.
A: foolish move. When you take your card out of the machine, your play stops being recorded and is not earning any comps. It's the total amount of money you put into a machine that determines what comps you're entitled to—whether you're gambling with credits or money out of your pocket. So always leave your card in the machine when playing.



Q: Do the churches in Las Vegas accept casino chips in their offering plates?
A: Yes. All churches do accept them. But they don't return the chips to the individual casinos for reimbursement. A local Catholic monastery provides this service for a small fee. They're called "chip monks."
Q: How do casinos handle obsessively loud or obnoxious players?
A: Casinos don't allow players to scream, swear, use sexist language or pose threats. This type of behavior is considered disorderly conduct, and the offender is warned against continuing. If the warning is ignored, the player is asked to leave the casino.
Q: Which is better to play, live keno or a video keno machine?
A: Per dollar wagered, video keno usually gives back more than the live game. In Nevada, live games often return less than 80% of the money wagered; and even less than 70% in some casinos. However, most states require that a keno machine return at least 80% of money wagered. In competitive areas like Las Vegas, video paybacks in the high 80s and low 90s are common. And since video games move much faster than the live game, they make more money for the casino. So, you're likely to get a higher payback on a video game, but your cost per hour to play will be much higher.

We plan on visiting the new bingo at Edgewater Casino where their new bingo room has lovely views of the Colorado River. We usually play at Tropicana and our friends went on a three-day bingo binge there on our last visit. There’s a cash ball each session plus a second lava ball which pays a hefty thousand smackers on certain days.



I am a 72-year-old woman who, over my adult years, has developed allergies to Tylenol and all NSAIDs. Just this week, I developed a rash after taking aspirin, which was my last resort for pain. I was given a prescription for tramadol, but I really don’t want to take a narcotic for aches and pains I only have periodically. Instead, I use ice, heat, stretching and exercise, which keep me pain-free most of the time. — T.W.

ANSWER: I have rarely seen a person allergic to so many classes of medicines, but it can occasionally happen. It’s unfortunate, but I certainly agree with you that an opioid (the term narcotic isn’t used any more) is too powerful a medication to use lightly.

There are serious side effects that can happen with tramadol, like any other opioid, and even appropriate use of opioids can lead to opioid use disorder. Misuse of prescription drugs is a huge problem in North America, and not prescribing them in the first place is a good way to prevent problems. (People who misuse opioids commonly get them from a friend or relative.)

Nonprescription ways of treating pain seem like a very good way to treat the occasional pains we all get. Topical treatments, like menthol, camphor-based creams or even topical NSAIDs like diclofenac, may not cause allergic reactions, so you might have success by trying those.

What is an Annual Notice of Change?

Dear Savvy Senior,

Last year I received a “notice of change” letter from my Medicare provider. Should I expect another one every year, and what should I do with it? — **Medicare Rookie**

Dear Rookie,

The letter you’re asking about is actually referred to as the Annual Notice of Change (or ANOC), which is a letter you receive from your Medicare Advantage or Medicare Part D prescription drug plan in late September. (People with only a Medigap plan don’t receive these because Medigap plans do not have benefit changes from year to year). So yes, you should expect to receive another letter next year.

The ANOC gives a summary of any changes in your plan’s costs and coverage that will take effect Jan. 1 of the next year. The ANOC is typically mailed with the plan’s “evidence of coverage,” which is a more comprehensive list of the plan’s costs and benefits for the upcoming year.

You should review these notices to see if your plan will continue to meet your health care needs in 2024. If you are dissatisfied with any upcoming changes, you can make changes to your coverage during the fall open enrollment period.

Here are three types of changes to look for: Costs: If you have a Medicare Advantage plan, find out what you can expect to pay for services in 2024. Costs such as deductibles and copayments can change each year. For example, your plan may not have had a deductible in 2023, but it could have one in 2024. A deductible is the amount of money you owe out-of-pocket before your plan begins to cover your care. Another example is that your plan may increase the copayments you owe for visits to your primary care provider or specialists.

Then, to their surprise, two ladies came forward—bless their hearts. Their sheets contained the same serial number as the sheet I’d hit Bingo on. I told the caller and the session lady that I’d had Bingo first and that the Bingo should be mine. Anyway, they paid me, but only after having made me look and feel like a criminal. Chances are good that I would have been banned from the hall had those other ladies not come forward. I don’t intend to enter that hall again, even if the packs there are the cheapest ones in town. — **M.L., Portsmouth, Virginia**

Dear M.L.,

One of the benefits of computerized Bingo is the ability to verify, through serial numbers, that a card was legitimately purchased at a specific game and that when someone gets a Bingo, they are the rightful winner. Before computer verification, there was always the risk of someone cheating by bringing in cards they’d purchased elsewhere, thus depriving a hall of sales revenue and honest players their rightful winnings.

Unfortunately, it sounds like you fell victim to what is supposed to keep the games honest—verifiable serial numbers. Someone either mixed your sheets in with the correct ones or failed to record your serial number. Either way, you ended up embarrassed.

