DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 76-year-old male in good health. I go to the gym three days a week, eat well, and fast one day a week. I have been reading about taking a tablespoon of olive oil at night as a remedy for all kinds of things such as digestion issues and arthritis. I tried it, and I swear that the first day after ingesting it, I felt less pain in the arthritis in my hands and feet.

Is there any evidence that this practice is helpful? Also, does it matter what kind or brand of olive oil one uses? I bought special olive oil that is polyphenol-rich; it is lighter and more tasty than the extra-virgin oil I normally buy at the food market. What's your take on this? — *L.A.*

ANSWER: I don't think olive oil is a cure for all ailments, there are certainly health benefits when using olive oil compared to most oils. The flavor and amount of polyphenol (an anti-inflammatory compound found in olive oil) will vary from one brand to another. These anti-inflammatory compounds can help symptoms of arthritis in some people.

Personally, I recommend extra-virgin olive oil (made from the initial squeezing of olives without chemical and heat treatment), which has the highest amount of the nutrients you want. But my advice is to choose based on the flavor you like and how much you want to spend rather than the polyphenol content. And of course, too much of anything, including olive oil, isn't good for you, but a tablespoon is fine.

Our Prisons Must be Full

Are we short on prison space in this country? We must be. It's the only logical explanation for so many criminals being given probation instead of prison time.

For example, there were the scammers who sold misbranded N95 masks during the pandemic and price gouged hospitals. The masks were promised to be approved by the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health when they were not and were accompanied by test-result literature that was actually for a different mask. Hospitals paid \$2.6 million for the masks that had much lower filtration efficiency.

So what was the punishment? One year of probation and a fine of only \$9,500.

Then there was the real estate agent property manager who didn't tell anybody about the lead-based paint in the housing where veterans lived with their families. The agent knew this and still signed rental agreements without notifying residents about the paint. A baby living there was found to have high blood lead levels because of the lead in the paint.

The agent's scammer pals, a hazardous material mitigation service, were hired to go in and clean up the lead paint. They didn't and were eventually nailed with one count of the False Claims Act. And after putting lives in danger, what was the punishment for the real estate agent and the scammer pals? Probation and fines.

Then there was the guy who schemed to grab Covid funding to the tune of nearly a half million dollars. Punishment: a fine and — you guessed it — probation.

And what of the guy who groped a student nurse at a VA hospital, a case of abusive sexual contact? The guidelines indicate he could have gotten up to two years in prison. Yet he gets a free pass. Once again: probation.

I can only conclude that our prisons are full. There's no other explanation for only giving probation to these criminals.

Woman Wins, State Still Won't Pay

A woman who won an \$83.5 million Texas lottery jackpot in February has filed a lawsuit after allegedly not receiving her prize amid controversy over the use of third-party couriers for buying tickets. Howry, Breen & Herman, LLP, an Austin-based law firm representing the woman, who chose to remain anonymous, announced the suit in late May, against Sergio Rey in his official capacity as acting deputy executive director of the Texas Lottery Commission. "It shouldn't take a lawsuit to get paid when you win the lottery," according to the complaint, which was filed in Travis County District Court and obtained by PEOPLE magazine. "But that's exactly what has happened here. Because the Texas Lottery has not acted with integrity, has not acted with responsibility, and has not paid Ms. Doe as the rightful and undisputed winner, she had to bring this lawsuit to get paid as the rightful winner..."

In an interview with the *Austin American-Statesman* published on March 18, the woman said she came forward to claim her winnings from the Feb. 17 Lotto Texas jackpot drawing but did not receive them. NBC affiliate KXAN reports that the woman used Jackpocket, an app that allows users to play "official state lottery games on your phone," according to their website. Jackpocket is a subsidiary of sports betting company DraftKings, which also owns the Winner's Corner store located in North Austin, where the winning ticket was purchased.

