A Tough Spot with Pocket 10s

Four hours into a \$10,000 buy-in live poker tournament, the following hand took place that cut my experience short: An overly loose, splashy player limped from middle position and a good, loose-aggressive player raised to 3.25 big blinds from the cutoff seat. A good, loose-aggressive online kid then three-bet to 12.5 big blinds from the small blind. All of these players started with about 150 big blinds.

I looked down at 10h-10d in the big blind. With my 60 big blind stack, I had a few options:

Folding was by far the most prudent option, but also the weakest. If my opponents were mostly tight and passive, folding would actually be the best play, but in a high-stakes tournament, most of your opponents will tend to use a loose-aggressive strategy.

Out on a Limb by Gary Kopervas



Unscramble these twelve letter strings to form each into an ordinary word (ex. HAGNEC becomes CHANGE). Prepare to use only ONE word from any marked (♥) letter string as each unscrambles into more than one word (ex. ♥RATHE becomes HATER or EARTH or HEART). Fit each string's word either across or down to knot all twelve strings together.

Cold calling, hoping to see the flop, may have some merit given I would be in position against the three-bettor, but that may result in a cascade of calls which would often not work well for me because I would only be able to realize my equity if I flop a set. Notice that strictly set mining is not profitable because I wasn't getting anywhere near the required 10-1 implied odds. Calling also allows the three-bettor to realize his equity with his marginal hands and bluffs that would fold to a four-bet, such as As-5s. In general, cold calling a three-bet with stacks shallower than 100 big blinds is a recipe for disaster.

I could four-bet tiny to 23 big blinds, looking to fold to an all-in, but I really do not like that play. If the person who pushes all-in ever has A-K (or a bluff), folding is a disaster.

Finally, I could go all-in. The main downside to this play is that when someone has A-A - J-J, I would get called every time and would be in horrible shape. However, this should not happen too often, assuming my assessment of the opponents' strategies is correct. The initial raiser is probably raising with a bit more than his normal raising range in order to play heads-up in position against the splashy limper. The three-bettor may be three-betting wider than normal because he expects the initial raiser to be wider than normal. If the three-bettor has a polarized range containing about 65% "bluffs" that would fold to my all-in, going all-in wins about three big blinds, which is a significant profit. Even if he is three-betting on the tighter side, going all-in roughly breaks even. The time when going all-in is a particularly poor move is when one of the three players has an especially tight range that will call most of the time, but I definitely do not think that is the case in this situation.

After weighing all of my somewhat marginal options, I decided to go all-in. The three-bettor quickly called with K-K and I was out.

Looking back, there were perhaps a few tiny things I could have noticed that may have allowed me to fold, but then again, I may just be looking for some sort of justification to fold. The raiser's sizing was quite small, to only 3.25 big blinds. That size gives me in the big blind and the limper a decent price to call, meaning the raiser will rarely win the pot pre-flop. This means that the raiser may have a stronger range than I expected. Also, the three-bettor made it quite large, to 12.5 big blinds. While that sizing is certainly not gigantic or out of line, it polarizes his range. This means the three-bettor either has a premium hand that will call my all-in every time or a junk hand that will easily fold. If the three-bettor's range happens to be weighted toward value hands because he views the initial 3.25 big blind raise as abnormally strong, then my all-in may be quite poor.

That said, I am fine with my play. It is high risk and high variance, but sometimes that is what you have to do to maximize equity. Sometimes maximizing equity results in ruin.

Gaming News

AC Smoking Ban Gains Steam

Months back, at the end of its last session, the New Jersey Legislature failed to pass a law banning smoking in casinos, but this year, the bill has much more support. The fifteen additional bipartisan Assembly members bring the count to thirty-five state legislators who have signed on to sponsor the measure, including the three representatives from Atlantic City. Proponents also include a coalition of casino workers and anti-smoking advocates and the governor says he'll sign any smoking ban that crosses his desk. Opponents, mainly the casino industry, argue that banning smoking will drive gamblers to Pennsylvania, but lawmakers in the Keystone State are considering a similar bill in this year's session. If the two states can get together and ban smoking in tandem, it would result in neither having a competitive advantage.

Slot Win Reporting Change?

The Congressional Gaming Caucus, headed by two U.S. representatives, a Nevada Democrat and Pennsylvania Republican, has introduced legislation to raise the threshold of reporting jackpots to the IRS from \$1,200 to \$5,000. The \$1,200 threshold was set in 1977 and hasn't changed for 45 years; factoring inflation into the equation, \$5,000 is the new \$1,200. In Dec. 2020, Congress directed the Treasury Department to study the issue, but the report is more than a year overdue. A similar bill is set to be filed in the Senate in the near future. The proposed bill now goes to committee, while the Congressional Budget Office figures out how much in taxes the government stands to lose with the higher threshold.

