Casino Q&A

Q. Everyone always talks about Random Number Generators (RNGs) in slot machines. Can you tell me what they are and why they matter?

A. Slot games are all about luck, but what actually determines the outcome of each spin? The secret lies in a technology called Random Number Generator (RNG). Whether you're playing online or land-based slot machines, RNG ensures that every spin is fair, unpredictable, and unbiased.

What an RNG is in Slot Games

A Random Number Generator (RNG) is a software algorithm that continuously generates random numbers, even when the slot machine is not being played. These numbers determine the symbols that appear on the reels when you hit the spin button. Modern slot machines and online slots use Pseudo-Random Number Generators (PRNGs), which rely on complex mathematical formulas to generate results that appear completely random. Though PRNGs are not truly random (since they follow an algorithm), they are so sophisticated that the results are impossible to predict.

How RNGs Work in Slot Machines

Every time you press the spin button, the RNG generates a random number. Each number generated corresponds to a specific arrangement of symbols on the reels. Here's how the process works:

- 1. RNG Generates a Number – The system continuously produces random numbers, often thousands of times per second.
- 2. Mapping Numbers to Symbols – Each number corresponds to a specific reel position. The slot's software then translates this into symbols on the screen.

3. Spin Outcome is Determined – When you hit spin, the RNG selects the most recent number and displays the corresponding symbol combination.

4. Fair and Unpredictable Results – Because numbers are continuously generated, every spin is independent, meaning previous results have no effect on future outcomes. This ensures that every player has an equal chance of winning and that the game is not rigged.

Why RNG is Important in Slot Games

RNG serves as the core technology that powers every slot game. Here's why it matters: Ensures Fairness – RNG prevents patterns or predictable outcomes, ensuring that every spin is completely independent. Regulated by Authorities – Reputable casinos and gaming platforms have their RNGs tested by independent agencies like eCOGRA, iTech Labs, and Gaming Labs International (GLI) to ensure fairness. Prevents Manipulation – Since RNG operates continuously and unpredictably, neither players nor casino operators can manipulate the results.

Common Myths About RNG in Slot Games

Many players have misconceptions about how slot machines work. Let's bust some common myths:

Myth: The slot machine is expected to hit a win soon.

Truth: Since every spin is random, past losses do not increase your chances of winning the next spin.

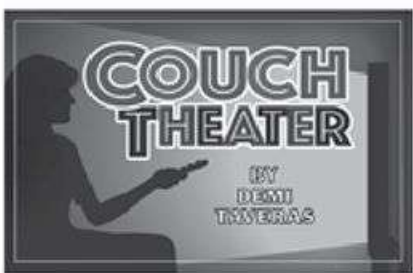
Myth: Casinos can change the RNG at any time.

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Mmm Mmm Molasses Pie

Dear Annie, I need help. My husband went on a business trip to Tennessee and was served a molasses pie. He wants me to make it for him now that he is home. Please help me. I have no idea how to make this pie. Carol Ann from Seattle, Washington

Dear Carol Ann,

Here's a recipe for a Molasses Pie that I like to make—and it's easy! Enjoy! —Annie

Molasses Pie

- 2 tbsp. flour (heaping)
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1 cup molasses
- 4 eggs (separated)
- 1/8 of a pound butter, softened
- 2 unbaked pie shells
- dash of nutmeg, if desired

Mix flour, sugar and nutmeg (if used). Dissolve baking soda in buttermilk and add to flour mixture. Beat the egg yolks. Stir in molasses, beaten egg yolks and softened butter. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Pour in unbaked pie shells and put on bottom shelf of oven. Bake for 30 minutes. Whip the egg whites into a meringue until stiff. Put on top of pie and brown. Makes two pies.



DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a healthy male, age 65. I get 7-8 hours of sleep most nights, but during the night, I typically wake up three to four times with a very full bladder. So, I use the bathroom, then return to bed.