"The bottom line is, if people are going to have confidence in the lottery, we have to be sure that no one has an advantage," said Texas Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick, according to CBS affiliate KHOU, who noted that the store had numerous lottery terminals. "This is not the way the lottery was designed to operate."

Texas Gov. Greg Abbott announced on Feb. 24 that he called on state law enforcement officials to look into the wins from an April 2023 Lotto Texas jackpot drawing and the recent Feb. 17 drawing. *The New York Times* reported.

The complaint acknowledged that the woman purchased her ticket through Jackpocket from "which she and thousands of other Texans have used for years to lawfully purchase Texas lottery tickets."

The court document further stated that the woman presented her winning ticket to the Texas Lottery Commission on March 18, adding: "The Commission determined that Plaintiff was the lawful bearer of the winning ticket in the Lotto Texas drawing that occurred on February 17, 2025, and determined that Plaintiff was therefore the 'prize winner' under Texas Government Code § 466.4001."

However, the complaint alleged, Rey and the Texas Lottery Commission have refused to give the prize to the woman, "apparently at the behest of one or more elected office holders."

The complaint further stated that on Feb. 24, a week after the woman won the lottery, the Commission's then-executive director Ryan Mindell said that lottery ticket courier services "are not allowed under Texas law and that the Commission would move forward with proposed rule amendments prohibiting such services in the future."

"We all know the Commission is not allowed to change the rules after the drawing," the complaint continued. "But the Commission has apparently tried to do so and relied, at least in part, on this ex post facto announcement to continue to refuse to pay Plaintiff her lottery winnings simply because she utilized a lottery ticket courier service to buy the winning ticket."

Celebrate Summer in Style with Classic Crab Imperial

Summer is here, and with it, all the special occasions that call for something a little extra (without totally breaking the bank!). Whether it's a backyard birthday, a beachside bridal shower or just Tuesday on the patio with friends and chilled wine, sometimes you want to serve something that says this moment matters.

Introducing Crab Imperial — a dish so luxurious it practically wears pearls. Born in the coastal kitchens of Maryland in the late 1800s, Crab Imperial is one of the East Coast's most elegant ways to showcase its prized blue crab. This isn't a crab cake. This is tender, sweet crab meat folded into a creamy, savory sauce, tucked into ramekins, topped with a golden breadcrumb crown and baked until bubbly. It's rich, delicate and timeless.

A Few Words About Crab

Now, let's address the crustacean in the room. Real crab can be pricey, and you might be tempted to substitute imitation crab — aka crab with a "k." I get it! I use it in plenty of recipes myself. But not here. This dish is a treat, and you deserve the real thing.

That said, this recipe is a clever way to stretch a pound of crab meat to feed up to eight people. If you need to extend it further, add another egg yolk and a half cup of extra breadcrumbs to bulk it out without sacrificing flavor. And if you do buy imitation crab for other recipes, look for versions made from wild-caught Alaskan pollock — it's the most sustainable option.

CRAB IMPERIAL
Yield: 8 appetizer servings
Total Time: 30 minutes

1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 teaspoon sugar
1 teaspoon Old Bay seasoning + more for garnish
1 teaspoon Italian parsley, finely minced
1 large egg lightly beaten
1/2 teaspoon lemon juice
1 pound (16 ounces) jumbo lump crab meat
1 teaspoon butter, melted
1 tablespoon panko breadcrumb
Lemon wedges, toast points, sliced baguette or crackers for serving

Preheat oven to 350 F.

In a mixing bowl, stir mayonnaise, egg, sugar, Old Bay, lemon juice and parsley together, and blend well. Gently fold crab meat into the sauce, being careful not to break up crab meat any more than absolutely necessary.

Divide portions among the baking dishes of your choice, using ramekins or small casserole dishes. You can make four 6-ounce (practically a meal) servings or eight 3-ounce appetizer servings.

In a small bowl mix the melted butter with the breadcrumbs. Sprinkle this lightly over each portion, then top the crab imperial with a dash of Old Bay.

