Q. What are the most popular casino slots games this year?

A. Here's a roundup of player favorites:

* Buffalo Series (Aristocrat): The Buffalo brand remains the most recognizable on casino floors. Buffalo Link is highly sought after for its iconic audio cues and "hold and spin" bonus.

* Wheel of Fortune (IGT): A perennial favorite based on the famous game show, featuring various versions like Power Wedges that offer massive progressive jackpots and the signature physical bonus wheel.

* Huff n' Puff Series (Light & Wonder): Titles like Huff n' Even More Puff are extremely popular due to their high-energy bonus rounds, specifically the "Hat Bonus" where players build mansions for large payouts.

* Dragon Link / Lightning Link (Aristocrat): These games are staples in physical casinos, known for popularizing the "Hold & Spin" mechanic that has since been widely imitated.

* Super Bowl Jackpots (Aristocrat): A newer standout that allows players to customize the slot theme with their favorite NFL team, featuring iconic game footage and high-intensity "two-minute drill" bonus rounds.

* Dancing Drums (Light & Wonder): Recognized for its Asian-inspired theme and the "Fu Fly" jackpot feature, which allows players to pick for one of four progressive jackpots.

Popular Themes and Mechanics

* Progressive Jackpots: Players prioritize games with large, multi-tiered jackpots like Mo' Mo' Mo' Mummy.

* Hold & Spin: This mechanic, found in games like Dollar Storm and Pinball, remains a primary driver of player engagement in 2026.

* Immersive Brands: High-production slots based on popular culture, such as Frankenstein or licensed movie/TV themes, are frequent choices for casual players.

AI-assisted Scams against Seniors

It's not that scammers are getting smarter, but they have a new tool now: AI, artificial intelligence. For our own protection, we need to learn about AI and how to avoid becoming a victim of fraud.

If you've posted any pictures on social media, take them down. Make it your task for January to remove any photos you've put up, especially if — heaven forbid — there are snaps of your children and grandchildren.

If you routinely attach photos in emails to friends and family, and if they tend to post those on their own social media, ask them to remove the pictures. If they don't comply, stop sending them photos. I know, that's harsh. But you have to protect yourself and those dear to you.

Photos are the tip of the iceberg. Consider what scammers can do with innocent information about a vacation you took. They can personalize their scam against you and pretend to have met you on that trip. If you've posted the names of family members, or even the name of your dog, they can pretend to actually know you. It will sound so innocent if they then ask for your home address or the correct spelling of your name so they can send you a souvenir.

It gets worse: Scammers can clone voice samples they find online. If you've posted a video of a teen grandchild, scammers can convert that into a fake video call wherein the child appears to be upset and asks for help, which is another version of the grandparent scam.

One of the best sites I've found to learn about AI scams is McAfee's Guide to Deepfake Scams and AI Voice Spoofing at www.mcafee.com/learn/a-guide-to-deepfake-scams-and-ai-voice-spoofing. Also go online and search for "how scammers use AI against seniors."

GRAMMY-award winning trio Los Lonely Boys to perform at Boulder Station

LAS VEGAS – February 17, 2026 – GRAMMY-award winning trio Los Lonely Boys are bringing their "Texican Rock & Roll" to Las Vegas for a performance at The Railhead at Boulder Station on Saturday, July 11, 2026 at 8 p.m. Tickets start at \$32.50 plus applicable fees and go on sale Friday, February 20, 2026 at 10 a.m.

For Los Lonely Boys—brothers Henry, Jojo, and Ringo Garza—family has always been at the heart of their music. After years of touring, the trio took a break in 2019 to focus on their families, returning to the road in 2022 reinvigorated and even opening for The Who.

Hailing from San Angelo, Texas, the Garzas created their own bluesy "Texican rock & roll" sound and turned it into a global sensation. Their breakthrough came when Willie Nelson's nephew discovered their demo; Willie soon booked them for Farm Aid and recorded with them at his studio. Their 2003 debut album, Los Lonely Boys, re-released by Epic, featured the No. 1 hit "Heaven," which earned them a Grammy and spent 76 weeks on the Billboard Top 200, selling over two million copies.

They've collaborated with legends like Carlos Santana and Willie Nelson, played iconic venues, and supported global causes. Their journey, chronicled in the documentary Cottonfields and Crossroads, has seen both triumph and hardship, most notably Henry's serious stage accident in 2013, which led the band to refocus on what matters most: family and music.