On the upside, I commend you for sticking to your guns, and congratulate you for being able to prove your case. And eventually I hope you will reconsider boycotting that hall. They made an honest mistake, and did pay you your prize money. — **Aunt Bingo**

Coverage: If you have an Advantage plan with prescription drug coverage check to see if your doctors, hospitals, and other health care providers and pharmacies will still be in network for 2023. You have the lowest out-of-pocket costs if you go to providers and pharmacies that are in your plan’s network. If you see an out-of-network provider, your plan may not cover any of the cost of your care, leaving you to pay the cost out-of-pocket. You should also contact your providers directly to confirm that they will still be accepting your plan in the coming year.

Drugs: If you have prescription drug coverage, look through the plan’s formulary, which is the list of drugs the plan covers. Formulary changes can happen from year to year, so make sure the medications you’re taking will be covered next year, and that they’re not moved to a higher tier which will affect your copay. If you see any changes that will increase your costs, you may want to select a different drug plan that covers all of your medications. If the formulary is incomplete, or you do not see your drug(s) on the list, contact the plan directly to learn more.

If you have not received an ANOC by the end of September, you should contact your Medicare Advantage Plan or Part D plan to request it. This notice can be very helpful in determining whether you should make any changes to your coverage during the fall open enrollment. Reading your ANOC can also prevent any surprises about your coverage in the new year.

Shopping, comparing and enrolling in a new Medicare Advantage or Part D plan during the open enrollment period can easily be done online at Medicare’s Plan Finder Tool at Medicare.gov/find-a-plan.

Or, if you don’t have a computer or Internet access, you can also call Medicare at 800-633-4227 and they can help you out over the phone. Your State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP), which provides free Medicare counseling, is also a great resource to help you make any changes. To find a local SHIP counselor, visit ShipHelp.org or call 877-839-2675.



Busting a Poker Tournament Kings Versus Kings With \$765,731 on the Line!

One of the most popular poker tournaments every year at the annual World Series of Poker (WSOP) is the \$1,000 Seniors Championship, which requires participants be 50+ or old to compete.

For example, the 2023 WSOP edition of the tournament attracted 8,180 entrants and awarded a \$7,280,200 prize pool.

Imagine making it deep in such a tournament with six-figure prizes reserved for those lucky enough to make the final table, including \$765,731 and a coveted gold

bracelet for the winner. Each decision has the potential to either win or lose you tens of thousands, if not hundreds of thousands, in real-money equity. Just imagine that amount of pressure.

Given all that, now imagine losing in the most brutal way possible. That is exactly what happened to Gordon Eng earlier this summer with just five players remaining. In Level 37 (400,000/800,000/800,000), Shannon Fahey, the last female player remaining in the tournament, raised to 2.2 million in the cutoff and Eng three-bet all in for 7.7 million from the small blind.

The player in the big blind folded and Fahey called with her KdKh. Surprisingly, Eng had the other two kings with the KcKs. The two would chop the pot 97.83% of the time, while each had a mere 2.17% chance of winning outright, the only way being if the board ran out with at least four of one suit.

If the flop came down one of each suit, that possibility would disappear and the duo would split the pot. Instead, it fell Jh10h2h and Fahey was freerolling, meaning she could no longer lose the pot, would at worst chop, and still had a chance to win it all. On the other hand, Eng was in a bad spot with his best-case scenario being a chop.

Fahey had a 36.36% chance of catching another heart, which she promptly did after the dealer burned and turned the 4h. The meaningless 2d was run out on the river and Eng was eliminated in fifth place for \$205,799. It was a truly brutal way to exit the tournament given everything that was

on the line, but as any player who has been around long enough would tell you, “That’s poker.”

Despite winning that hand, Fahey wound up following him out the door in fourth place for \$269,841. Her downfall came when she got her stack all in preflop holding the Qc9c and was flipping against the 7h7s of Dan Heimiller. A seven on the flop sealed her fate while Heimiller, who won the same event back in 2014, went on to finish in third place for \$356,166.

For those wondering, Lonnie Hallett defeated Poker Hall of Famer Billy Baxter in heads-up play to win the tournament for \$765,731 and the gold bracelet.

Do you have any suggestions on how to get these guys to cooperate.

Dear Flashboard,

Although you do not say so directly, I am going to assume you are the Bingo manager or a senior staff member with the organization that sponsors this particular Bingo. Based on that, I can instantly identify what the problem is with this group. The problem is you.

As the person in charge of the Bingo and therefore the volunteers, it is your responsibility to set the ground rules for participant behavior at these meetings. If you do not want to have arguments erupt over every little thing, then you must state this to the group and hold firm when things begin to unravel. If the volunteers refuse to follow your mandate, then you may be forced to reduce their participation to voting on each issue without their input, with the majority vote determining the outcome.