My question is, where do my kidneys get all the water to make so much urine? I'm not drinking during the night, and I don't drink anything before I go to sleep. Where is it coming from? This does not happen during my waking hours. — B.F.

ANSWER: When you drink or even eat food with a high water content, this fluid will be absorbed into your blood, but it takes time. Once it's in your blood, it will then be filtered by your kidneys to make urine, but this, too, takes time.

In general, I tell my patients to stop drinking 4 hours or more before bedtime. People who have kidneys that aren't at 100% function may need an even longer time so that they can urinate all the fluid out.

There are other considerations. Many men and women over 60 develop swollen legs during the day due to leaky blood vessels and valves in the veins. Taking in excess salt worsens this problem. The fluid will go back into the blood overnight, and it can easily be enough fluid to fill the bladder. Compression stockings can reduce the amount of fluid in the legs.

Finally, the body has a system for reducing urine output at night (the anti-diuretic hormone is secreted at night to prevent you from having to get up), and in some people, this system fails. The hormone can be given nasally in these cases, but since it can affect blood sodium levels, it needs to be used very judiciously.

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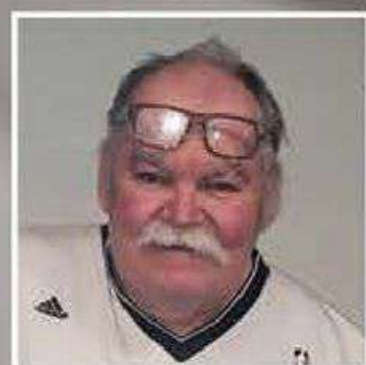

Bake a Dramatic Puff Pancake for Breakfast

When relatives come to your home during these last few months of the year, make weekend breakfasts extra special when you put this delicious puff pancake on your menu! Also called a Dutch baby, this version of the recipe is simple to prepare with kids and dramatic to serve when it's piping hot and coming right out of the oven. Believe me, mouths will be watering when it arrives at the table. Take a bow, then serve with fresh fruit or your other favorite toppings:

DRAMATIC PUFF PANCAKE Serves 4

- 4 eggs
- 1 cup skim or whole milk
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 tablespoon powdered sugar and a squeeze of fresh lemon (toppings)

Preheat oven to 425 F. Let one of your kids count and crack the eggs into a mixing bowl. Inspect it to be sure that there are no remaining shells. Beat eggs with a beater until they're light and pale. Another child may measure and gradually beat in the milk, flour, sugar and salt.



Meanwhile, place butter in a 10- or 12-inch cast-iron or ovenproof skillet, or a 9-by-13-inch oven-safe glass baking dish. An adult should place it in the oven until it is hot and the butter sizzles.

Remove from oven and pour batter into the hot butter. Return to oven and bake for 20-25 minutes, or until puffy and golden-brown on the edges. (Keep oven door closed until done.)

Squeeze lemon juice on top, dust with powdered sugar, and serve tableside immediately. Serve with fresh fruit, such as berries, grapes and kiwi slices.

Alternate Blender Method: Put eggs in a blender and whirl for 1 minute. With the motor running, add milk, then slowly add in flour, sugar and salt. Whirl for an additional 30 seconds. Proceed with recipe starting by placing butter in the oven.

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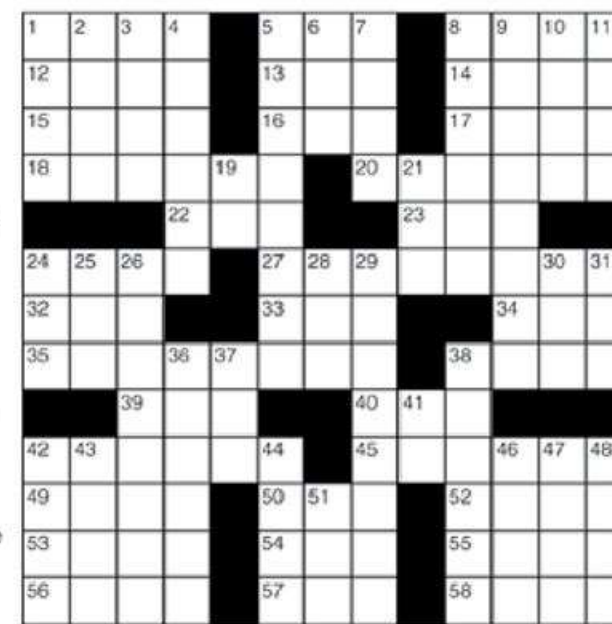