Now back in stride, Los Lonely Boys continue to write, record, and tour with renewed passion. Their 2024 release, Resurrection (BMG), blends their signature Texican rock & roll with elements of soul and roots music, earning critical acclaim and energizing live audiences. More than two decades after their debut, they remain a vital force in music, proving their story is still unfolding.

His credentials include a doctorate in clinical psychology from Stanford University, which led him to becoming a coach to clients who seek his expertise all over the world. Now you can learn how to apply his strategies for free in his weekly podcast. Topics include "When Self-Confidence Isn't Enough," "No More Awkward Conversations," and "Stop Fearing Others' Feelings." Learn how to gain confidence with public speaking, sales presentations and even dating. (SocialConfidenceCenter.com)

The Social Anxiety Club — Claire Eastham and Ed Barton once struggled with social anxiety just like their listeners. Be sure to listen to Episode 10 as these expert coaches share how they were once in your shoes, how they struggled with social anxiety, and which turning points helped them to overcome this mental paralysis. In Episode 9, learn how "social anxiety often doesn't travel alone," meaning that hidden layers of neurodivergence, including ADHD and OCD, can weave a "tangled mess" in your brain. They state: "If you've ever thought 'there's more going on here,' you're probably right." (TheSocialAnxietyCoach.com)

The Calm Living Blueprint — This podcast originally aired from 2015-2017 but had been rereleased in 2025. The lessons are still relevant today. Each episode is roughly 20 minutes, packed full of wisdom, and summarized in bullet-point format for easy referral long after you've finished an episode. Learn how "the actions of social confidence come first... the feelings of social confidence come later" and how "negative thoughts are normal." You shouldn't fight them; you should "defuse from them" instead. In the episode titled "How to Calm Anxiety with Food," learn how long-term alcohol use can reduce the levels of critical nutrients that are needed for brain function. (CandiceEsposito.com)

Fruit Cocktail Cake

1 ½ cups flour (regular not self-rising)
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 can fruit cocktail (15 oz.)
14 ounces fruit juice (orange or pineapple)
1 large egg
½ cup chopped pecans
½ cup brown sugar
Whipped cream

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Using a large bowl, blend the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Add the fruit cocktail, fruit juice and egg. Stir all ingredients until well blended. Pour into a 9- by 13-inch pan. Spread the pecans and brown sugar over the top of the cake. Bake for 45 minutes. Top with whipped cream.

LAS VEGAS – January 26, 2026 – GRAMMY Award-nominated, Platinum-certified country music superstar Cole Swindell is returning to Las Vegas for a special performance at the Sandbar Stage at Red Rock Resort Saturday, July 18, 2026 at 8 p.m. Located poolside at Red Rock Resort, the Sandbar stage is the perfect destination for a concert experience under the stars. Tickets start at \$65 plus taxes and fees and go on sale Friday, January 30, 2026 at 10 a.m.

Country music superstar Cole Swindell released his fourth studio album, *Stereotype*, to massive success. The project charted three back-to-back, Platinum-certified, multi-week No. 1 hits: "Single Saturday Night," "Never Say Never" (with Lainey Wilson) and, most recently, his five-week chart topper "She Had Me At Heads Carolina" has garnered three ACM Awards for Single of the Year and Song of the Year (as songwriter and artist) and an iHeart Music Award for Country Song of the Year. In 2022 Swindell spent a total of 27 weeks in the Top 5 of the country singles chart with "Never Say Never" (8 weeks) and "She Had Me At Heads Carolina" (21 weeks). He released a special duet remix of his smash "She Had Me At Heads Carolina" featuring Jo Dee Messina which garnered an ACM Award nomination for Musical Event of the Year and is included on his new deluxe album *Stereotype Broken*, which also includes his current rising single "Drinkaby." In the 10 years since his debut on Warner Music Nashville, Swindell has racked up an impressive 12 No. 1 singles as an artist – 13 as a songwriter – as well as 12 certified Platinum singles (one single at 3x Platinum and four at 2x Platinum), a Platinum-certified debut album (Cole Swindell), a Platinum-certified sophomore effort (You Should Be Here) and a Gold-certified third entry (All Of It). The Georgia hitmaker has over 5.2 BILLION global career streams. His massive, GRAMMY-nominated hit "Break Up In The End" was named the 2019 NSAI Song of the Year. Swindell earned two nominations (Musical Event of the Year and Music Video of the Year) for "Never Say Never" at the 56th CMA Awards. Swindell officially became a headliner on his own in 2018 with his Reason To Drink Tours, and his 2022 Back Down To The Bar Tour. He joined Thomas Rhett on the Home Team Tour last summer 2023 and again headlined last fall on his Twelve Tour.