A Billion Dollars Casino License?

As part of its proposed budget for the state, the New York Senate has listed the fee for a single casino license at "no less than one billion dollars." We suppose that means the license fee could be more than a cool billion. According to Politico.com, "The going rate was expected to be \$500 million," but this is a case of a literal double down. The state Assembly's budget didn't name a price, so it will have to be negotiated, but at least \$1 billion is the Senate's opening offer.

McDavid Inks Deal with BetMGM

Connor McDavid, the reigning MVP of the National Hockey League and the league's leading scorer in three of his six seasons (he currently leads the league as well), has signed up with BetMGM to become a brand ambassador, basically an endorsement deal. McDavid becomes the first active professional athlete to affiliate with a sports book. The All-Star center will be featured in BetMGM's marketing campaigns, promotions, social-media content, and fan events. Of course, McDavid is strictly prohibited from gambling on NHL games, but it will be very interesting to see how the dust settles from his breaking this new ground in sports.

Here We Go Again with the Wire Act

This one's a bit of a legal brain teaser, so buckle up and pay attention. IGT, the giant slot maker and lottery vendor, filed a lawsuit to try to compel the U.S. Department of Justice to clarify its position on last year's ruling by the First Circuit Court in New Hampshire that the 1961 Wire Act applies to sports betting only and not igaming, online Powerball ticket sales, wide-area progressive slot networks, and mobile sports wagering. Essentially, IGT wants a 100% guarantee that the Dept. of Justice will never prosecute the company for selling non-sports betting gambling products across state lines.

The DOJ, however, has demurred, asking the court to dismiss the suit. Does it mean that sometime in the future, the feds might again threaten mobile sports betting and multi-state online gambling? Or does it mean that they're signaling IGT and the gambling industry that they don't have anything to worry about? Only time will tell. But for now, the Wire Act, which is now 61 years old, remains in play.

Cash Out to Cash In

Have you ever talked with a friend on the telephone and gotten the feeling that something is wrong with them, but they aren't telling you? This happened to me some time ago. I finally asked my friend point blank, "Is something wrong?" That's when he opened up and told me what happened when he'd played video poker recently.

Before I get into Al's story (not his real name), let me give you some background. Al is a recreational casino player, who visits casinos about 2-3 times per month. He used to play only slots until he asked me about a year ago to teach him how to be a skillful video poker player, which I did. From that day forward, he played only video poker on his casino trips. Al is a successful businessman, travels a lot, and likes to play dollar-denomination, single-line video poker games for fun and relaxation (he only plays games where he knows the playing strategy well and the Expected Value of the game is greater than 99 percent).

Now, let me get back to Al's story. I'll summarize what he told me:

I was playing a dollar-denomination 8/5 Bonus Poker game. I had loaded the machine with \$200 and was playing an 8/5 Bonus Poker progressive machine. I was holding my own when "it" happened. Over the course of the next half hour, I won virtually every hand. My heart was racing, and I remember that my last four-of-a-kind hand was four queens, and I paused for a second and noticed I'd raked up \$2,250 in credits. I'd had never won this much money so quickly in a casino in my life!

I had thought of quitting with a \$2,000 profit but since I had only played an hour or so, I decided to keep playing. Then the tide turned. When I finally stopped playing, I cashed out a \$700 ticket. Yeah, I was a \$500 winner but when I got in my car and started driving home, I started thinking about what I did and how stupid I was for not quitting when I was ahead \$2,000. I mean, that's a lot of cash, the equivalent of half a royal. That night, I couldn't sleep because all I kept thinking about was that \$2k I could have had. It's been a week, and I'm still kicking myself for giving up that two grand.

I consoled Al and told him, "what's done is done" and that he needed to forget about it. I also offered him the following advice so that if he ever gets in that situation again, he'll be able to leave the machine (and the casino) with his profits.

If you get ahead a relatively large amount of money, but you still want to play some more, do this: hit the cash out button, put that ticket in your wallet, and load the machine with another \$200 in cash. It's easy to get carried away when you're on a hot streak, and to keep playing with your built-up credits—and cashing out your credits helps you to avoid that temptation.

If Al had done this during his big winning streak, he would have cashed out two tickets: the big one for \$2,250, and a second ticket with whatever

credits he had left after he stopped playing (even if he lost the entire \$200 in his "second" playing session, he still would have left the casino with a very nice profit).