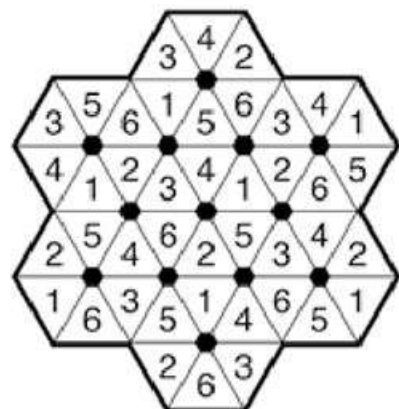

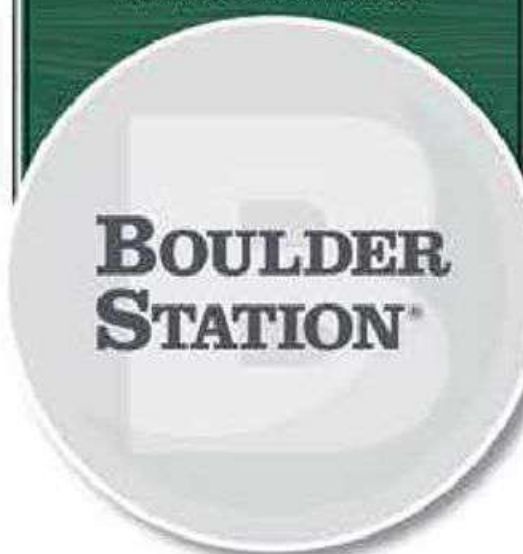

When you finish your jar, add a fresh round of cucumbers to the brine for quick refrigerator pickles. Don't stop there — zucchini, carrots, radishes, onions, green beans — they all play nicely. Let them sit a few days; the longer, the more pickled. You'll marvel at how simple it is to extend the life (and pleasure) of your pickles.

DIY Condiments That Shine
— Dill Pickle Vinaigrette: Blend 3/4 cup pickle juice with 1/4 cup olive oil and a tablespoon of grainy mustard. Your salad just went from "meh" to memorable.

— The Sauce That's Amazing on Everything: Two parts sour cream, one part pickle juice, salt and pepper to taste. Dress salads, drizzle over vegetables or serve alongside meat, poultry or fish. Your condiment game just leveled up.

Add Zing to Everyday Dishes
A spoonful of brine can elevate tuna, egg or chicken salad. Substitute it for vinegar in recipes, add it to water when boiling pasta for a salad or toss into potatoes for a tangy kick. Use it to deglaze pans after sauteing chicken, pork or beef — the flavor will make you wonder why you never thought of this before.

Pickle juice is naturally acidic, making it a perfect meat tenderizer. Try this: 1/4 cup brown sugar plus 1 cup pickle juice makes a simple marinade for two pounds of pork or chicken. Let it sit at least two hours, or overnight if you're planning ahead. Juicy, flavorful, no fuss.

MUSHROOMS IN PICKLE BRINE BUTTER
Yield: 4-6 servings
Total Time: 40 minutes

6 tablespoons butter, divided
6 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, divided
1 sweet onion, thinly sliced (1 1/2 cups)
2 1/2-3 pounds mushrooms, thickly sliced or quartered
3/4 cup strained dill pickle brine

Heat 2 tablespoons of butter and 2 tablespoons of olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat.

