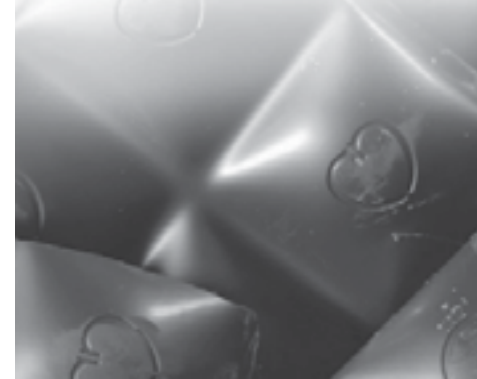

Set cookies on a work surface such as a cutting board. Place cream cheese in a medium-sized mixing bowl. In a microwave-safe dish, melt chips, spoon into cream cheese, and stir until smooth.

Spread the mixture evenly over the cookies. Let kids arrange the fresh fruit and berries in pretty designs on the top. Meanwhile, if you would like a glaze, an adult should melt the jelly in a saucepan. Cool.

Let kids drizzle or lightly brush with a pastry brush over the fruit to glaze the tarts. Or dust over each tart with powdered sugar. Arrange on a serving platter.

Variations:
— Get creative with the presentation and decorate the serving platter, or top the tarts with coconut flakes, sprigs of mint leaves, tiny blooms of edible flowers, or fresh lavender.

— Make a larger quantity of bite-sized tarts using packaged cookies such as gingersnaps.

— Instead of using cookies, make a larger single tart. Press a prepared piecrust from the refrigerated section of your market on the base and sides of a 9-inch tart pan. Prick sides and bottom. Bake according to package directions. Cool. Spread cream cheese mixture on the base, arrange fruit attractively, and brush on the glaze.

Super Squash Dish

Dear Ask Annie,
My husband planted squash for the first time this spring. I now have lots of yellow squash on the way. What can I do with it?

Dear Jordanna,
One of my favorite squash recipes is my Squash Soufflé. I also grow yellow squash. This soufflé is very good. —Annie



Squash Soufflé

2 lbs. fresh yellow squash, peeled and sliced thin
2 medium onions, sliced thin
½ stick butter
2 egg yolks, beaten
2 egg whites, stiffly beaten
¼ cup cracker crumbs
½ cup Pet Milk
¼ cup cracker crumbs (save for topping)
salt, to taste
pepper, to taste
pinch of sugar
paprika

Cook the squash in water until tender. Drain. Cream thoroughly; add egg yolks, cracker crumbs, Pet Milk, salt, pepper and sugar. Mix well. Fold in beaten egg whites and fill an appropriate-sized glass or Pyrex baking dish. Top with additional cracker crumbs. Sprinkle with paprika. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Bake for 20 minutes.

Fresh Fruit Cookie Tarts

Tell your kids that they can be the "King and Queen of Tarts" when they make this gem of a dessert. The fresh fruit ingredients from your local market or fruit stand are luscious and good by themselves, but when they're combined with a cookie base, you'll have a can't-miss finale to a barbecue or outdoor get-together with friends.

These cookie fruit tarts are super simple to assemble and look "tres français," but there's no from-scratch pastry with mini fluted rims that you have to fuss over. Instead, the easy recipe starts with good, large sugar cookies that you purchase at your bakery or grocery store.

FRESH FRUIT COOKIE TARTS
Serves 8

- 8 large sugar cookies, or your favorite plain round cookie
- 8-ounce package of cream cheese
- 1/3 cup white or vanilla chips (find them in the baking section of your store)
- Assorted fresh fruit and berries for toppings such as blueberries, raspberries, strawberries, cherries, and sliced peaches and plums, washed and dried
- 1/4 cup currant jelly or powdered sugar (optional)

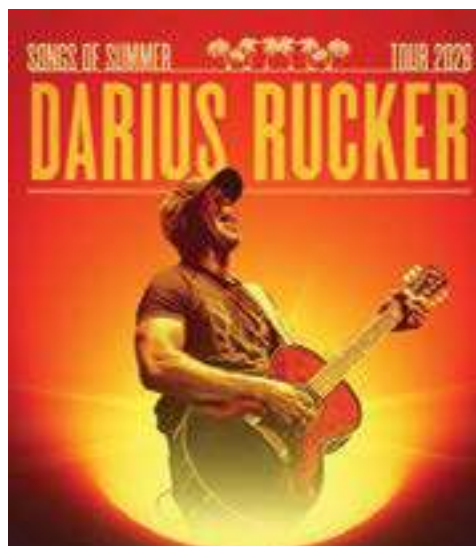

Reid International Ranked
Reid International in Las Vegas was recently ranked the fourth least stressful out of the 20 largest airports in the U.S., making the following revelation an even more impressive feat: according to Airports Council International, the primary global trade association for airport operators, Reid is the fifth busiest airport in the world for the number of aircraft landings and takeoffs; its 586,046 takeoffs and landings to and from 170 destinations in 2025 placed it behind