Irish Bingo

Hey, if it bothers you that I'm not wearing green, just pin a twenty-dollar bill to my shirt. -Crabby Maxine

Best of luck to you. Go n-eiri leat, as the Irish might say. You've probably heard St. Patrick drove snakes out of Ireland? Surprise, there have never been snakes in Ireland or signs of snakes in the country's fossil record. Water has surrounded Ireland since the last glacial period and before that, the region was covered in ice and too cold for reptiles. My husband thinks Ireland would be a great place to live as he hates snakes. Once my father and he went for a walk behind my parents' farmhouse. Not ten minutes later, I heard both screaming and laughter. They had encountered a small garter snake and that was it for Robert. He ran lickety-split back towards the yard yelling killer snake at jet engine decibels. Dad and I laughed till tears ran down our cheeks. Robert didn't appreciate our humor. My loveable husband of Irish descent always wears orange on March 17th to honor his Protestant heritage; not green, which signifies Catholic heritage. Surprise, he and many others don't know that in 1783 blue was designated as Ireland's official color because St. Patrick was usually depicted wearing blue.







Dear Guy,

I have had an amazing run of good luck at Bingo recently. Unfortunately, I think it has caused a little friction between me and my Bingo buddies.

At first I was all "Woo-hoo!" and "Eat my dust!" when I won two pots in one night. They laughed and were pretty cool about it. Then a couple weeks later I won a big pull tab and split another pot. I did my "Woo-hoo!" thing again, but this time they all kind of just half smiled and didn't say too much.

So now I'm stumped. Are they mad because I made too big of a deal about winning? Are they jealous because I won and they didn't? Shouldn't I be able to be as excited as I want to when I win at Bingo? Or am I supposed to be all ho-hum and pretend like it's no big deal?

Dear Big Bucks,

It's a tricky business when you hit a winning streak at Bingo and your buddies have to sit there and watch it happen. If these guys are truly buddies, then they should be happy you're winning. If they act otherwise, it's either because they may not be the friends you thought they were, or—and I'm leaning toward this second observation as the right one—you may have celebrated your winnings just a little too forcefully and

ticked them off.

Did you simply act happy at your good fortune, or did you rub their noses in it? Was it really just a generic "Woo-hoo!" or was it more of a "Woo-hoo, check it out losers, I rule and you drool!" If the latter was the case, then what you did was squander their opportunity to be happy for you by making them annoyed by your behavior. Put simply, you were a poor winner.

In a group competition like Bingo, where there is typically only one winner, it's very important to be gracious when you win. Remember, in the process of your winning, 150 other people lost.

Of course, it's OK to be excited—you know how funny it is to watch someone lose control of themselves and scream or laugh or do their version of the happy dance when something exciting happens to them. But you should also know how annoying it is when someone turns a win into some kind of victory and everyone else's defeat. I believe the phrase you used was "Eat my dust." You're basically kicking dirt in their faces and expecting them to enjoy it. Not gonna happen.

And so, Big Bucks, my advice is to enjoy your winning streak, and encourage your Bingo buddies to enjoy it WITH you, by letting them be part of the excitement of your win and not victims of it.

Sure, they're going to be a little jealous. Heck, the whole Bingo hall is. Be joyful but try not to make their envy any worse. —Guy

Chair Yoga Beneficial for Older Adults

Dear Savvy Senior,

I've been hearing a lot about chair yoga lately. My New Year's resolution is to improve my health and get moving again, but I have trouble getting down on the floor. What can you tell me about this type of yoga?

—Arthritis Abby

Dear Abby,

If you're looking for a safe way to get active again but find traditional exercise routines difficult, chair yoga may be the perfect fit.

Chair yoga is a gentle form of yoga that's done either sitting on a chair or using the chair for support while standing. It adapts traditional yoga poses so they're accessible to people who may have limited mobility, balance issues, or difficulty getting down on the floor.

This practice helps improve flexibility, strength, and balance, boosts circulation and mobility, and promotes relaxation while reducing stress. This makes it an effective and safe way to stay active and support overall well-being at any age.