Al liked my tip, and said he was going to try it if he ever got on another hot streak while playing video poker. I said goodbye and wished him well.

Epilogue: A few months afterwards, Al called me again, and I could tell by the sound of his voice that this time he had some good news to tell me. He said he'd had another very good video poker session—not as spectacular as his other one, but after getting a bunch of winning hands in a short period of time, he had \$1,150 in built-up credits. This time he followed my advice, cashed out the \$1,150, put the ticket in his wallet, loaded up the machine with another \$200, and kept playing.

When he finally quit for the day, he had about \$1,000 in profit between the two tickets. He told me how great it felt having the discipline to quit while he was ahead and drive home with the thousand bucks in his wallet.

Woman Uses \$200 Lottery Win to Help Homeless man

The \$200 a New Bedford, Massachusetts woman won from a scratch ticket didn't stay in her wallet for long. Moments after Sofia Andrade won on a recent Saturday night, she was at a stop sign and saw Glenn Williams panhandling in the freezing cold. "I knew that the money never really belonged to me," Andrade told WCVB. "This money was meant to help him." When she called Williams over and asked him to join her for a cup of coffee, she found out he had been homeless for three years and that local shelters didn't have an available bed for him. "He was so overwhelmed by just the generosity of a coffee that he just couldn't stop crying," she said. It was then that Andrade decided her lotto winnings would be used to get him three nights at a motel room. "I couldn't believe there's somebody like her," a grateful Williams told the news outlet. "She deserves a lot of the credit for where I am right now." Soon after her selfless deed, Andrade took to Facebook to write about it and before she knew it, Williams was reconnected with his two sisters who have since visited him at the motel. She also started a GoFundMe page for him which has raised over \$15,000.

Luck Strikes Twice in Tennessee

Nick Slatten had luck on his side in more ways than one. His good fortune began on March 10, when he stopped by a local grocery store to buy a drink and a lottery ticket after spending the day laying tile, the Tennessee Education Lottery said in a press release. The next morning, the Sparta resident was shocked to discover the Tennessee Cash ticket he'd bought was a winner worth a whopping \$1,178,746. "I was stunned. I couldn't believe it. I can't express it. It was something else," he said. After visiting his fiancée Michelle at work to tell her the good news, Slatten went about the rest of his day running errands, from going out to lunch to taking his brother to buy a car part at O'Reilly's Auto Parts. But about an hour later, Slatten realized he

no longer had his winning lottery ticket. "I couldn't find it anywhere," he said in the release. The Lottery always encourages players to sign their ticket immediately after purchase to identify it as theirs and to help prevent someone else from cashing it, in the event that it is lost or stolen. With his fate hanging in the balance, Slatten retraced his steps and eventually found himself back at the auto store, where lo and behold, the missing ticket was waiting for him, lying on the ground in the parking lot next to the driver's side door of another vehicle. "It's a million-dollar ticket, and someone stepped right over it," he said in the release, which noted that the weather was breezy that day. Slatten said that he and Michelle plan to keep their jobs and want to use their winnings to buy a house of their own and upgrade their vehicles. Slatten said in the release that his new windfall will allow him to live his life with "not a whole lot of worries."

KC Lottery Winnings Donated

Single mom Shetara Sims recently lost her job and has been struggling with her bills—but when she came upon a winning lottery ticket, she didn't think twice about donating the money to a Kansas City police officer who'd been shot in the line of duty—and now, thanks to her selfless gesture, the officer's colleagues have helped raise more than \$55,000 to help Sims in her own time of need. Sims explained in a phone call to the station that she'd recently been laid off due to COVID-19 and had been struggling, but on a trip to the grocery she found a \$1 bill in the parking lot, which she used to buy a scratch-off lottery ticket. The ticket wound up being a \$100 winner, and Sims' 12-year-old daughter Rakiya immediately suggested to her mom, that "we should give that to the police officer who got shot," and Sims agreed. Police tried to talk her into keeping her winnings, but she insisted, having a history with police being helpful to her after a very traumatic event in her past. Officers were so moved by the gesture they tracked her down and set up a fund for her.

Parking Lot Bingo Remains a Hit

Hillsborough County Aging Services of Tampa, Florida closed their centers two years ago due to the pandemic and they have yet to reopen. However, that doesn't mean they still aren't going above and beyond for seniors. Parking lot Bingo began as a safe outlet for seniors during the pandemic and it turned into a can't miss party every month. "We mention the outdoor event and the slots get filled up within the first three or four days," said organizer Frances Brea. Armed with their sheets, markers and winning attitudes, these seniors are grateful outdoor social functions are still available two years later. "I'm a cancer survivor twice over. I have to really watch it being around people, I prefer it outside," said Betty Rice. "It gives us morale, happiness, meeting our old friends," added another player. "Oh yes, yes, social isolation is a big issue among seniors and older adults, so we knew we had to find alternative methods," said Brea. For Aging Services, they don't know who enjoys the games more, the seniors or the staff. Even when Aging Services does eventually open back up their centers, they'll always look to the parking lot with fondness and appreciation.