Chicago's O'Hare, Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson, Dallas Ft. Worth, and Denver. Shanghai at number eight was the busiest internationally. Atlanta ranked first for total passengers at 106.3 million, followed by Dubai at 96 million, and Vegas didn't place anywhere near the top with a mere 40-plus million last year. Total airline passengers worldwide were estimated to be just under 10 billion and the top 10 busiest airports for passengers represented 9% of the total.

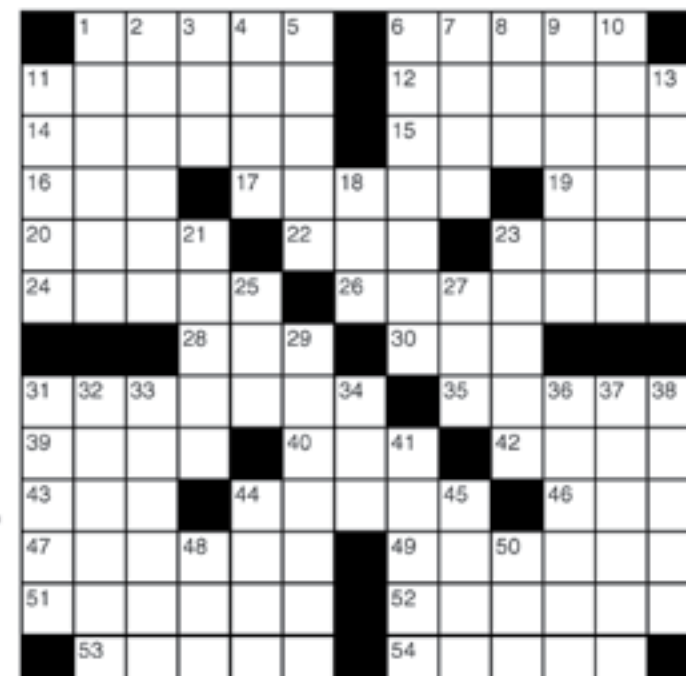
Another Sports-Resort Announced
Another grandiose plan for a resort centered around an arena for the incoming NBA basketball team was announced recently. This one joins a long list of proposals. "Starr Vegas" would be what the developers call an "ecosystem for year-round sports, entertainment, and luxury living" near the intersection of S. Las Vegas Blvd. and W. Starr Ave, roughly two miles south of South Point. The 63-acre site would host a kitchen sink full of attractions and amenities, including a 25,000-seat arena; a 50,000-seat soccer/concert stadium with retractable roof; a 1,000-seat rooftop dome (which looks to us like a venue for watch parties); a cultural and entertainment district complete with theater, comedy club, boxing museum, and Combat Sports Hall of Fame; and hotel, casino, sports book, retail, office, and residential components. The announcement also mentions a new proprietary ticketing system. The developers have long ties to ticketing, sports venues, and Las Vegas real estate and claim to have already secured \$6 billion in funding for the project, which is budgeted at \$10 billion.

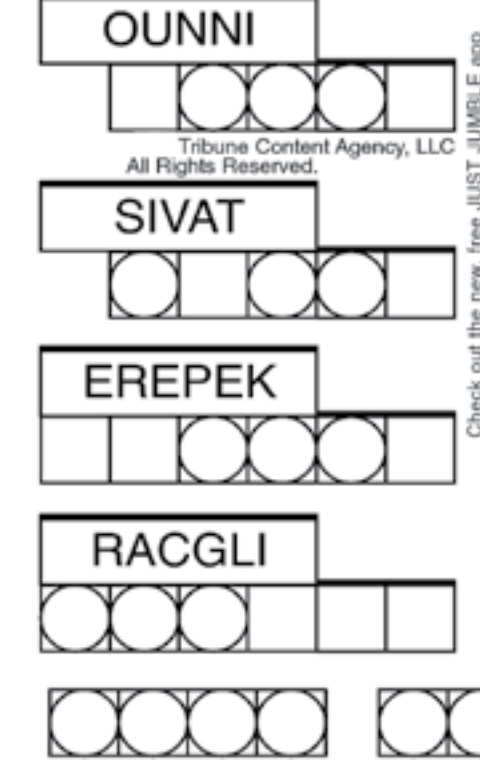

Dear Carolyn,

Arizona strictly regulates technological aids to Bingo, known informally as Bingo machines (different from electronic bingo gambling devices, which function like a slot machine and are illegal).