A typical chair yoga session begins with simple seated postures, such as gentle twists, stretches for the arms and legs, or movements that open the hips and shoulders. These exercises loosen stiff joints, improve posture, and increase flexibility in areas of the body that often become tight with age.

It can also include standing poses like modified lunges or gentle balance work, with the chair always nearby for stability. Breathing exercises are often incorporated throughout the practice, encouraging participants to slow down, deepen their breath, and cultivate a sense of calm. Sessions usually end with a short period of guided relaxation or meditation, leaving participants refreshed and grounded.

How to Get Started

To get started, you just need a sturdy chair without wheels and preferably without arms, and some comfortable clothes. The goal with chair yoga is to stretch, not cause pain: go only as far as feels comfortable and don't push beyond your limits.

If possible, consider joining a local chair yoga class. Many local senior centers, YMCAs, and community recreation centers offer chair yoga as part of their wellness or fitness programs. Some yoga studios and gyms may offer gentle yoga or chair yoga too. And if you're enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan, you may be able to access classes for free through SilverSneakers.com.

If attending an in-person class isn't an option, you can also practice chair yoga at home. There are chair yoga apps and many videos you can access on YouTube to guide you through a routine.

Chair Exercise Options

As an alternative to chair yoga, there are chair exercises you can add to your routine that can help improve strength and balance, reduce joint pain and prevent falls.

To execute some of these exercises, you'll need some resistance equipment like light dumbbells, water bottles, soup cans or resistance bands.

* Sit-to-stand: For this exercise, sit at the edge of the chair, feet hip-width apart. Stand up without using your hands, then slowly sit back down. Use hands lightly on the chair or use a walker or cane if needed for support.

* Seated marches: Sit tall and alternate lifting one knee at a time toward your chest.

* Seated bicep curls: With elbows tucked in, curl weights towards shoulders, then lower with control.

* Seated overhead press: Press weights overhead from shoulder height, then slowly lower.

* Seated leg extensions: Extend one leg straight out and hold for 2-3 seconds, then lower and repeat.

* Heel raises: Lift heels off the floor, pause, and lower back down.

For noticeable benefits, these exercises should be performed at least three days a week, doing three sets of 8 to 12 repetitions. Discover how chair yoga can help improve flexibility, strength, balance, circulation and mobility, all from a safe seated position.

Yield: 4 servings
Total Time: 40 minutes

- 4 large eggs, hard- or soft-boiled
- 1 to 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 cups frozen mixed vegetables
- 3 cups cooked rice or other grains (brown rice, barley, farro or quinoa)
- 3 cups cooked beans or lentils (about 2 15-ounce cans), drained and rinsed
- 1/2 teaspoon salt, plus more to taste
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- Optional Toppings:
 - A pinch of garlic powder, cumin or smoked paprika
 - Plain yogurt or sour cream
 - Lemon wedges or a splash of vinegar
 - Fresh or dried herbs

Place eggs in a single layer in a saucepan and cover with cold water by 1 inch. Bring to boiling, then cover and remove from heat. Let sit 6 minutes for soft-set yolks or 10-12

minutes for hard-boiled. Drain and transfer to cold water to stop cooking. Peel when cool.

Meanwhile, heat the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the vegetables and cook until tender, 5 to 8 minutes. Stir in the rice and beans and season with salt and pepper. Cook until everything is heated through.

Divide the mixture among four bowls. Top each serving with an egg and finish with any optional toppings you like.

This is the kind of flexible, affordable meal that adapts to what you have and keeps you happily full.

Bob calls for our local Bingo about once a month. Recently, he brought his four-year-old son along and he entertained us throughout the evening. The balls bouncing in a glass-fronted container fascinated him. He helped his daddy call and was pleased with himself that he knew the numbers.

And best of all, he came to our table and made friends.

"I can play Bingo," he said. "I know my numbers."

"Do you know what a Bingo is?" asked Kate.

"It's just a line, isn't it?"

"Sometimes," said Kate, "and sometimes it is in a different shape. I could help you."

"Okay," said the child, but as soon as the balls started bouncing, he was off to watch them, giggling with pleasure.

"I think he's a little young," I said.

"I don't know," said Kate. "Let's try him out on something simple. How about the Bonanza?"

"Might be okay," I said. "That will be a simple blackout. He can play one of mine."

