


Salad Month

May is National Salad Month. As the temperatures begin to rise in anticipation of summer, May is a perfect time to begin introducing more salads into your menu.

Salads can be healthy, hearty, savory, sweet and more. I enjoy garden salads, wedge salads and side salads throughout the year, but I must admit my favorite salads are the "salads that aren't really salads." These are typically lettuce-less salads ranging from main dishes to sides to desserts. Here are some I prepare often:

-Macaroni Salad: Macaroni (or similar pasta) salads with or without meat. My goto meats for this salad are tuna or ham. A bag of frozen (thawed) mixed vegetables makes this a quick and easy recipe. Pasta, meat, veggies, a glob of mayo, and squeeze of mustard, and whatever seasonings in the cabinet catch my eye.

-Broccoli Salad: I love the hint of sweet sugar and the tang of freshly chopped onions. This is easy to prepare with fresh broccoli, finely chopped onions, as much crumbled bacon as

Chunky or smooth, a mustard or mayonnaise base, with or without chopped boiled eggs, skins on or skins off, I'm coming for all your potato salads!

Chicken Salad, Tuna Salad, Egg Salad or Ham Salad: I love a good sandwich salad on hearty bread. Add a warm bowl of soup (usually tomato for me), and I'm happily stuffed.

There are so many different salads out there — you could eat a salad every day in May and barely make a dent in the list of recipes.

I am making it my mission to try at least two new salads this month. I saw a recipe for KFC. Southern Cornbread Salad that looks like it was made especially for me.

The VA in the news

So much is going on right now. With the new administration making many changes on a daily basis across the federal government, some of those changes were sure to affect the Department of Veterans Affairs. Here is one thing that has happened: The VA let go 1,000 employees.

For the most part they were probationary employees (deemed non-mission critical) with less than one year on the job or those in another employment category who had worked for less than two years.

This 1,000 is out of the 43,000 probationary employees they didn't fire because they were mission critical and out of a total of 473,000 employees at the VA. One year ago the VA had planned to reduce their numbers by 10,000 employees in 2025. Then there are the many thousands who took the deferred resignation offer, which will allow them to stay home and still be paid through September. So the 1,000 fewer employees isn't a massive number.

The financial bottom line from this recent move is that \$98 million was saved, money that will be plowed back into services and benefits for veterans, per Secretary Doug Collins

While this move was effective immediately, there is a catch: Management can ask that certain employees not be terminated to ensure that the work can go on, that benefits and services aren't effected.

Rumor has it that some of the employees who were let go had handled the phones at the suicide crisis line. A senator stepped in and asked that two of the employees be reinstated.

While it might be a bit unnerving to see cuts at the VA for the benefits and services we depend on, I say we should just wait it out and not let panic set in. We have a new VA secretary, and for now we should trust him to fight for what's right for us, despite all the loud naysayers who excel at stirring up anxiety. I think it will all be OK.



Which Free Bingo Apps are the Best?

We're frequently asked about which free Bingo apps are worth downloading, so we checked in with the good folks at Lifewire, who explore all things online and tech, to check out what they had to say, because while we all know Bingo is best in the real world, sometimes we can't make it out to play our favorite game.

There are hundreds of Bingo apps to choose from, but luckily Lifewire has narrowed it down to a list of just four favorites. You don't need an internet connection, money, or other players to enjoy these titles. But be sure if you win to still shout "Bingo!" loud and proud from wherever you happen to be playing (unless you're in a library LOL).

Best Overall: AE Bingo

Far more than your average bingo app, AE Bingo features collectibles, achievements, and power-ups to spice up gameplay. Choose between two modes: Classic, where regular rules apply, or Speed Bingo, where you can place virtual bets. Don't make a bad bingo call, or you'll be penalized! Pros: Free download for Android, iOS and Amazon tablets; customizable cards and daubers; two game modes. Cons: The number of special features may be overwhelming for old school Bingo

Best Looking: Absolute Bingo

Absolute Games has given impressive facelifts to several classic games, and Absolute Bingo is no exception. Made for beginners and veterans alike, it was originally released for Windows, but there's also a mobile version for iOS and Android. Pros: Beautiful artwork adds an extra layer of charm to the classic game; play up to eight cards at once. Cons: Some of the power-ups make it too easy to win; must wait four hours to get more coins.