It does appear from my research that it is legal for bingo halls to require a minimum buy-in in order to purchase the use of a bingo device in Arizona. If you are able to purchase and play all of the same games, meaning that there are not "machine only" games, and they comply with the law that each card face must have equal opportunity of being a winner as any other card face, I can't see that the hall is cheating.

Over the years, we've seen many players weigh in on the use of these devices, many of whom, like you, feel they are unfair. Statistically bingo players who use the devices often have better odds of winning because they can play, and easily monitor, more cards than a player daubing paper, with the added bonus that they won't miss a bingo because they are alerted of a winning card. On the flip side, while the machines have better odds, they are often more expensive to play.

The fact that you feel you can't win, however, might be taking some of the fun out of your favorite game. Perhaps you might, on occasion, play bingo at a different hall—one that does not offer machines. You can meet new folks, support a different organization and maybe, if you're lucky, yell "Bingo!" —Guy

Don't be Afraid to Extract Value to Find Success Playing Poker

By Jonathan Little

One of my students recently played a \$100 buy-in live tournament that illustrates an exploitative play you should make against many players in small stakes poker games. With blinds at 1,000/2,000 with a 2,000 big blind ante with 110,000 effective stacks, our Hero raised with JdJs from first position to 5,000. Everyone folded to the cutoff, a loose, passive player, who three-bet to 17,000.

At this point, because most passive players tend to three-bet with only their best hands and call with their non-premium hands, Hero can be fairly certain his opponent has a premium hand, perhaps 10-10+ and A-Q+. Since the opponent's range is quite strong, Hero should certainly not four-bet, because then, he will only get action when he is crushed or flipping against A-K.

Calling from out of position will lead to some dicey post-flop situations, but it is the best course of action.

Hero called and the flop came 10s8s2h. Hero checked and his opponent bet 14,000 into the 39,000 pot. Although Hero now loses to all of the opponent's pocket pairs, he still beats A-K and A-Q. Since most players will

Low-Cost Smartphone Plans

Dear Savvy Senior,

What are the absolute lowest-cost smartphone plans for seniors who mainly talk and text but need a little cellular data for email and occasional use? I'm currently paying \$40 a month and hoping to cut that down. —Looking to Save

Dear Looking,

You're asking a smart question. Many seniors pay far more for smartphone service than they actually use. If most of your phone activity is calls, texts, email, and light web browsing, there's usually no need to spend \$40 or more a month. The good news: plenty of low-cost carriers now cater to light users who want reliable service without the extra cost.

The cheapest plans today mostly come from mobile virtual network operators (MVNOs) — smaller carriers that lease coverage from major networks like T-Mobile, Verizon, and AT&T. Because they don't run their own towers, MVNOs can offer basic service for a fraction of the cost of major carriers, while still providing nationwide coverage. Here are some of the best options available now.

Cheapest Wireless Plans

According to Consumer Reports, Mint Mobile is a top value among low-cost smartphone plans. For \$15 per month, you get unlimited talk and text plus 5 gigabytes (GB) of data. The catch: you pay for a full year upfront — \$180 plus taxes — but for seniors comfortable paying annually, it's a smart way to lock in savings. Mint runs on T-Mobile's network and works with most unlocked phones.

If you want a similar plan without the upfront commitment, T-Mobile Connect is worth a look. For about \$15 per month, you

continuation-bet this flop with their entire range. Hero should call and see what develops on the turn.

The turn was the 4c, Hero checked, and the opponent checked behind, which brought the 3d on the river. Now, Hero can be somewhat sure that his opponent does not have three of a kind or an overpair because he would have almost certainly continued betting with them on the turn. So, most likely, the opponent has A-K or A-Q. If that is the case, the opponent will usually check behind on the river, awarding Hero the small pot.

Instead of happily collecting the small pot though, Hero should make a bet that the opponent can realistically call. In this situation, a small bet makes a lot of sense, presuming the opponent will rarely (or never) raise as a bluff, which will usually be the case in most small stakes games.

Betting small also has the added benefit of saving money when the opponent happens to have a cautiously played overpair because Hero would have otherwise check-called a larger river bet.