We're going to saute in batches. When you first add the mushrooms to the skillet, they absorb all the flavorful butter like little sponges. This ensures every mushroom gets some buttery, briny goodness.

Divide onions and mushrooms into thirds. Saute one-third of the onions until soft (3 minutes). Add a third of the mushrooms and cook until tender and golden (5-7 minutes).

When golden and delicious, add one-third (1/4 cup) pickle brine and stir until the brine is absorbed, about 1 minute. Repeat with remaining ingredients.

Resist eating the mushrooms as you cook them while no one is watching. Sharing is expected, apparently.

These mushrooms are earthy, briny and irresistible — pickle juice isn't just a liquid, it's culinary magic.

But wait! There's more!
— A spoonful in your next Bloody Mary? Legendary.

As briny chaser with tequila? Adventurous and delicious.

The moral: Never leave a drop behind. That jar in your fridge? It's a treasure chest. Race you to the back of the fridge!

Q: I have three to four old iron standing ashtrays which I have been using as plant stands. Are they worth anything?

A: Using old standing ashtrays as plant stands is a fantastic way to repurpose antiques! Iron standing ashtrays can sell for anywhere from about \$50 to \$300. The value of yours depends on their condition, age and maker. Art deco designs of the 1920s - 1930s, when standing ashtrays were at their most popular, tend to sell for higher prices. If you can identify a maker, the value will be higher; especially if they were made by any of the famous ironsmiths active in the art deco period.

TIP: Glass signatures, including Steuben, Quezal and Tiffany, are being faked. Do not trust a signature. Be sure the glass is the proper shape to have been made by the original factory or artist. Fake marks are written with a diamond-tipped drill or are acid-stamped. All look real.

Q. I know charity Bingo halls across the U.S. have varying prize payout limits, but there are other kinds of bingo halls, and I'd like to know if there have been big money winners at any of those places.

A. There have indeed been some big Bingo winners across the U.S. Here is a sampling. **Foxwoods' Firecracker Bingo - \$1M** One of the first bona fide million-dollar bingo wins in the U.S. took place at the Foxwoods Resort Casino in Connecticut. To celebrate 25 years of bingo operations, Foxwoods hosted a high-stakes "Firecracker Bingo" event on July 2, 2011, and it paid off big. Jennifer McKenzie, from Niantic, Connecticut, hit the jackpot and took home \$1 million in cash. This was a landmark moment, as it proved American bingo halls could produce seven-figure winners. **Birthday Millionaire at Lone Butte** In 2018, an Arizona man got an unforgettable birthday present courtesy of bingo. While playing the Bingo Millions game at Gila River's Lone Butte Casino (in the Phoenix area), this unnamed 34-year-old hit the top prize of \$1 million on his birthday. The Bingo Millions game is billed as "the world's richest regular session bingo game," and it lived up to its name that night. The birthday winner's life-changing jackpot underscores how newer bingo innovations (like nationwide linked progressives) have made million-dollar payouts a reality in American bingo halls. Not a bad way to celebrate turning another year older. **'Lucky Tara' Strikes it Rich - \$250,000** Sometimes you don't need a million to make bingo history. In 2018, a player known as Tara (a Pennsylvania resident visiting Nev