Most Basic: Classic Bingo

For a more traditional experience, here's a nofrills app made for people who just want to play bingo. Compared to other games on this list, Classic Bingo is quite dull to look at, but that's kind of the point. There are no in-app purchases or power-ups, just the fast-paced action you expect to find at your local bingo hall. Pros: Simple and straightforward play; no in-app purchases. Cons: Ads sometimes pop up in the middle of rounds; can only play one card at a time.

Most Relaxing: **Rainbow Bingo Adventure**

This adventure-themed bingo game lets you progress through different lands, collecting tokens and uncovering hidden treasures along the way. Every daub you place earns experience points you can spend to unlock new levels with unique music and graphics. Pros: Graphics and background music are relaxing; play one to four bingo cards. Cons: The in-app purchases are a little excessive; only available on Android.

Casino Cheating Scams of the Year

A recent story on CDCGaming.com covers the vote taken at the end of the annual World Game Protection Conference. The 500 or so attendees, most of them casino surveillance and security professionals, select the top eight cheating scams of the past year. The number-one scam in 2024 was a baccarat ploy that involves a colluding dealer having the cheating player cut the cards, scraping a fingernail across the corners to reveal the index numbers of a sequence to a hidden camera, then leaving the table to review the sequence and returning to bet on the inside knowledge. Other hidden-camera scams ranked number two and counterfeit chips number three. You can read the whole story online at www.cdcgaming.com.

Billions in Wage Theft

A recent study conducted by Rutgers and Northwestern universities has found that \$2.4 billion in wages has been stolen from 40,000 Nevada workers over the past 20 years by employers illegally paying them below the minimum wage. Each worker lost \$3,000 per year (nearly 20% of their correct income), adding up to \$122 million per year. The most susceptible workers to minimumwage theft were found to be women, people of color, non-citizens, individuals with less education, and those aged 18 to 24.

Bally's Offers Benefits

According The New York Post the company vying to open a casino in The Bronx in New York City really wants neighbors to have a vested interest in the proposed gaming facility. Bally's is offering residents the opportunity to buy shares in the casino that would be located adjacent to its golf course at

Trump's firm. That's right-stocks, not just chips. Bally's also is pledging that at least 1% of its gross revenues from the casino will go to community benefits programs in The Bronx—more than \$10 million a year or \$100 million over 10 years—if it is awarded a license. But one of the most attractive features of the community benefits package is that Bronx residents can also invest in the casino, owning, likely, up to 10% of the gaming facility, said Bally's Corp chairman Soo Kim. Customers could be able to invest as little as \$250 and get leverage from the Bally's Foundation; if the casino performs well, they can make many multiples of their money. Kim is using the same economic model at his Chicago casino slated to open in 2026. At least 11 bidders are jockeying to win at least three coveted casino licenses that will be awarded by the state Gaming Commission at the end of this year.

Ferry Point, formerly operated by President

Potential Casino in North Texas?

Irving, TX could build a resort with room for a casino, if the state legalizes gambling. The proposed mixed-use development would sit on 1,001 acres in Irving, which includes the former Texas Stadium site, home to the Dallas Cowboys from 1971 to 2008. It would be a mix of corporate, retail and residential buildings along with a "destination resort" that would include room for casino gaming-a proposal that has prompted vocal opposition from residents. The development would also include convention center, a 1,750-room hotel and a movie theater. There is also the potential for the Dallas Mavericks to move into the new 15,000-seat stadium, as the majority owners of the basketball franchise also own the Las Vegas Sands. At press time, the planning and zoning commission was set to vote on whether to approve the mixed-use development. The state still has to change the gambling laws if approved.