Hero bet 9,000 into the 67,000 pot. The opponent thought for a while and eventually called with AsKs, giving Hero a nice pot. While Hero's 9,000 river bet worked out well, he perhaps left some value on the table. Since the pot was 67,000, Hero probably could have bet 15,000, extracting an additional 6,000 chips.

While winning an extra three big blinds may not sound like a big deal, if you miss out on three big blinds every time you are in situations like this, it will add up to a small fortune over your lifetime as a poker player. That said, many players leave the entire river bet in their opponent's stack, so nice job by my student extracting it.

Canned Salmon: The Pantry Secret for Healthy, Budget-Friendly Meals

Here's a pantry staple I don't write about often enough: canned salmon.

Fresh salmon is one of the healthiest foods you can eat. It's rich in protein and omega-3 fatty acids, and it's wonderfully versatile. The problem, of course, is that fresh salmon can also be expensive, seasonal and sometimes difficult to find, especially if you're trying to buy wild-caught fish instead of farmed.

That's where canned salmon shines. It delivers the same nutritional benefits as fresh salmon at a fraction of the cost, and it's always waiting in the pantry when you need it.

When shopping, take a moment to read the label. Health experts recommend choosing wild-caught Pacific salmon whenever possible. Salmon labeled "wild Alaskan" or "Pacific salmon" is harvested from well-managed fisheries and is a more sustainable choice.

You'll also notice two types of canned salmon on the shelf: boneless-skinless, and the traditional variety that includes skin and soft bones. If you buy salmon with skin and bones, there is one small drawback: namely,

skin and bones. The boneless version is convenient but costs more. The version with bones is economical and just as nutritious.

The bones in canned salmon are pressure-cooked until they become soft and completely edible. In fact, they're an excellent source of calcium. Many people mash them right into the fish and never notice them. If the idea makes you hesitant, you can easily remove the larger pieces before using the salmon.

A clever trick I've used for years is adding a small handful of slivered almonds to recipes made with canned salmon. They add a pleasant texture and completely disguise any remaining bones.

Canned salmon is versatile. Use it in pasta, salads, chowders or sandwiches. In my house, however, our favorite is salmon patties. Crisp on the outside and tender on the inside, they're quick to make and satisfying enough for dinner.

Serve them as burgers on buns, make smaller cakes for appetizers or enjoy them alongside a fresh green salad.

Simple Salmon Patties

Yield: 4 servings

Total Time: 30 minutes

- 1 teaspoon olive oil or avocado oil
- 1/4 cup green onions, sliced
- 1/4 cup red bell pepper, minced
- 1 (14.75-ounce) can pink salmon
- 1/2 cup panko breadcrumbs
- 1 tablespoon slivered almonds, optional
- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- 2 large eggs
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon lemon zest, optional
- 1 teaspoon seafood seasoning (such as Old Bay) or paprika
- olive oil or avocado oil for cooking

Warm 1 teaspoon oil in a skillet over medium-low heat, add the onions and pepper. Saute until just softened.

Meanwhile, place the salmon in a bowl and gently break it apart with a fork. Remove any large pieces of skin or bone if desired. Add breadcrumbs and almonds. Add the softened onion and pepper and stir to combine.

In a small mixing bowl, stir together the mayonnaise, eggs, Dijon mustard, lemon juice, lemon zest and seafood seasoning.

Add the mayo mixture to the salmon and mix until well combined and the mixture holds together. If the mixture is too dry, add mayonnaise. If it's too wet, add breadcrumbs.

Form the mixture into 8 patties and refrigerate for 15 minutes.

Heat a thin layer of oil in a skillet over medium heat. Cook the patties for about 4 to 5 minutes per side, until golden brown and heated through. Serve warm.

Leftover patties can be stored in the refrigerator for up to three days, or frozen for up to three months.

Hillbilly Bingo

In the summer we must go outside into the scorching heat to avoid frostbite from restaurant air conditioning.

—Ms. Know-It-All

Sweet, sweet June with its weddings, picnics, gardens, and flowers in full bloom. Decades ago, in our family, that meant we kids could go barefoot and wear shorts after Memorial Day. Later, as a teacher, it meant a month or two of relaxation before gearing up for another year of molding young minds. My pals and I played hide and seek after dark and chased fireflies in the fields around us. Afterward, I'd go to bed in the upstairs of our farmhouse and sweat profusely even with window fans going full blast. No air conditioning—but my family and I survived.