Bake in 350 F oven for 20 minutes as the tops turn golden brown, or until a thermometer gets an internal reading of 165 degrees to be sure the egg in this recipe is fully cooked.

Optional but highly recommended: Pour a glass of something cold and celebratory. Sparkling wine pairs beautifully, but honestly, even lemonade feels festive with a bite of this indulgent delight.

While Crab Imperial is often served as a luxe appetizer, it can also be the star of a special-occasion meal. Try spooning it over grilled chicken breast or steak for a showstopping entree, or use it as a filling for

mushrooms. Serve it alongside a crisp green salad, seasonal grilled vegetables or a chilled asparagus platter for an elegant summer supper. For brunch, pair smaller portions with poached eggs and toasted English muffins — essentially a Maryland-style Benedict. And don't forget the drinks: Champagne or a buttery chardonnay is classic, but a dry rosé or citrusy mocktail would be just as lovely.

Foxy Bingo Survey Says!

A study of 2,000 adults, 500 of whom sport a mullet, found those who sported the hairstyle enjoyed an average of five nights out a month; while the non-mulletted folk lagged behind with an average of only three. Being a free spirit, somewhat mischievous, and "doing the unexpected" topped a list of attributes those with the 80s-inspired look, believe they have. While those with more conventional cuts were less likely to think of themselves as a fashion-follower, and only seven per cent like to "make an impression" when they're out. A spokesperson for Foxy Bingo, which commissioned the research to launch its pop-up "mullet-only salon" in Newcastle, England said: "It's no surprise to us that those with mullets are having more fun." All of this research and the wacky pop-up were part of a marketing blitz by Foxy Bingo to promote their "anything goes attitude and northern charm."



Cases Dismissed Because of Police Bingo Game

Last month we reported on an investigation into thirteen police officers who were playing a type of bingo while on duty in Bozeman, Montana. According to a press conference, two teams of patrol officers were engaged in a bingo competition, where success in the game hinged on whether they engaged on actions listed on the bingo card with some officers caught playing while on duty. Now, some of the criminal cases that were handled by the officers involved in the game are being dismissed. According to Bozeman Police Chief Jim Veltkamp, in mid-January, 13 officers, including two sergeants, took part in an on-duty game of bingo. Veltkamp explained, "It did look like your standard bingo card. Then they filled in squares on the card with things that they wanted to see happen or have happen in order to check off that box on the bingo card." Veltkamp said the game went on for 12 days before being shut down. During that time, officers involved with the game sent 24 misdemeanor cases to city court and 11 felony cases to the County Attorney's office. After reviewing the cases, Gallatin County Attorney Audrey Cromwell has decided to dismiss four of the pending felony charges and declined to prosecute five others. Cromwell stated, "I made the determination that to best protect the constitutional and due process rights of the defendants, and to ensure fairness of their trials, the cases should be dismissed." Cromwell explained that once a case is dismissed by the court, all hearings are vacated, bond is exonerated, and the case is closed. She acknowledged that this decision was "a tough call."

"Students' Choice" Corn Dip Is a Snack-Attack Hit

When college kids return home for the summer, they spend the first few days catching up on sleep, seeing friends, and eventually dumping out a semester's worth of laundry from bulging duffel bags. But 21-year-old Tommy Bennett had an extra thought on his mind when he landed in Minnesota after his junior year at Pepperdine University in California. Within moments of arriving, he made a dash to the neighborhood market to pick up ingredients for a corn dip recipe that he and four roommates — Sean, Mack, John and Erik — made famous with their classmates. Corn dip!

"I can't live a day without it," he said as he stirred up a taste test for me in his mom's biggest serving bowl. "It's a perfect snack with tortilla chips when friends come by and a good spread on toast and crackers when you need something to tide you over after studying late at night. We always doubled the recipe at school to have plenty to go around. When we ran out after four or five days, we rotated who bought the ingredients. And it only takes 10 minutes to make!" he added.