We arranged him at the table with a Bonanza card. This time the bouncing balls did not call him away as a different machine



Common Craps Bets: Part I

Craps is the fastest and one of the most exciting casino games, with over fifty bets on the layout. Below I'll explain two common bets, the Pass Line and the Come, and next month we'll look at three more.

Pass Line

This is by far the most common bet made in craps. It is also known as a "line bet." When the dice pass to a new shooter, players wagering on the pass line are hoping that the shooter will win. This occurs if the shooter:

- Rolls a 7 or 11 on the first roll (known as the come-out roll).
- Establishes a point by rolling a 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10 on the come-out roll, and then rolls the point number again before a seven.

Pass-line bets lose when the shooter:

- Rolls a 2, 3, or 12 (craps numbers) on the come-out roll.
- After establishing a point number on the come-out roll, rolls a 7 before rolling the point number. (The latter is known as "sevening out.")

What determines if a craps bet is good or not depends on the house edge and average cost per hour. The house edge is a percentage of each bet you make that the casino expects to win. In the case of the pass line bet, the house edge is 1.41%. The latter occurs because when you make a pass line bet, you



Q: What ever happened to Mickey Rourke? He appeared to be making a comeback in the movie where he played a wrestler, but I haven't seen him in anything since. — D.S.

A: It's hard to believe, but Mickey Rourke is now 73 years old. However, his career actually isn't slowing down. can expect to win 49.3 percent and lose 50.7 percent of the time. In other words, the rules favor the casino winning more bets than the player, which creates its advantage.

Another way to evaluate the "worth" of a craps bet is its cost per hour. In a well-managed craps table, the dice will roll about 100 times per hour. The number of decisions that occur on the pass line is 30 per hour on average. Assuming a player makes a \$5 pass line wager, the cost per hour is \$5 times 1.41% times 30 = \$2 (rounded).

Tip: Making a pass-line bet is a smart bet to make.

Come Bet

A come bet is similar to the pass-line bet except you make it after the shooter establishes a point number on the come-out roll. The come bet has the same win/lose rules as the pass line, meaning it wins if the shooter throws a 7 or 11 on the first roll after the come bet is made and loses if a 2, 3, or 12 are rolled.


If instead, the shooter throws 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, or 10, it wins if the number is rolled again before a seven appears and loses if the shooter throws a 7 before the number.

The house edge for a come bet is the same as the pass line: 1.41%. The cost per hour is also the same: \$2 (rounded) for a \$5 come bet.

Tip: Making a come bet is a smart bet to make.

Use the Correct Poker Bet Size When Playing "No-Limit" Texas Hold'Em

A common mistake many recreational no-limit hold'em players make is regularly choosing the incorrect bet size. The game is called "no-limit" for a reason! If you consistently use the same bet size in relation to the pot in all or most situations, you are certainly leaving money on the table.

The most common bet size used by many players is a bet of roughly half of the size of the pot. If the pot is \$10, they bet \$5, while the optimal bet may actually be \$3, \$8, or \$15 (or some other amount), depending on the situation.

For example, suppose in a \$200 buy-in tournament, you raise from middle position to 500 at 100/200/200 with the AdKd and only the player in the big blind calls. If the flop comes Kh7s2d, you should use a small bet because pretty much no matter what your opponent has, he is in terrible shape. Also notice that you are not susceptible to being outdrawn too often.

It is also somewhat difficult for your opponent to have a strong hand that can call large bets on the flop, turn, and river. So, in this situation, you should bet small, 300 into the 1,300 pot. While there may not seem to be much of a difference between a 300 and 600 bet, you will find your opponent calls much more often when facing the smaller bet size, allowing them to make mistakes on the turn and river.

If instead the flop came KhQs8s, you should bet much larger, say 1,100 into the 1,300 pot. On this board, your top pair is quite vulnerable. Any Q, J, 10, 9, 8, or spade could easily improve your opponent to the best hand, and other random cards may also be bad when they give your opponent a disguised two pair. It is also reasonably likely that your opponent has a decently strong hand that can call a large bet, like a King, Queen, or draw.

As a quick tip, when the board contains a flush and/or straight draw but no flush or straight yet, you should tend to bet on the larger side with all your hands that want to bet. You should bet smaller when the board is either very coordinated — when there is already a straight or flush possible — or totally uncoordinated (such as K-7-2).

Bet sizing is by far the most difficult aspect of no-limit hold'em. Next time you are playing, be sure to constantly ask yourself, "What do I want my bet to accomplish, and does it do that?" You will find that generic half-pot bets simply do not get the job done.