June is the start of family reunions and get-togethers. I recently learned a cool game to play at these events. It's a variation of bingo called Hillbilly Bingo, who knows why. This version uses standard playing cards instead of bingo balls and cards and each player needs his own deck of cards. Each player shuffles his personal deck and places the top ten cards face up in front of himself.

A designated caller draws cards from a master deck and announces the rank and suit (example: king of spades). A player who has that exact card in his/her face-up pile flips it face down. When a player has only one face-up card left, he/she must shout aloud Uno, meaning one card left, or Ready. Failure to do so means that player must take the next card from his deck and add it faceup to his remaining one. The first player to flip all 10 of his/her cards yells Yeehaw! Or Bingo! or Hot Damn which is my personal favorite and that player wins that round. Card decks are then reshuffled, another ten cards placed face up, and the next round begins with 8-10 rounds being the usual.

Before starting play, each participant contributes a set amount of money to build the pot with the amount depending on the crowd—but is usually five or ten dollars per player; meaning the pot can grow quite large. Before starting play, take half of the collected money for the last round and that will be the jackpot win for the final game of the last round. Divide the rest of the money by the number of games and that amount goes to the other individual round winners. This game can be played for prizes, more or less money to buy in, or just for fun with no money or prizes, but what fun is that says the gambler I am? In some versions, the caller announces the first four cards drawn as wild. If you have any of those cards (regardless of suit), you get to flip them over immediately which speeds up the game. Hillbilly Bingo will never replace the real bingo games we're used to playing, but it does have its own charm, especially if you're looking for something different to generate interaction at a family event. Just remember to alert everyone to bring a deck or two of cards so everyone who wants to participate can play.

Until next month, may Lady Luck blow you kisses as you dance out the door with dollars. Win big. If you try this game, contact me (nlpvzw6172@gmail.com) and let me know how it went. Yeehaw!

When You're Losing

This situation has faced every player that has played blackjack in casinos. You memorize the basic strategy, and yet, here you sit, losing hand after hand. You're playing "by the book" but no matter what cards you get, the dealer somehow manages to beat you. So, what should you do?

This is, regrettably, a condition faced by all blackjack players at some time or another. Unfortunately, too many players that find themselves in this dilemma do some crazy things, which they often regret afterwards such as:

- Increasing their bets believing they are due to win the next hand and recoup their losses.
- Switching to playing two hands to change the "flow of the cards."

- Changing their playing strategy thinking it will change their luck.
- Blaming the dealer or fellow players for their losses.

Borrowing more cash (usually from an ATM machine) to keep playing, because their luck is bound to change.

Trust me when I say that doing any of the above will not change your luck. In fact, "steaming" by betting more can put you into a deeper financial hole and it is one of the cardinal sins of gambling.

Let's look at the reality of playing blackjack to see why we can get beat on any given day even though we play with perfect strategy. First off, the math says you will only win 48% of your hands and lose 52% than vice versa (this disregards the 9% of the hands that push). So, on average, you have less than a 50% chance of winning any hand in blackjack.

Mathematicians can calculate the range of how much we can expect to win or lose for any average bet and number of hands played in blackjack. For example, if you bet \$5 a hand and play about 200 hands of blackjack (about 2 to 3 hours) with perfect basic strategy, you can expect that in 95% of your playing sessions, you will wind up either ahead up to \$164, or behind up to \$176 (that's a spread from -\$176 to +\$164). Notice that the spread is skewed more to the losing side (-\$176) than to the winning side (+\$164) because even with basic strategy, the casino has the edge.

So, what's my point? The game of blackjack has a variance associated with it, which means we can sometimes wind up losing more hands in a row than we'd like

through no fault of our own. This is the nature of the game. We don't like it, but there isn't much we can do about it.

Here is the best advice I can offer recreational players when you are losing hand after hand. Hopefully you have set a session loss limit and when you reach that loss limit, you've got to quit playing and take a break (if it's a day trip, you should head home). You need some quiet time to think about what just happened, and ask yourself whether you played accurately, because if you are not sure, that could be a major factor as to why you lost. There are several good blackjack software training programs that keep track of your playing accuracy and alert you when you make a playing mistake (it also tells you what the right play is). The point is, be sure you are playing accurately.

The next thing to consider is whether or not there were any distractions while you were playing that could have caused you to make playing mistakes. My wife, for example, is an excellent blackjack player but she gets upset when a fellow player makes a dumb play. She never says anything to the player, but it affects her emotionally and it could cause her to lose concentration and misplay her hand. Perhaps a fellow player becomes obnoxious, or the dealer is a grouch—any number of factors could cause you to lose your focus when you play. My advice if this happens is to get off that table and play at another table where you feel more comfortable and can concentrate.