Lucky Lotto News

Massive Mega Millions Winner

The winner of the \$1.2-billion lottery jackpot — a player who beat the odds by matching all six numbers drawn in the December $202\overline{4}$ Mega Millions-was named on Monday, March 17, 2025. The winner, identified as Rosemary Casarotti by California lottery officials, who are required under state law to publicly identify the winners, purchased the winning ticket at Sunshine Food and Gas at 3505 Rhonda Road in Cottonwood on Dec. 27, officials said. The lottery offered no biographical details about Casarotti, who opted not to be present during the announcement. She chose to take the lump sum of her winnings, which will amount to more than \$570 million. The jackpot was California's largest Mega Millions prize in ticket. history, according to the lottery. The odds of drawing all five of the winning numbers and the Mega number were at 1 out of 302.5 million. Prior to the December win, the jackpot had been won only three times in 2024, the fewest wins in any single year since the game began in 2002. At the time, the jackpot had been growing since Sept. 10, when a player won an \$810-million prize from a ticket sold at a gas station in Texas. The prior \$6-billion-plus jackpots have all been won in different states - South Carolina in 2018, Michigan in 2021, Illinois in 2022, Maine and Florida in 2023 and New Jersey in March, according to the lottery. The game's highest jackpot of any state at \$1.6 billion was won in Florida in 2023.

Luckiest Lotto Player Ever?

With seven state-sponsored lottery wins to his name, the odds are that Richard Lustig may hold the title of Luckiest Lottery Player for a long time. Lustig passed away in 2018 at age 67, after penning a book, Learn How

to Increase Your Chances of Winning the *Lottery*. Lustig was an entertainment booking agent from Orlando, Florida who gained fame for his string of lottery wins from 1993 to 2010. On his site, a bio about Lustig states he was a former professional drummer who spent many years touring the country before he became an agent, and that he loved his work but was always anxious to hit the road on his Harley. "Obviously it's changed my life big time," Lustig told *Time* in January 2016, adding "I've been rich and I've been poor, and I like rich a whole lot better. We've lived in big, fancy houses. I drive a Jaguar. We've gone on cruises. I can't complain." Here are his wins, and tips for winning. * January 1993: \$10,000 from a scratch-off

* August 1997: \$13,696.03 from a Florida Lottery Fantasy 5 ticket.

* In June 2000: Wheel of Fortune holiday trip to Los Angeles valued at \$3,594.66 on a scratch-off ticket second chance drawing. * October 2001: Elvis Presley holiday trip to Memphis, Tennessee valued at \$4,966 on another scratch-off ticket's 2nd chance drawing.

* January 2002: \$842,152.91 from Mega Money, now known as Mega Millions. * November 2008: \$73,658.06 from a

* August 2010: \$98,992.92 from a Fantasy 5 ticket.

To serve, arrange chicken, vegetables and dumplings in wide, shallow bowls. Ladle gravy over each serving. Then let your child sprinkle parsley on top for a fresh garnish.

Cook's Note: If you prefer to serve boneless chicken, before dropping the dough in spoonfuls, remove the chicken pieces from the cooking pot. Take the chicken off the bones, shred, then return the meat to the pot.





Reverse Mortgage: a Good Idea?

Dear Savvy Senior,

mortgages? When my husband passed away last year my income dropped almost in half, and I've been struggling to keep up with my monthly living expenses. -Senior Homeowner

Dear Senior,

For retirees who own their home and want to stay living there, but could use some extra cash, a reverse mortgage is a viable financial tool, but there's a lot to know and consider to be sure it's a good option for you. Let's start with the basics.

A reverse mortgage is a unique type of loan that allows older homeowners to borrow money against the equity in their house (or condo) that doesn't have to be repaid until the homeowner dies, sells the house or moves out for at least 12 months. At that point, you or your heirs will have to pay back the loan plus accrued interest and fees (usually by selling the home), but you will never owe more than the value of your home.

It's also important to understand that with a reverse mortgage, you, not the bank, own the house, so you're still required to pay your property taxes, homeowners' insurance and upkeep. Not paying them can result in foreclosure

To be eligible, you must be 62 years of age or older, have at least 50 percent equity in your home, and currently be living there.

You will also need to undergo a financial assessment to determine whether you can afford to continue paying your property taxes and insurance. Depending on your financial situation, you may be required to put part of your loan into an escrow account to pay future bills. If the financial assessment finds that you cannot pay your insurance and taxes and have enough cash left to live on, you'll be denied.