"I'd like to make a toast!" said my friend at a happy family celebration. Without missing a beat, her nephew burst out, "Don't we need to get the toaster first?"

With all the toasting to 2026, I thought that I'd get literal and stretch the meaning, just like that spontaneous child, and welcome this new year with two recipes using toast. So, "here's a toast to toast!"

AVOCADO TOAST

I keep a stash of avocados in different stages of ripeness on my kitchen counter, never knowing when I'll need one to slice on a bed of fresh greens or mash, season and spread on toast for a tasty morning energy boost. I've been making the latter for years, so no wonder I was surprised while whiling away time on Instagram to find that avocado toast is "on trend," with multiple ways to enjoy it.

Here's how to prepare "Avocado Toast" for two: Peel and pit a ripe avocado. Mash in a bowl with a fork, leaving some chunks. Add a pinch of sea salt and juice from half of a lemon.

Toast two slices of your favorite bread. Spread half of the mixture on each slice, and garnish with some red pepper flakes and a drizzle of good olive oil (optional).

Cook's Tips: Get creative by topping the spread mixture with chopped, cooked bacon, goat cheese, salsa, and crushed tortilla chips — or cracked pepper, sliced cherry tomatoes, and basil.

EGG IN A HOLE

Create memorable family traditions with your kids and grandkids, starting at breakfast with this whimsical presentation of eggs and toast. Some families call it "Toad in the Hole" or "Bird in a Nest" — the list goes on. It's really nothing more than an egg cooked in the cut-out center of a piece of pan-made toast, but it's the off-kilter presentation that fancies it up.

Here's how to make one "Egg in a Hole": Use a 2-inch circle biscuit cutter or a similar sized metal cookie cutter to cut out the center of a slice of bread.

In a well-buttered pan, toast one side of the slice and cut-out piece for about 1 1/2 minutes. Flip. Add more butter to the pan.

Crack egg in the open center of the slice. Cover pan and cook slowly until whites are set and yolk thickens, about 3 1/2 to 4 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Serve with the toasted cutout. Pair with bacon or sausage.

Keeping Tabs on Tabs

Dear Aunt Bingo.

One of our local Bingo halls has started not showing what prizes are still available for pull tabs, and for coin and 13 boards they are not showing how many winning numbers have been signed up for. I understand that they are trying to get people to buy tickets even if there is only one prize remaining, but I don't think it's right to hide that information, as I think anyone buying those tickets should have an idea of their odds of winning when they purchase tickets. Is there anything in the rules that requires them to disclose this information? This one hall is the only place that does this. I have stopped buying them because I may be purchasing a ticket that has absolutely no chance of winning.

Dear MMR,

You are not the first player to voice such a concern. And I have sat in more than a few Bingo halls with players grumbling that the management refuses to introduce a new pull-tab series until a major portion of an old series has been sold—regardless of how few prizes remain.

Between you and me, I kind of keep an eye on it myself, and if a series seems to be played out, I'll stop buying until a new series begins. That said, I've been skunked a couple of times by not buying into pull tab series I thought were done, only to see a \$1,000 prize go to someone else. That hurt!

I'm glad you appreciate that most halls are selling these pull tabs to make money for charity, and of course would like to sell as many as possible before starting a new series. I'm afraid I do not know what the specific laws are governing sale of pull tabs as they vary from state to state; I do know that sellers are generally required to track wins and mark off the prizes as they are won on the flare (poster) for the game, particularly of prizes over \$20; and that each state has regulations in places as to when a series can be pulled.

But I suspect that all the hall is really doing is trying to do its best to make as much money as possible from each series. (Readers: feel free to share your thoughts on this topic.) —Aunt Bingo

Big Win after Sad Loss

Marjory Rittman, a resident of West Des Moines, wasn't doing anything out of the ordinary on that Saturday last November—she was simply carrying on a tradition she had with her husband, Dale, who had died eight months prior. For years, the couple spent their Saturday nights playing crossword scratch games, often telling each other that they were “going to hit the big one.” Marjory told Iowa Lottery officials. She'd spent a recent snowy Saturday evening playing the \$100,000 Mega Crossword scratch game when she was shocked to discover she'd won the top prize. Marjory went into Iowa Lottery's headquarters the following Monday to claim her prize. “We were always waiting for that big one to come through, and it finally did.” She added of her husband Dale, “This is maybe a sign and a gift from him.” Marjory told the Iowa Lottery she intends to invest most of the prize money into a retirement fund. But, she added, she's allowing herself a few treats and splurges, like new furniture.