The most important thing to keep in mind when you find yourself losing hand after hand through no fault of your own is to keep your cool and understand these losing

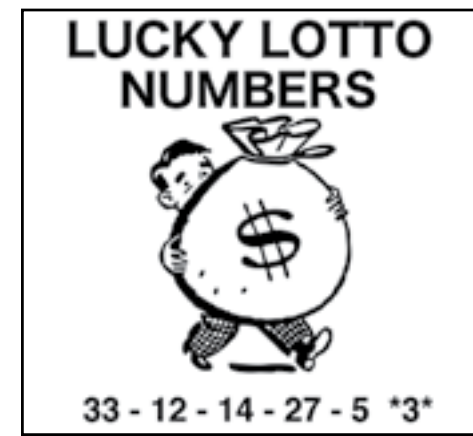
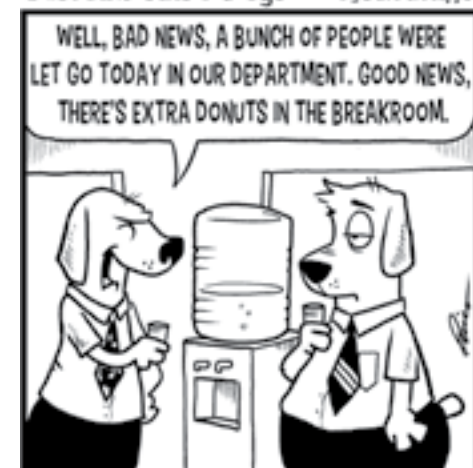

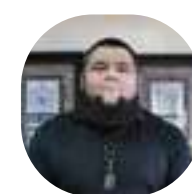

Outside of limiting your salt intake, avoiding potassium and phosphates, and hydrating properly, is there anything that one can undertake to stop or reverse declining kidney function? —*H.M.*

ANSWER: The answer depends on the underlying reason for the chronic kidney disease (CKD) and how far the disease has progressed. Limiting sodium, potassium and phosphates is good general advice for most people with CKD. It's also important to avoid drugs that stress the kidney. The most important classes of drugs to avoid are anti-inflammatory drugs (like ibuprofen and naproxen) and the many prescription drugs in the NSAID class.

Medical procedures with dye should be avoided if possible, and some antibiotics are problematic. So, it's important for all your doctors to know about your kidney disease.

Blood pressure control is important for everyone with CKD. Some medicines for high blood pressure (such as ACE inhibitors and angiotensin receptor blockers) are more protective of the kidney than others, so it's worth asking your regular doctor or kidney specialist if your medicines are optimal. People with diabetes should also keep their blood sugar in the optimal range as much as possible.

For people with CKD and high levels of protein in their urine, the use of SGLT2 inhibitors (such as dapagliflozin or empagliflozin) has been proven to slow the progression of kidney disease by almost 30%. People with CKD who smoke should stop. Modest protein restriction remains controversial, but I advise it for my patients with CKD.

Protecting Your Benefits

On a recent National Slam the Scam Day for 2026, the VA stepped up, along with other federal agencies, with an array of information to keep veterans safe from scams and fraud. Thieves don't just work one day per year, however. We need to stay vigilant all year long to protect our benefits and personal information from getting to the scammers.

Why do they want us? Because we have income and benefits.

How do they approach us? Phone calls, emails, text messages, social media, phishing, impersonation, fake charities — you name it, the crooks have thought of it as a way to get to us.

If you're approached, whether on the phone or in email, the more urgent the problem, the more likely it's a scam. A scammer might pretend to be from the VA and try to claim there's something wrong with your benefits — and that you need to hand over your personal information so they can "fix" the problem. They might want your bank account access info or password, your Social Security number, your date of birth. The answer is no.

Don't do a direct deposit into another person's account — even if it's a relative! If you need a fiduciary situation (where someone helps you with finances), have that person go through the accreditation process and be authorized to assist you. You're protected that way.

If you're told you need to hand over a fee to get claims assistance from the VA or to apply for increased benefits, it's fraud. Invest in a shredder and use it to cut up not only VA documents with personal information on them, but any documents, even when you put out the trash.

If someone calls and claims to be from the VA and asks you to pay for something with a gift card or bitcoin, feel free to laugh as you hang up the phone. It's an impostor. Report it to the VA at 800-827-1000.