York) won \$250,000 at the Seneca Gaming & Entertainment bingo hall in Salamanca, New York. This quarter-million jackpot came during the Seneca casino's 36th anniversary Million Dollar Bingo Special. Tara managed to get a coverall in 48 calls, landing the biggest bingo payout ever recorded in Western New York. She was just one ball short of the \$1 million grand prize. **Record Cash Ball at Santa Fe Station - \$199,578** Las Vegas makes the list with a record-setting bingo Cash Ball jackpot. In May 2025, local player Clementine K. hit a \$199,578 jackpot during the 3 p.m. bingo session at Santa Fe Station casino. This win was the largest bingo cash-ball jackpot in Station Casinos' history, according to the company. The Cash Ball is a progressive bonus in Station's bingo halls, and Clementine's nearly \$200,000 prize had been building up for months before her lucky numbers came in. Her win generated plenty of excitement (and some joyful screaming) in the northwest Las Vegas Valley. **Lucky Eagle Jackpot - \$133,639** In August 2014, Dorothy Black of Olympia, Washington, made headlines by winning \$133,639 at the Lucky Eagle Casino & Hotel, the largest bingo prize in that casino's history. The CEO himself presented Dorothy with an oversized check to mark the occasion. She won the jackpot playing a standard session at Lucky Eagle's bingo hall, which shows that sometimes even smaller tribal casinos can produce six-figure winners. For Dorothy, a long-time player, this amount was truly life changing. Her big win is fondly remembered in Washington's bingo community as proof that persistence and a bit of luck can lead to a record-breaking bingo haul.

Now being the sort of man that I am, I didn't want to go out in public like that, so I waited and waited, and sure enough bingo started up again, and the damn thing was still bleeding. The room erupted in cheers and she stood up and claimed the winning tickets. With terror in my heart, I saw her take the prize—an all-expenses paid trip, just me and her, in one cabin no less. I tried to hide, but it was too late. The caller opened the door, and he and Sarah-Mae pulled me out and started parading me all over the stage, bloody mouth and all.

I didn't play Bingo until it was time for the cruise. I made myself sparse by hittin' the river or goin' fishing. When the day finally arrived, I showed up just before the ship was leaving port. Once I got to the room, Sarah-Mae was standing there with a grin on her lips like she just seen the biggest hot fudge sundae of her life. She'd erected a row of suitcases and boxes across the middle of the room.

"That's your side and this here is my side. The bathroom is mine. Up on deck they got an outdoor shower you can use. Don't even THINK we're gonna be sharing a bathroom," she said. Then she leaned across the bed patting the spot next to her like she wanted me to sit down.

Latino Blood Donors Fuel Lifesaving Care

The American Red Cross is shining a spotlight on the lifesaving generosity of Latino and Hispanic blood donors—whose contributions are critical to patient care.

Latinos are uniquely vital to the nation's blood supply: nearly 60% have type O blood—the type most often used in emergencies when seconds count. Last year alone, more than 180,000 Latino donors rolled up a sleeve, a 7% increase over the year before. This momentum continues with approximately 50 blood drives this month hosted in partnership with local Latino organizations across the country.

Few stories capture the impact of blood donation like that of Mikie Guerrero of Santa Ana, California. It took 64 blood transfusions to keep Mikie alive. "I flatlined two times in the hospital. The doctors never said I'd walk again. But thanks to the blood that was there when I needed it, I'm alive, and now I can stand and walk with assistance," he said.

Grateful for the strangers who saved his life, Mikie and his family began hosting Red Cross blood drives in Santa Ana. In just 3 years, they've collected more than 117 units of blood—exceeding their goals by 138%—and inspired dozens of first-time donors.

He is also working to launch a Red Cross Club at his university. "The blood I received gave me a second chance," he said. Without those donors, I wouldn't be here today."