This is basic personnel management. If people are not told the rules they are to follow, they will simply make up their own, leading to chaos when the individuals’ rules collide. But I don’t have to tell you this. You’ve already seen this time and time again, firsthand.

Bottom line: Encourage discussion, but only if it is civil and controlled. Set agendas for the meetings to help participants behave properly. Give warnings and reduce input if problems persist. And above all, rule with an iron hand. — **Guy**

Four Card Poker Basics

Four Card Poker is a relatively new poker-based table game that gained popularity in casinos everywhere about a decade ago but is now on the decline. First off, you would think that you would get four cards in Four Card Poker. Wrong. You actually get five cards which you use to make the best four-card poker hand. The dealer, on the other hand, gets six cards, which are used to make a four-card poker hand.

Before the cards are dealt, you have the option to bet on either the Ante or the Aces Up. These two betting options are independent, and you can wager on either one or both. If you wager on the Ante, you will be competing against the dealer's hand with the highest hand winning. If you wager on the Aces Up, you are paid on the strength of your four-card hand. The higher the four-card poker hand, the more you win (the pay table starts with a pair of aces).

The mechanics of the game go like this. Players make their wager on the Ante and/or Aces Up. Each player gets five cards and the dealer gets six cards, one of which is dealt face up. Each player looks at their five-card hand and then decides, based on their cards and the dealer card that is showing, whether to fold or play. If the player folds, that forfeits the Ante wager. If the player decides to play, they must make an additional raise wager equal to either 1x, 2x, or 3x the amount of the Ante wager. If the initial Ante bet was \$10, for example, they could make a raise wager equal to \$10, \$20, or a maximum of \$30.

When a player raises, they discard one card and keep the best four cards. The dealer then turns over their five cards and selects the best four cards from their six total cards to form their four-card hand. The player's four-card hand is then compared to the dealer's four-card hand to see who wins (known as the showdown).

If the player's four-card poker hand is higher in rank or ties the dealer's four-card hand, the player wins even money on both the Ante and the Play wagers.

If the dealer's hand beats the player's hand, the player loses the Ante and Play wagers.

Besides winning money on your Ante and Play wagers, if you are dealt one of the top three hands—either four of a kind, straight flush, or three of a kind—you get a guaranteed additional bonus payout (paid on the Ante wager) regardless of whether your hand beats the dealer's hand. The most common pay table for the bonus payout is:

- Four of a Kind pays 25-1
- Straight Flush pays 20-1
- Three of a Kind pays 2-1

Here are the rules on the Aces Up wager. First off you don't have to beat the dealer's hand to win this wager. You win if your four-card hand is at least a pair of aces or higher. The higher the poker rank of your hand, the greater the payout. There are several different pay tables but the most common one is summarized below.

Aces Up Pay Table
 Four of a Kind 50-1
 Straight Flush 30-1
 Three of a Kind 7-1
 Flush 6-1
 Straight 5-1
 Two Pairs 2-1
 Pair of Aces 1-1
Basic Strategy Ante/Play
 There is a basic strategy for the Ante wager and it's pretty easy to remember. Raise 1x with a pair of 3s thru a pair of 9s. Raise 3x with a pair of 10's or greater. Fold with a pair of 2's or less. The house edge on the Ante wager is 3.4%. The average amount bet for the combined Ante + Play wager is 2.14 units, which equals a house edge of only 1.6% of the total action (not bad for a table game).

Unreal Win in SC
 A North Carolina woman got the surprise of her life when she purchased a winning lottery ticket just one week after buying her first house. Patricia Simmons, of Greensboro, said she bought a lucky \$30 Millionaire Maker scratch-off ticket in Greensboro, which resulted in a \$1 million win, according to a press release from the North Carolina Education Lottery. Simmons, who works as an in-home aide, said she has "been in shock ever since." However, she wasn't the only one surprised. Her husband also couldn't believe it when she called him to tell him the news. "He said, 'Tricia you're playing,'" she told lottery officials. "He wanted to see the ticket."  A grandfather of ten is \$1 million richer after his Los Angeles County convenience store sold a winning \$2 billion Powerball ticket. The store, located in Altadena, has since been awarded a \$1 million retailer selling bonus, according to the California State Lottery. The winnings come as Chahayed, 75, prepares to welcome another grandchild. "My son is expecting a baby in two months, so we are excited!" Chahayed told the outlet. Chahayed is also the father-in-law of former Cincinnati Bengals player Domata Peko, according to FOX affiliate WXIX-TV. The 70-year-old player first won \$100,000 on a "\$100K Ultimate Cash Instant Game" ticket she purchased at a Speedy gas station in her town, state lottery officials said in a press release. The following week, the woman went out to Lottery Headquarters in Dover to claim her prize. On her way home, she stopped to buy three "Serious Money" tickets from the N. Dover Tiger Mart. This time, she won \$300,000 on a ticket. Lottery officials said that she is looking forward to putting money away for retirement. "I love scratching Instant Game tickets!" she added.