LOAN DETAILS

More than 90 percent of all reverse mortgages offered are Home Equity Conversion Mortgages (HECM), which are FHA insured and offered through private

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mortgage lenders and banks. HECM's have home value limits that vary by county but cannot exceed \$1,209,750 in 2025. How much you can actually get through a

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reverse mortgage depends on your age (the older you are the more you can get), your home's value and the prevailing interest rates. Generally, most people can borrow somewhere between 40 and 60 percent of the home's value. To estimate how much What can you tell me about reverse you can borrow, use the reverse mortgage calculator at ReverseMortgage.org.

To receive your money, you can opt for a lump sum, a line of credit, regular monthly checks or a combination of these.

But be aware the reverse mortgages aren't cheap. You'll have to pay an origination fee, which is the greater of \$2,500 or 2 percent of the first \$200,000 of your home's value plus 1 percent of the amount over \$200,000. HECM origination fees are capped at \$6,000. You'll also be charged an initial mortgage insurance premium, which is 2 percent of the loan amount, along with closing costs that will likely run several thousand dollars. Any amount you borrow, including these fees and insurance, accrues interest, which

means your debt grows over time. To learn more, see the National Council on Aging's online booklet "Use Your Home to Stay at Home."

Also be aware that because reverse mortgages are complex loans, all borrowers are required to get counseling through a HUD approved independent counseling agency before taking one out. Most agencies charge between \$125 and \$200. To locate one near you, visit HUD.gov, or call 800-569-4287. **OTHER OPTIONS**

If a reverse mortgage doesn't suit you, you could also tap your home equity by getting a regular home equity loan or line of credit. This type of borrowing requires you to make payments, and lenders can freeze or lower limits on lines of credit, but the borrowing costs are much lower. Or you could also sell your home and move somewhere cheaper.



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Rich in Flavor, Light on the Wallet: Meet

Are you ready for a culinary journey to the Middle East? Buckle up, buttercup, and bring vour taste buds, because today, we're making Mujadara (moo-zha-DAH-rah), a simple, satisfying dish of lentils, rice and caramelized onions that prove frugal can also be fabulous. Mujadara has been enjoyed across Lebanon, Jordan and Syria for centuries, and for good reason. It's hearty, flavorful and budget-friendly. Traditionally known as a "poor man's meal," don't let the name fool you — as with most "peasant food," this dish is so comforting and delicious, it'll make you feel like royalty. Think of it as the Middle Eastern equivalent of mac and cheese: cozy, familiar and always a hit.

At its core, Mujadara is a lesson in culinary alchemy. A handful of pantry staples - lentils. rice, onions and spices - transform into something far greater than the sum of their parts. The secret? Those deeply caramelized onions. They add a richness that takes this humble dish to the next level.

For this version, I've opted for brown rice over white to boost the nutritional value, though white basmati works too. Just check the recipe notes for adjustments. The lentils provide protein, the rice offers fiber, and the onions bring an irresistible depth of flavor and sweetness that ties it all together.

Mujadara is best served with a dollop of yogurt or a drizzle of tahini sauce, a scattering of fresh herbs and, if you like a bit of heat, a spoonful of your favorite spicy sauce. You can enjoy it hot, warm or at room temperature, making it an excellent make-ahead meal.

Mujadara (Lentils and Rice with **Caramelized Onions**) 4 generous servings Total Time: 45 minutes

4 cloves garlic, chopped

2 bay leaves

1 tablespoon ground cumin

2 teaspoons Kosher salt, divided

1/2 teaspoon black pepper 5 cups water

1 cup brown basmati rice, rinsed and drained

1 cup brown or green lentils, rinsed and drained

1/3 cup extra-virgin olive oil

2 large yellow onions, thinly sliced

1/2 cup sliced green onions, divided

1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro or parsley, divided

Plain yogurt, for serving (or tahini sauce for a vegan option)

In a large saucepan, combine garlic, bay leaves, cumin, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt and black pepper with water. Bring to boiling over medium-high heat.

Stir in the rice, reduce heat to medium-low, cover and simmer for 10 minutes.

After 10 minutes, add lentils and stir. Return to a simmer, cover and cook until liquid is absorbed and grains are tender (about 20-23 minutes).

Meanwhile, heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add onions and cook, stirring occasionally, until deeply caramelized and crisp at the edges (about 20-30 minutes). Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate and sprinkle with remaining salt.