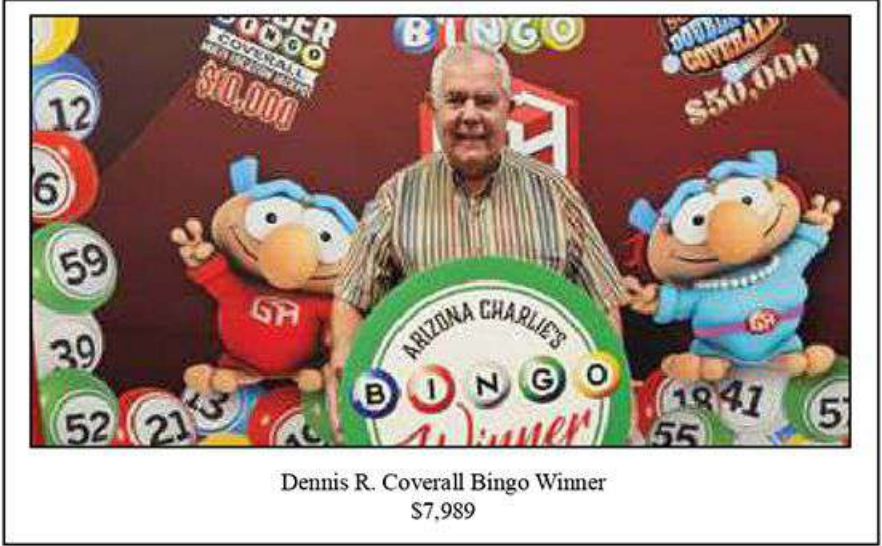
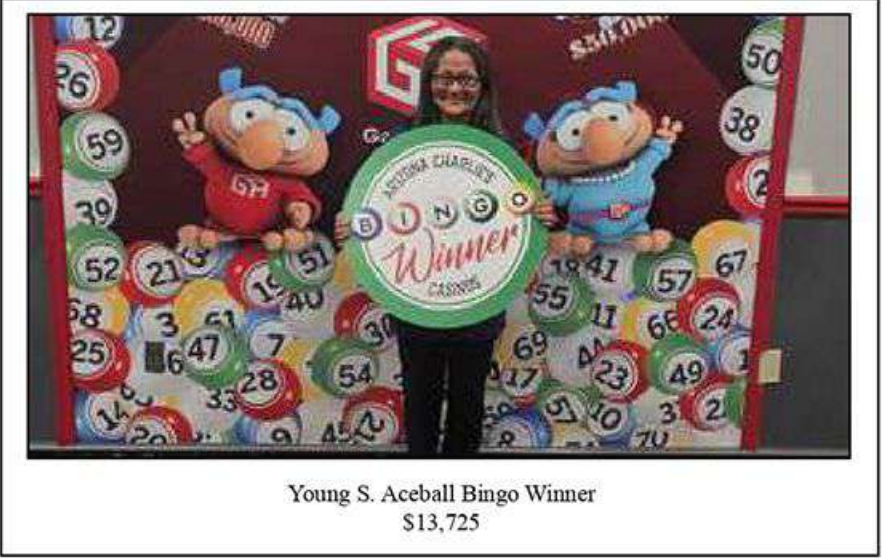

And we do mean little, especially compared to the 181-foot-tall pylon sign that flashed DUNES for nearly 30 years; when it was installed and lit up in November 1964, it was the tallest freestanding sign in the world. The one the Neon Museum has restored is a 10-foot sign that graced the entrance over the driveway up to the porte cochere and has been sitting in the museum's Boneyard for more than 20 years. It was lifted by crane and brought to the workshop, then "the original animation pattern was recreated with historically accurate bulbs and a large crack on the sign's face was repaired." Nice that the Neon Museum has commemorated the iconic hotel-casino that was imploded in October 1993 in con-junction with the opening of Treasure Island.

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Luck in Poker is a Matter of Perspective

I recently had the opportunity to compete in the Major Series of Poker. The Tour, otherwise known as the MSPT, in their Season 16 Iowa Poker State Championship, an \$1,110 buy-in no-limit hold'em poker tournament that attracted 815 entrants and awarded a \$789,494 prize pool.

I ended up finishing the tournament in third place for \$69,610, and along the way I experienced my fair share of good and bad luck, albeit much more of the former than the latter.

In one hand early on Day 2, which saw me bring in the second-biggest stack among the 91 returning players, it was Level 16 (4,000/8,000/8,000) when Kanat Ozturk opened for 20,000 in middle position and I looked down at the AhAs in the cutoff. There were some short stacks among the players behind me, so I opted to slow play by just calling in the hope one of them would move all in. Even if they didn't, my hand would be well-disguised.