Hay (and Bingo) Are for Horses

People packed McLane Church of Erie, PA on a recent Sunday afternoon to play several games of Bingo to support a local non-profit, Hope on Horseback. Organizers estimate around 200 people came out to play bingo and donate to their charity. All the money made through the event will be used to help care for the ten horses that help those with special needs. A majority of the money will go to feed the horses—the organization's biggest expense. The money will also go towards the planning of new programs for Hope on Horseback. Betty Rositer, the Executive Director for Hope on Horseback explained, "We feel like because of the stress that we have all suffered through Covid that this a good time to bring people out and let them work with the horses."

Community Centre Comes to Life

Bingo hasn't been called in this building for years—but now the St. Alban's Community Centre of Newfoundland is lighting up with the sights and sounds of the Bingo caller, the tear-open cards and the bobbing dabbers. Five years ago, the 50-plus club (along with a host of other groups) was kicked out of the building, a side-effect of a string of fires set by an arsonist who targeted public infrastructure. "It's great to be back," said Mayor Rodney Kendall. "There's work to be done getting all the groups resituated in the building, finding space for everyone, getting them set up. But everyone's excited to be back, and we're looking forward to getting up and running again at full capacity."

Play for Pollinators

"Regardless of where you live, native plants and pollinators are necessary for providing food for animals and humans alike," explained Alex Wehrung of the Wildlife Center of Virginia, adding that "the majority of crops for humans rely on pollinators, who create a healthier ecosystem for everyone." The center recently created National Pollinator Bingo to help people get involved with the process of protecting animals and preserving native plants. "In typical Bingo fashion, you get a row, you get a prize," Wehrung said of the game. Participants have twenty-five spaces that include directions to follow that make life a little easier for pollinators. Some spaces require planting a flower, and a photo of activities is required. The center's bingo game does not have a deadline and cards are available online at www.wildlifecenter.org.

mom's Comfort Food

Everyone loves food, some of us more than others (guilty), and one thing I love about food is exploring new options or trends in food—or even looking into a more standard item I've never tried before. There have been some great hits for me (rutabagas), and some sad misses (cauliflower rice).

CHILLED CHICKEN AND PASTA SALAD

- 1 pound boneless skinned chicken breast
- 1 dehydrated chicken bouillon cube
- 2 ½ cups water
- ½ cup chopped onions
- 6 ounces raw spaghetti pasta
- 1 can artichoke hearts
- 1 large chopped tomato
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 3 tablespoons Balsamic vinegar
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 ½ tablespoons sugar
- dash of salt
- ½ teaspoon dried rosemary
- ¼ teaspoon garlic powder
- ¼ teaspoon black pepper

Dissolve the bouillon cube in water. Add the chicken and onion and cook until done, about 25 to 30 minutes. Save the broth. Chop the chicken into small pieces when cooled. Cook the pasta according to the package directions in the reserved broth and enough added water as necessary. Combine all the ingredients and mix well. Refrigerate at least two hours. Serves 8.

A Need for Speed

Dear Aunt Bingo,
I have noticed that the caller calls too fast for "paper" players. Machine players pay an extra \$5 per six-pack for using the machine instead of the paper/dauber method. Paper players are at a disadvantage. They cannot keep up with the caller.

Is there a set speed callers must use? Some call at 17 seconds, some 10 seconds. However, some callers don't wait for the "beep" to signal the time for the next number to be called. They might call in two or three seconds, or irregular sequences, making it difficult if not impossible to keep up. I, and others, have lost our Bingo because of this violation. To complain is useless—management claims that "the machine is set" and no change is allowed. Please advise. Thanks for your help. Love your column.

Dear Aunt Bingo,
The callers at several of the Bingo halls I go to insist upon calling the numbers too slowly. They don't get it that players get bored and restless if they have to sit

too long between numbers. When that happens, people begin to talk and laugh and make noise, so that when the next ball finally is called, it is not always easy to hear.

What can a player do to get the callers to speed up?
—*Bingo Napper, via e-mail*

Dear McC and Napper,

Taking a page from the children's story Goldilocks and the Three Bears, one thing I have learned over the years from writing this column is that some players feel that callers call the numbers too fast, others insist that the callers are too slow, while the rest feel the calling is juuuuuust right.