Not only was I impressed by the simple steps and taste (it gets its kick from the jalapenos), but I was also happily reminded of the pleasure that we adults can experience when learning something new from our kids and their friends.

Here is their easy recipe, which you can make famous in your household this spring and summer. Experiment with it and use it as

a dip for raw vegetables or as a tasty filling with coarsely shredded carrots and sliced sugar snap peas in flour tortilla wraps.

CORN DIP Yields 4 cups

2 (15-ounce) cans Southwest Mexicorn with sweet peppers, drained
1 (4-ounce) can diced roasted green chilies, drained
1 (4-ounce) can diced jalapenos, drained
2 green onions (scallions), finely chopped
3/4 cup light mayonnaise
2/3 cup light sour cream
2 cups sharp cheddar cheese, shredded

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl. Chill, covered, for several hours or overnight to allow flavors to intensify. Serve with corn chips in scoop shapes.

Keeps well in the refrigerator (covered) for four to five days. Stir before serving.

You did not dare take your eyes off your game even though you really wanted to know what was going on. Then I got a Bingo and could look and stretch for a few minutes. There would be a break at the end of the next game. I tried to concentrate on what I was doing, but it was difficult. Deanna stretched her neck also but neither of us could tell what the ruckus was about.

I was thrilled to have a Bingo even if I did have to share it with eight other players. That made my win just over a hundred dollars, which was all right for a start. Deanna said she was jealous—but seemed more interested in what was happening in back of us. At break we both went to investigate what was happening.

It seemed to be a disagreement between two workers, if you can believe it. I have never seen them have even a cross word and here they were sounding as if there was about to be a fist fight. An older worker had just shepherded them into a back room before we could find out much—damn.

Our break was over, and we returned to our seats, not much wiser. Deanna had a win just before the long lunch break. She had to share with other players as well and was not happy about that, but it's what can happen with such a large crowd.

Was This Call on the River a Bit too Optimistic?

In a recent \$3,500 buy-in tournament at the 200/400/400 level, I raised to 1,000 out of my 50,000 stack with the QdJd in the cutoff. Both of the blinds called, the flop fell Kc10c4c, and my opponents checked to me.

In a multi-way pot, it is somewhat likely that someone has a hand they will not fold, like a pair or a flush draw. While you normally want to bet with your decent draws, it is simply too likely someone will call, so I decided to check.

The turn was the Qs and again my opponents checked to me. At this point, when most recreational live players check, I should have the best hand a decent amount of the time. I do not want to allow a club or jack to come on the river that could easily give one of my opponents the best hand.

I bet 1,500 into the 3,400 pot. Looking back, I think a slightly larger bet of around 2,000 would have been better because it would induce my opponents to fold their junky draws that have a lot of equity, such as 9c7s.

Only the small blind, a loose, splashy recreational player, called. The river was the 6c, putting four clubs on the board. To my surprise, the small blind bet 3,500 into the 6,400 pot. This should be a trivially easy fold because I lose to any flush and any pair better than my middle pair, but it is important to think about how my range appears to my opponent.

When I checked behind on the flop, my opponent should assume that I do not have the Ac. If I do not have the nuts, that drastically decreases the number of hands I can easily call with on the river. I made the assumption that my opponent would bet with the Ac on the turn once the flop checked through. I was also not sure if he would value bet with either the Qc or Jc on the river.

You will find that most players will not value bet with marginal flushes in this spot because they will typically only get called when they are beat. Of course, my opponent could be turning a hand better than mine, such as Kd9d, into a bluff. The idea that neither of us has the nut flush made me think that my opponent should be bluffing much more often than normal, hoping to put me in a tough spot with either a weak flush or a one-pair hand.

Given my pot odds, which dictate that I need to have the best hand 25% of the time or more to profit, I decided to call. I am unsure exactly how often I have the best hand, but I thought I would win more than 25% of the time. Luckily for me, my opponent turned over the Js10s for a bluff, awarding me a nice pot.