When the lentils and rice are done, drain excess water if needed, remove bay leaves and mash garlic cloves against the pot's side. Add 3/4 of the green onions and cilantro, fluff with a fork and adjust seasoning.

Transfer to a serving dish, top with caramelized onions and garnish with remaining green onions and herbs. Serve with yogurt or tahini sauce.

Sometimes we just don't want to face the truth, so we ignore it as long as we can. But eventually it becomes clear: We need to downsize.

Just the word can be painful as we contemplate moving to a smaller place and likely needing to get rid of many of our belongings. And then there are all the details - what to keep, how to pack, lifting those heavy boxes.

The good news is that we don't have to do it alone. The National Association of Senior & Specialty Move Managers (www.nasmm. org) can steer you toward move managers in your area, people who are trained in all aspects of moving seniors. In the Find A Move Manager section of their website, put in your ZIP code to find people in your area.

In my town I found three companies. All advertise stress-free moves and help with organizing, downsizing and relocating. It seems they can do it all - starting with the decluttering that will be necessary for any move to a smaller place. They organize which belongings go to which family members, arrange for the sale of valuables or donations to charity and even take care of trash disposal. And that's just the first step in the process.


What I like best is that they'll do the packing. Then on moving day, they'll be there supervising the movers, dealing with the utility companies to get the power turned on in the new place and, surprise, they'll even unpack on the other end and haul away the empty boxes.



A friend decided that she wanted to learn how to play blackjack. I sat down with her and refer to it if she was not sure how to play and went over the basics of how the game any hand. is played, and then showed her the basic playing strategy. I told her she would have to learn the playing strategy and I gave her a software program to use at home to practice the strategy.

Three-Card Soft Hand

She knew the strategy for soft hands (hands

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that contain an Ace, counted as 11). The hand that stumped her was the following. She was dealt an Ace-3 and the dealer showed a 3. She knew the correct strategy for this hand was to hit and not double down (you double down only if the dealer shows a 5 or 6). She hit and drew a 4 and now she had a soft 18. The basic strategy for soft 18 against a dealer's 3 is to double down. However, since option was no longer available to her. She panicked for a moment, not knowing how to play her Ace-3-4. (She doesn't remember whether she stood or took a hit.) I told her that when you have a soft hand containing option is no longer available then you should follow this rule:

-Hit if you have soft 13 through soft 17. Stand if you have soft 18 and the dealer shows a 2-8 upcard, and hit if the dealer's upcard is 9, 10, or Ace. The correct play to the Ace-3-4 against the 3 was to stand. I told her to bring it with her when she played

During her visit to the casino, she decided to switch from a six-deck game to a singledeck game. (She knew to play only singledeck games if a blackjack is paid 3-2 and The next time we met, she told me she was to avoid any single-deck game that paid that stumped her was 4-4 against a dealer her mind was double down 8 against a 6, A week later, she called me and when but somewhere she also remembered that she didn't know whether to split or double down. I told her the basic strategy for a pair of 4s against a 6 is to split. If you had an 8 consisting of 5-3 and 6-2, then you would double down against the 6. (With any pairs, follow the pair splitting strategy first.)

11 against an Ace She told me that she was dealt a 7-4 and the dealer showed an Ace and she forgot

whether to double down or just hit. I told her that the reason she was probably confused is that she was playing a multiple-deck game and then switched to a single-deck game. When she was playing a six-deck game (rules were s17 and double-after-split), you should hit against the Ace. However, in the single-deck game (h17 and no double-aftersplit), the correct strategy is to double down she already drew a card, the double down an 11 against an Ace. I told her it's best to focus on playing only one game per casino visit so she wouldn't be confused between the slightly different playing strategies.

After my friend got a few playing sessions under her belt, she wanted to learn card three or more cards and the double down counting. I decided to teach her Speed Count (since math is not her strong point). In just one practice session, she mastered it and found it easy to keep the Speed Count when she played blackjack.

The last time we spoke, she told me she loves the game of blackjack, and so far, she is ahead and having a ball. 