Typically, there is one reason why Bingo halls choose the particular pace they use for calling numbers: It's the length of time the majority of players prefer. If they hear from multiple players that the pace between calls is too fast or too slow, they adjust accordingly.

This is one of the reasons why it is so great that Bingo blower machines have a timer to help keep the caller on track: There is no guessing involved; every pause between calls is the same length as the one before and the one after. And to the best of my knowledge, these timers are adjustable to the pace the majority of players say they are most comfortable with.

Certainly, the introduction of handheld electronic Bingo units has changed things, but their use shouldn't create a handicap to paper players—unless the hall manager is purposely trying to demonstrate the speed of the electronic devices and encourage more people to use them. If that's the case, he or she is going about it the wrong way.

As long as there are new players and seasoned players, social players and serious players, single-pack players and multi-pack players, not to mention newer and faster technology, it is going to be impossible for a caller to meet the needs and speeds of every player in a Bingo hall. —*Aunt Bingo*

Ice Cream Cones minus the Ice Cream

One of my favorite things to do is find inexpensive products we all know and love and find new uses for them. Lately, ice cream cones have been on sale for less than \$1.50. It got me thinking, what else can we do with these inexpensive, whimsical holders of happiness?

Turns out, lots of things! Here are some fun ideas to get your wheels turning.

Make a breakfast cone — Alternate layers of fruit, granola and yogurt, like a parfait, into the cone and serve for a fun breakfast treat.

Bake ice cream cone cupcakes — Place flat-bottomed cones in each well of a mini-muffin tin. Prepare a boxed cake mix and pour batter 3/4 of the way up the cone. Bake at 350 F for 20 to 25 minutes. Decorate as desired.

Make individual treats for kids — It's perfect because every child gets their own portion, they eat the bowl so there's no clean up, and it keeps their little hands out of the communal candy dish. Great for trail mix, popcorn, pretzels, candies and rice crispy treats.

Mix savory with sweet — Surprise your next lunch guests with waffle cones filled with curried chicken salad with fruit.

Make waffle cone cannoli — Who loves cannoli? Everyone! Who likes to make cannoli? People with extra time on their hands! This Italian classic literally means "little tube," named for the deep-fried tube

of pastry filled with sweetened and flavored ricotta cheese. The filling is easy to make. The fried pastry tubes, not so much. So, let's take a shortcut by substituting waffle cones for the pastry.

ICE CREAM CONE CANNOLI

- 1 (32 ounce) container whole milk ricotta cheese
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Zest of one orange
- 1 (10 ounce) bag mini semisweet chocolate chips; divided
- 8 to 10 waffle cones
- 1 1/2 cup semisweet chocolate baking wafers (optional)

1. For best results, drain the ricotta overnight. Place ricotta in a strainer lined with cheesecloth or a coffee filter, placed over a mixing bowl. Cover with plastic wrap and put a plate on top, weighted with a small can (like a tuna can) to press out the liquid.

2. Make the filling: Mix together ricotta, sugar, vanilla, salt and zest. Fold in 1/2 cup of the chocolate chips — but before you do, if you're going to use a piping bag with a star tip to finish the cones (as pictured), remove about 3/4 cup of the filling and set aside. The chips always get stuck in the tip and make us cranky. Place the filling in a zippered plastic bag and refrigerate.

3. Meanwhile, dip the cones in chocolate. It's optional, but why wouldn't you? Melt the chocolate wafers in a bowl just large enough to accommodate the top of the waffle cone. Dip the top of the cones and let the excess drip off. Let the chocolate begin to firm then roll the chocolate into some mini chocolate chips. If you have extra chocolate, drizzle some in the bottom of each cone.

4. To assemble: Cut the corner off the zippered bag and squeeze the filling, dividing between the cones. If finishing with a piping bag, place the reserved filling

without chips in a piping bag fitted with a star tip. Swirl the top of each cone. Sprinkle with mini chips. Serve immediately. If you still have cones left after all this, buy some ice cream!

TIP: Have stale cones in your cupboard? Feed the birds by spreading cones with peanut butter and rolling in birdseed.

Studies suggest that drinking tomato juice may lower the risk of heart attack and stroke for diabetics.

Fewer blot clots

- Platelet blood cells tended to stick together less in diabetics who drank tomato juice every day
- That cut the risk of dangerous blood clot formation

5. "Silence Is Golden," by the Four Seasons in 1964 and the Tremeloes in 1967. The Four Seasons' original (as a B-side to "Rag Doll") didn't do as well as the Tremeloes' version, which went to No. 1 in numerous countries.