Trillion-to-1 Odds


A couple has won an over \$1 million lottery prize for the second time in just over seven years. Richard Davies, 49, and Faye Stevenson-Davies, 43, won their first \$1.3 million (£1 million) through the EuroMillions Millionaire Maker in June 2018, according to *The Guardian* and the BBC. The couple, who are from mid Wales, won for the second time in November of 2026. The odds of the couple hitting the prize again were more than 24 trillion to one. Faye said she and Richard “always believed winning was possible,” according to ITV. “We knew the odds of it happening again were outrageous, but we're proof that if you believe, anything is possible,” Faye explained.

Richard said the couple's second lottery win occurred following “a series of four consecutive Lotto draws,” according to *The Guardian* and the BBC. “When you match two numbers in the Lotto draw, you automatically win a Lucky Dip for the next game,” Richard explained, “and that's what's happened to us.” Both Richard and Faye have been focused on giving back to their community following their lottery victories. Richard, a former hairdresser, volunteers at a homeless shelter in Cardiff, which receives funding through the National Lottery, and helps friends as a delivery driver. Faye, a former nurse, volunteers as a cook at Cegin

Hedyn community kitchen in Camarthen while providing mental health counseling to local organizations. “I feel blessed every day to be doing something so meaningful thanks to that first bit of luck, and I'm not going to abandon my clients with the second bit,” Faye said, according to ITV. Richard said he and Faye “genuinely have no idea” what they will do with their latest winnings. “We may have believed, doesn't mean we had a plan!” Richard quipped to ITV. “The first time around we gifted people cars, we donated a minibus to the local rugby team, and did our best to help friends and family, it was all new and it was amazing to be able to make a difference.” He added, “This time, who knows, we'll take our time and enjoy the moment.”

Cancer-Free and a Winner

A Rhode Island woman recently hit it big in the local lottery—just one month after she was officially declared cancer-free by her doctors. Melissa Bourassa of West Warwick was playing Keno at a local restaurant called JJ's Café when she won the \$12,000 jackpot, per the Rhode Island Lottery. “I said, ‘Oh my God, you guys, I just won \$12,000!’” Bourassa recalled while speaking to local news outlet WPRI 12. “They go, ‘Poor thing. She can't count zeros.’ Nobody believed me, I swear to God. So, I showed them all the picture, and they go, ‘You've got to be kidding me! You won!’” Bourassa went on to say that this was her second piece of good news in a span of weeks. She was diagnosed with breast cancer during the pandemic, and her doctor recently declared her five years cancer-free. Bourassa—who works at JJ's as an employee—said the staff held fundraisers to help her pay her bills when she was too sick to work during her illness. She plans to use a portion of her winnings to buy gifts for her co-workers. “If I didn't have everybody here, I would have been a psychological mess.”



Raising puppies

If you're looking for a project that will provide big benefits to a disabled veteran, you can do no better than to raise a puppy. Yes, a puppy. A small, young dog.

Puppies who end up as service dogs for disabled veterans aren't born that way. They need a solid first year of socializing and basic obedience, and that's where you come in, should you want to take on this worthwhile project.

Take a look at www.guidedog.org/puppy for an explanation of what is expected. If accepted as a puppy raiser, you would receive a very young puppy and spend the next year getting it socialized and used to different environments, with good house manners and basic obedience, and exposed to various situations to give it confidence. If you're not sure you can commit to such a long project, see the link above for other possibilities: short-term fostering to provide socialization opportunities for the puppy, co-raising with another individual or family, and in some states there is a prison puppy program that has inmates raise and train the dogs during the week before handing them over to weekend volunteers who provide experiences outside of the prison walls.

Your next step is to go online to search for groups near you that provide trained dogs to veterans in need. Contact them to ask about becoming a puppy raiser. (For more incentive, see www.vetdogs.org for the list of states where weekend volunteers are needed now.)

If you love dogs, perhaps the hardest part of the whole project will be to give up the dog at the end of its time with you when it goes on to its official training to be a service dog for a specific veteran in need. But you'll console yourself knowing just how valuable your efforts have been in giving a good start to a dog that will be a life-changer for a veteran.