Now That's a Bad Beat! By Chad Holloway

I recently witnessed a hand take place that exemplified the short-term luck factors in any given hand of poker. As the old saying goes, in the short term, poker is 90% luck and 10% skill, but in the long term it becomes 10% luck and 90% skill. Sometimes you can make the right play and get punished.

The hand took place in the 2024 World Series of Poker (WSOP) Paradise Event #6: \$5,000 Deepstack No-Limit Hold'em, a tournament that attracted 363 entries and awarded a \$1,815,000 prize pool.

It happened with just three players remaining on Day 3. It was Level 30 (100,000/200,000/200,000) when chip leader Blaz Zerjav, who had about 6.5 million, raised to 400,000 from the button and Rokas Asipauskas, who began the hand 6.2 million, defended his big blind to see a flop of 2cQsKd.

Asipauskas checked and then called a bet of 300,000, which brought about the 8s on the turn. Zerjav kept the pressure on by betting 1.2 million and Asipauskas used a time extension before calling.

When the Jd completed the board on the river, Asipauskas checked for a third time and Zerjav moved all in. Asipauskas snap-called off his remaining 4.3 million and confidently tabled the KcQh for flopped top two pair.

Unfortunately for Asipauskas, and much to his surprise, it was no good as Zerjav revealed the 10d9d for a rivered gutshot straight.

"Wow," was all Asipauskas could muster as the dealer verified the stacks.



Blueberry Apple Butter BLUEBERRY-APPLE BUTTER JAM

Dear Readers,

Some years ago, I shared my husband's crockpot/canning recipe for apple butter. The 4-5 lb. fresh or frozen blueberries following letter came in follow up to that column, and I can't wait to try it—it sounds absolutely delicious! Much gratitude and good wishes to Joy for sharing this recipe!

P.S. Donald's original canning process is noted below Joy's recipe. -Annie

Dear Annie,

I was delighted to see the apple butter crockpot recipe from your husband in the Bingo Bugle. Another crockpot butter-jam I make every year is blueberry-apple butter. One extra nice thing about using sweet apples is that one does not have to use sugar, therefore you have a naturally sweet butter jam that is very tasty and healthy to boot. Apples and blueberries are two of our most nutritionally beneficial fruits. And another bonus? Blueberry-apple butter jam is one of the most expensive on store shelves when it is all-natural with no sugar preservatives. Here's the recipe.

One might be quick to judge the slow play by Asipauskas, that by taking a passive line he allowed Zerjav to suckout. Had he raised on either the flop or turn, maybe he'd take it down then and there. While that's quite possible, it's also being results oriented.

Asipauskas didn't just want to win the pot, he wanted to extract maximum value, and he was on pace to do that. He just called preflop with a relatively strong hand, and then when he flopped top two pair, he let Zerjav do the work. By just check-calling, he was disguising the strength of his hand and giving Zerjav plenty of rope to hang himself.

Indeed, Zerjav semi-bluffed – meaning he did have a weak draw, in this case a mere gutshot straight draw - on both the flop and turn, and there's a good chance he would've bluffed a third time had the river bricked. In that instance, he'd have to either wave the white flag of fire a third barrel. If he went with the latter, then Asipauskas would've won a huge pot

Asipauskas actually played the hand well, he just got unlucky.

Asipauskas ended up exiting in third place for \$174,050, while Zerjav wound up losing out to China's Lei Yu in heads-up play. Even so, Zerjav received a \$225,720 consolation prize for his strong performance.

- 4-6 sweet apples, peeled and cored ³/₄ c. water
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. sea salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lemon or lime, juiced

Using a 5-quart crockpot, cook the apples and water on high for about 2 hours until they are soft and able to blend well with a hand mixer or potato smasher. Then add the blueberries, sea salt and lemon or lime juice. Cook for 8 hours (preferably overnight). Once again, blend the entire batch in the crockpot with mixer or potato smasher. This makes about 5 to 7 pints using the same canning process that Donald used

Donald's Canning Process: Pour the apple butter into sterilized mason jars. Leave 1/4 inch of head space. Seal with two-piece Mason jar caps that have been sterilized. Process for 10 minutes in a boiling-water canner. This makes about 5 to 7 pints of apple butter. Do not open the jars until ready to use. Refrigerate apple butter after opening the jar.