Unfortunately, the button and both blinds folded and it was heads-up to a flop of 2c4hAc. Ozturk continued for 15,000 and knowing he wouldn't have raised preflop with

3x5x — which would give him a straight — I knew I had the best hand. I would usually just call, but with two clubs on the flop I didn't want him to draw to a flush cheaply if he had two clubs in the hole.

As such, I clicked it back with a min-raise to 30,000. He called, the Kd appeared on the turn, and Ozturk checked. I bet 35,000 and he didn't take too long to call, which made me feel he either had the flush draw or possibly pocket kings, in which case he just turned a set.

When the 7h completed the board on the river, I no longer had to worry about a flush, and then when Ozturk led out for 85,000, I was pretty sure he actually had pocket kings. I moved all in and Ozturk snap-called off his remaining 150,000 with the KsKc or so only to discover I had slow played aces.

"I thought I was trapping you," he said before exiting the tournament in 70th place.

I was lucky to be on the right end of that cooler, which allowed me to make a deep run in the tournament. I was also lucky to go from the short stack at the final table down to the final three players, ladderding up tens of thousands of dollars in the process. Unfortunately for me, that is where my luck ran out.

In my final hand, the blinds were a hefty 200,000/300,000/300,000 and I moved all in for 4.4 million holding the AcJc in the small blind. Jake Long called from the big with the Ah3h. I was a 3-to-1 favorite, and the 4s7d7h flop seemed safe enough. Unfortunately, me, the 2h turn and Kh river gave Long a runner-runner flush to end my run.

I wish I'd won that hand, which would've given me a good shot to win the whole thing, but I wasn't too disappointed. Sure, I got unlucky in that hand, but I got lucky to even get there in the first place. In poker, it's important to keep such things in perspective.

Expired Products at Home?

When the pandemic began over five years ago and our stores were keeping odd hours and sometimes the shelves were empty, many of us stocked up on food and supplies when we could get them. We chose canned goods and dry boxed foods like pasta, as well as staples like bleach and sanitizing wipes.

Where are those items now? Are some of them still on our shelves at home, maybe tucked in the back and kept for emergencies?

It's time to check those items for expiration dates. Most are likely too old to be used, and many of them can make us sick if we do.

Here are a few hints as you go through your stash:

You'll likely need a magnifying glass as you look at each item because the dates are often very small.

The dilemma with foods is that the experts don't agree. Some claim that an expiration date doesn't really mean the food is no longer good, while some say to pay attention to the dates. Plus, there's a difference between "best by," "sell by" and "use by" dates. Confusing, isn't it? I tend to go by the date that's printed as the cutoff date.

Bleach really does expire and lose potency, and so do the sanitizing wipes, antibacterial hand soap and other cleaning products. Look on the product for a lot number and check the company's website for dates of manufacture or how to decode the batch number.

Even your shampoo has a limit to the time it can sit unused in your bathroom cabinet, and so do toothpaste, deodorant, hand lotion, eye drops — nearly everything you use. Go online to www.checkfresh.com. Click the brand of your item and type in the lot number. It will tell you when it was made.

Now that the dogs are older and our vet has them on glucosamine and vitamins C and E, we put the pills with the spoonful of wet dog food and voila, they eat it! In fact they look forward to their pill time. I don't know if the same method would work with a cat, but I would think so. — Sharon A., via e-mail

DEAR PAWS: After reading your column on getting cats to swallow pills, I wanted to share information about a product I found to be helpful in this regard. It is called Pill Pockets, and it is available at many veterinary hospitals and most major pet stores. The product is essentially a treat with an open side to allow the pill to be put inside and then closed up by pressing in the sides. It comes in pouches of approximately 45 treats and in different flavors like salmon and chicken.

My cat loves the treat, and it allows me to give her a pill without any hassle or stress for either of us. It is also available for dogs. Please check it out. Your readers may find this product helpful. — Elaine B., Belmont, Calif.

I received several helpful tips from readers on giving medications to pets, from hiding the pills in food to ordering custom preparations from pharmacists.
